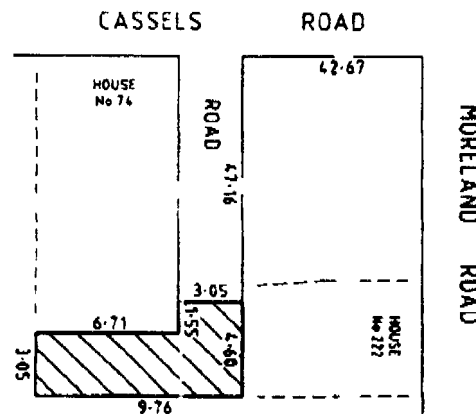

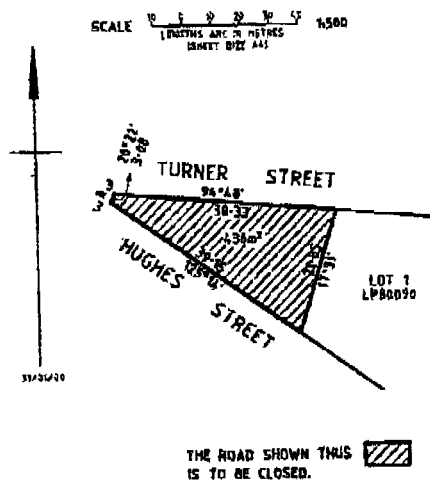

- Introduce the Residential Strategy, Urban Character Report and Vegetation Character Assessment as reference documents in the Planning Scheme.

Part II proposes a Local Variation to the Good Design Guide for Medium Density Housing.

The local variation proposes the substitution or introduction of various techniques relating to Density, Neighbourhood Character, Energy Efficiency, Building Envelope, Car Parking and Vehicle Access, Private and Communal Open Space and Site Facilities.
