REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

Road Safety (General) (Loading Zone Penalty) Regulations 2000

Road Safety (Road Rules) (Amendment) Regulations 2000

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the Road Safety (General) (Loading Zone Penalty) Regulations 2000 and (Road Rules) (Amendment) Regulations 2000.

The reason for the proposed regulations is to:

- (a) Increase the infringement penalty for unlawful parking in a loading zone from \$60 to \$100; and
- (b) permit commercial passenger vehicles to stop in a loading zone to drop off, or pick up, passengers or goods.

The first set of proposed regulations is made to ensure that parking restrictions are designed to control the behaviour of motorists so as to maximise the flow of traffic and promote the safety of all road users, while ensuring equitable access to available parking for eligible vehicles. For parking restrictions to be effective, it is necessary that penalties are set at a rate that is appropriate to promote compliance.

These penalties are avoidable in almost all cases. Unauthorised use of loading zones imposes financial and economic burdens on authorised users of a greater value than the proposed penalty. Accordingly, the penalty is considered appropriate for the nature of the offence, and commensurate with community expectations.

The RIS examined the implementation of a public education program and publicity as an alternative to the proposed regulations. Whilst an education program would increase public awareness of the penalties associated with a breach of the regulations, on its own, it would not be sufficient to modify offending behaviour. For this reason, maintaining the deterrent value of fines as well as education would be more effective in promoting compliance with parking management requirements.

VicRoads has developed Guidelines in consultation with relevant agencies and industry groups for distribution to Councils and the consulting industry as part of publicity campaign to increase public awareness on the use and new requirements as result of the changes to the road rules.

The RIS concluded that the proposed regulations are the most cost effective and efficient means of meeting the objectives.

The second set of proposed regulations is made to permit chauffeured hire cars to use loading zones to take up or set down passengers or loads. This would rectify the unintended omission of this group of road users from the use of loading zones, that occurred with the change to the road rules which came into operation on 1 December 1999.

The objectives to be achieved by the regulations are to -

- (i) Provide for safe, efficient and equitable road use;

- (ii) Eliminate financial and economic burdens on authorised business community groups; and
- (iii) Ensure that parking infringement penalties are appropriate to the severity of the offence and to promote compliance with parking regulations.
