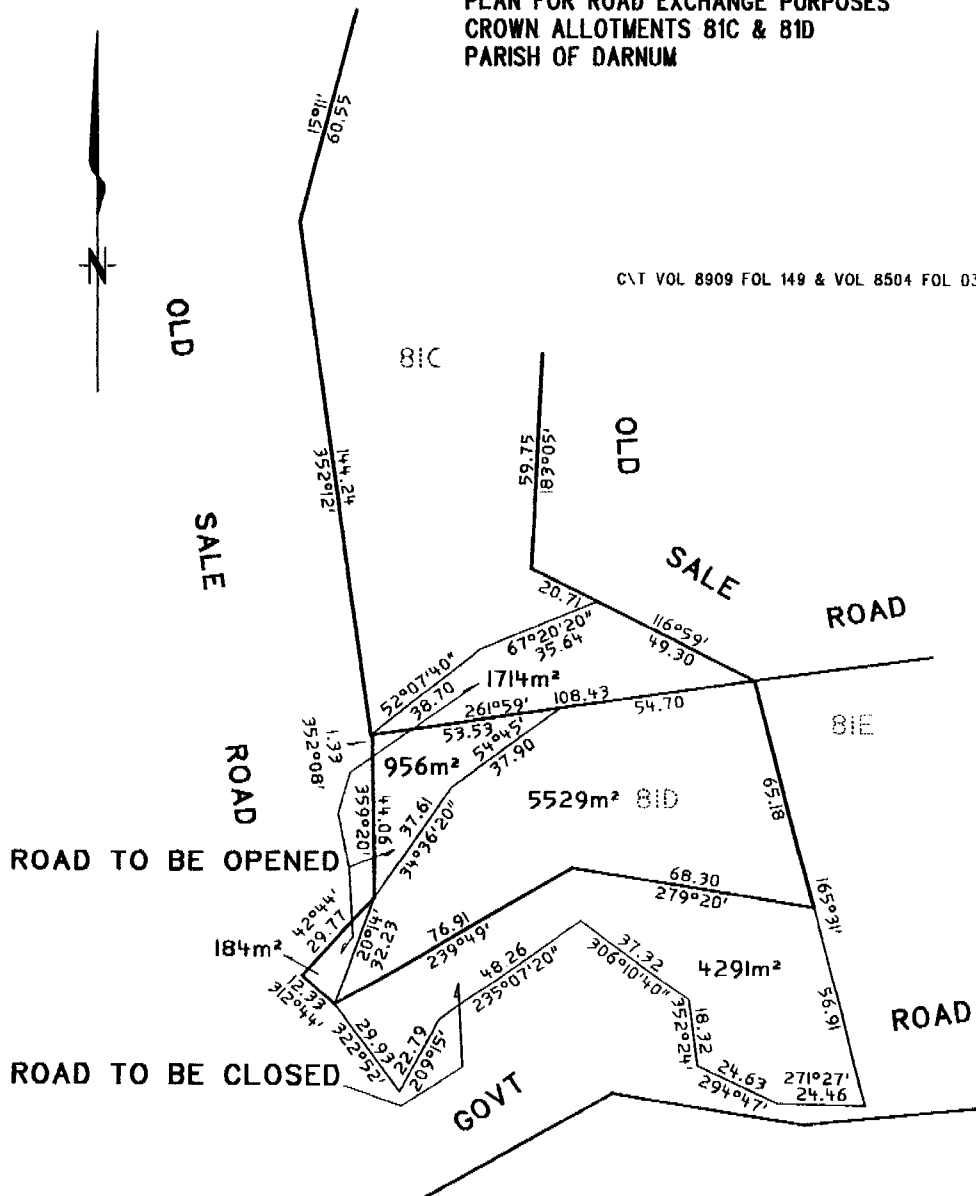

PARISH OF DARNUM**



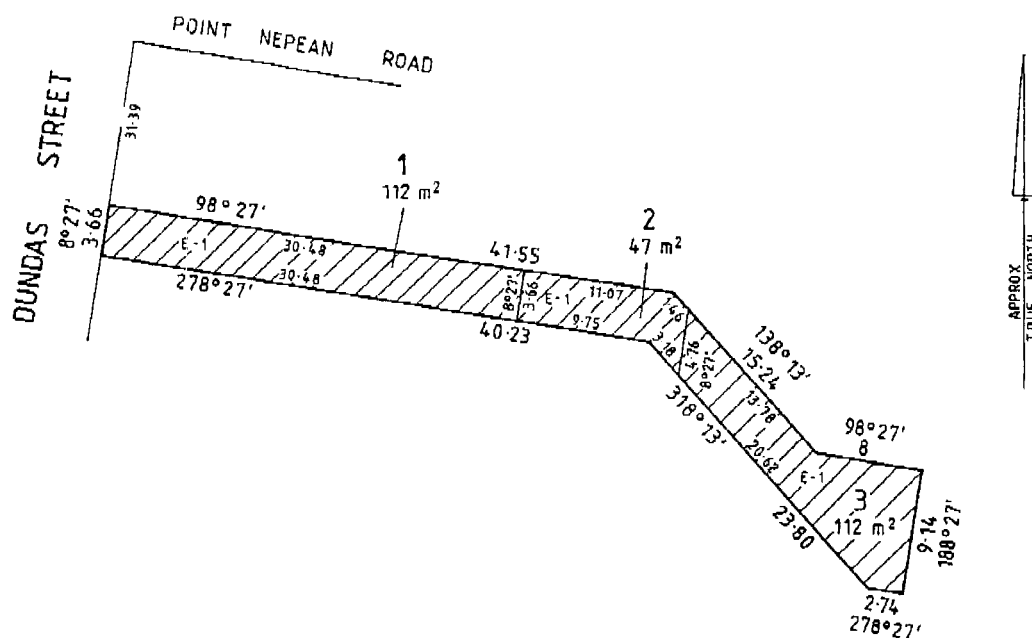

Discontinuance of Lane at rear of
Nos. 2441-2451 Point Nepean Road, Rye

Pursuant to Section 206 and Schedule 10, Clause 3 of the **Local Government Act 1989**, the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council has formed the opinion that the lane at the rear of Nos. 2441-2451 Point Nepean Road, Rye, as shown hatched on the plan below, is not reasonably required as a road for public use. Council has resolved to discontinue the road and to sell the land from the road to the adjoining owners. 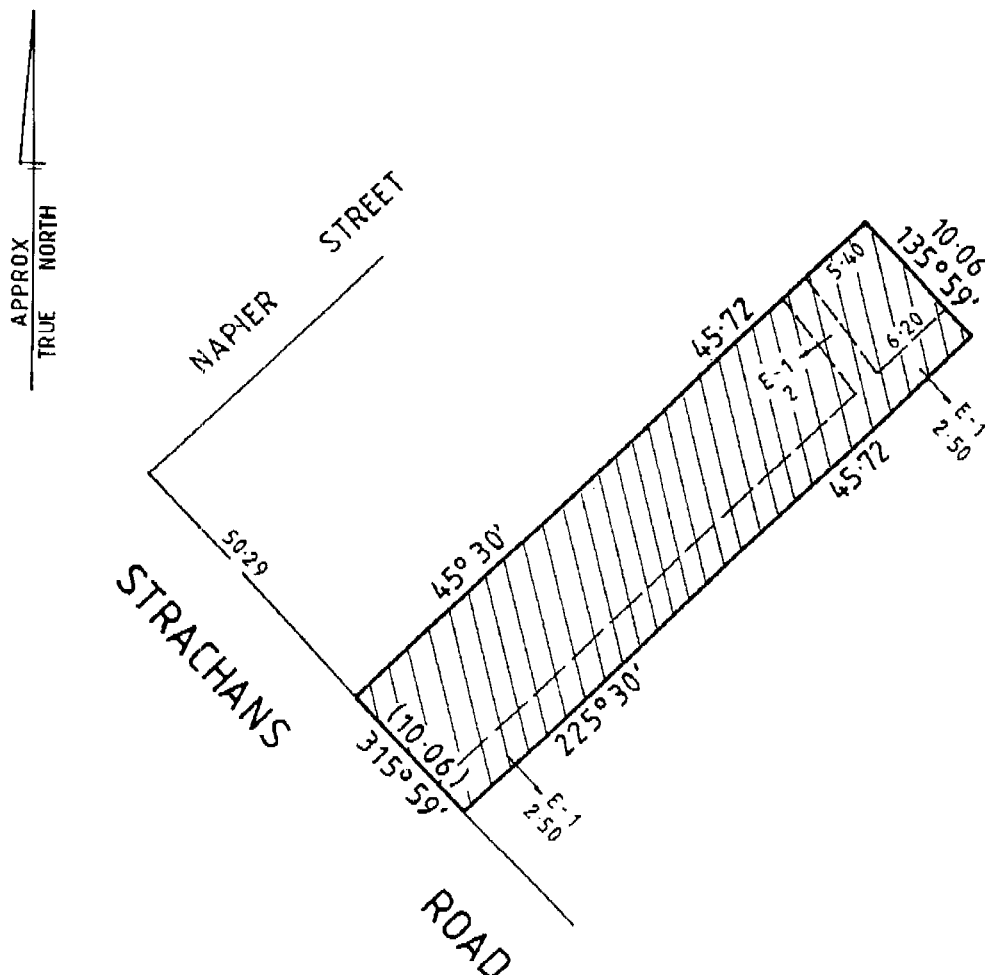

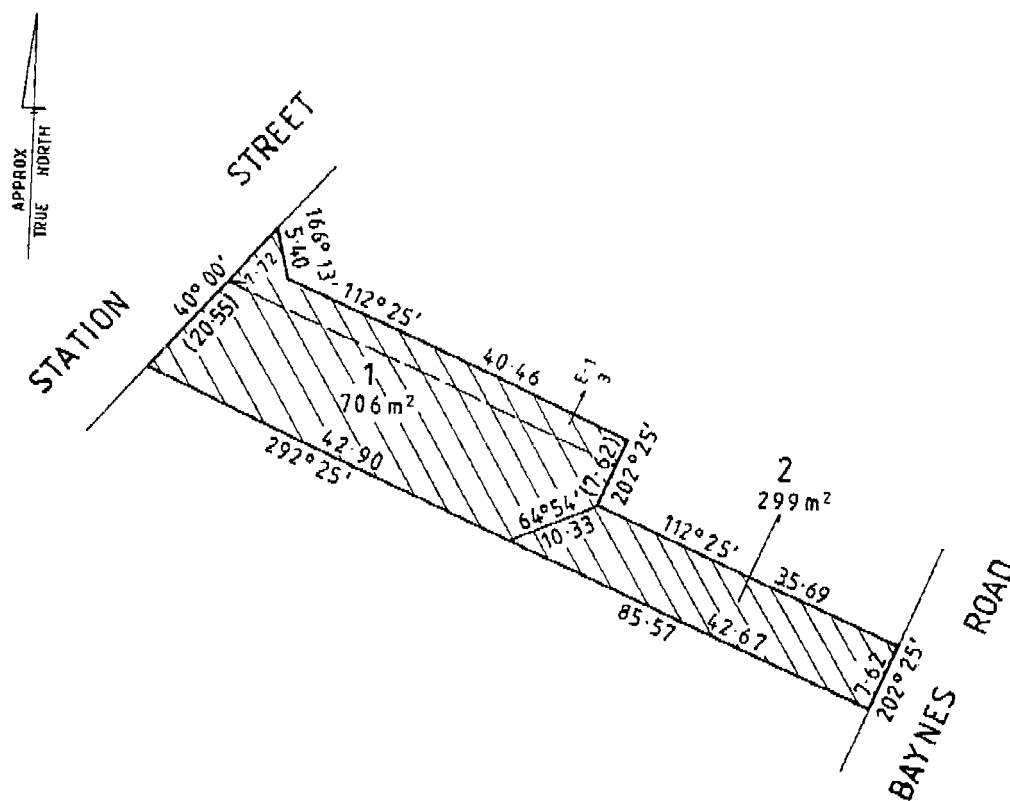

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to Section 83 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 1995** by Footscray Youth Housing Group Inc. (FYHG). The application for exemption is to enable the applicant to advertise and employ a female worker to assist it to carry out its housing programs for young women.

Upon reading the material tendered in support of this application the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the Act to enable the applicant to advertise and employ a female worker to assist it to carry out its housing programs for young women.

In granting this exemption the Tribunal noted:

- Footscray Youth Housing Group Inc. is a community based organisation managing three supported accommodation programs; generalist housing, young women's housing and newly arrived young immigrant support program.
- The program has two components, the direct housing of young women where there are 12 to 15 women housed at any one time and a referral and assessment program.
- The applicant is required to provide support to tenants in the properties managed by FYHG to help them develop independent living skills.
- The FYHG's target group is women who are most at risk of homelessness, that includes those women suffering from sexual assault and they prioritise women who are escaping domestic violence.
- Some of the women in the houses are refugees who have experience trauma and some of the women have children or are pregnant.

- The support needs of many women may not be met by a male worker, regardless of their competence.
- Young people do not trust easily and some of the young women FYHG support may have a greater reason not to trust them.
- Further, the cultural background of some young women may limit the support a male worker could provide.

The Tribunal grants an exemption from the operation of Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 1995** to enable the applicant to advertise and employ a female worker to assist it to carry out its housing programs for young women.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 16 February 2003.
