CASINO RULES NOTICE NO. 15 OF 2000

Rules of the Game — Blackjack

By this notice, the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority **amends** the Rules in respect of the game "Blackjack" as set out in the Schedule.

This notice operates with effect from 4.00am on 12 July 2000.

Schedule

1. Game supervisor or pit boss also to activate system

For rule 26.5.2.2, **substitute** —

'26.5.2.2 If no decision can be reached the dealer or above shall activate the button.'.

2. Trial activation-pontoon without pandemonium wager

For rule 26.5.4, **substitute** —

'26.5.4 In a round of play a player who has achieved Pontoon but has not placed a valid Pontoon Pandemonium wager may request to push the jackpot button or may be offered the jackpot button by the dealer. If, in such an instances the player pushes the jackpot button, the result is void.'.

3. Irregularities

For rule 26.6, **substitute** —

'26.6 Irregularities

- Where, in the course of offering the jackpot button to a player with a valid Pontoon Pandemonium wager the jackpot button is activated other than by being pushed by the player entitled to do so, that player must be given the option of either accepting the result that has eventuated or pressing the jackpot button again.
 - Where the decision is made not to activate the button again all other players wagering on the same playing area must accept the decision, and the appropriate payout will be made to each player.
 - Where the decision is made to activate the button again, each player wagering on the same playing area will be given the option of, before the button is pressed again, either accepting the result already displayed or receiving payment according to the new result.
- 26.6.2 In instances where the jackpot button is activated at a time other than in the course of offering the button to a player with a valid Pontoon Pandemonium wager, the result is void.
- The Game of **Blackjack** and its rules were approved by notice published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 24 April 1997 (S44). The rules have subsequently been amended by
 - a notice dated 30 April 1998 (published in Victoria Government Gazette G17);
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 1 of 1999 published on 18 March 1999 (S39);
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 13 of 1999 published on 13 August 1999 (S121);
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 23 of 1999 published on 22 October 1999 (S156);
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 24 of 1999 published on 4 November 1999 (S161);
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 3 of 2000 published on 17 March 2000 (S23).
 - Casino Rules Notice No. 10 of 2000 published on 19 May 2000 (S68).

26.7 Electronic Failure

- In the event of electronic failure, the "Pontoon Pandemonium" wager will not be offered to patrons and a regular Crown Pontoon game will be conducted.
- Where an electronic failure occurs during a round of play any winning "Pontoon Pandemonium" wagers shall be settled with a payout that is equivalent to the minimum wager for the Crown Pontoon playing area.'.

1. Layout

Rules 2.1.1 and 2.2.1 are **amended** to read as though, in item 1. of the Schedule to Casino Rules Notice No. 4 of 2000, the reference to rule 2.2.1 had been to rule 2.1.1.

2. Double zero roulette wheel

Substitute rule 2.3.3 —

"2.3.3 each have 38 equal compartments with one marked zero and another marked double zero, and the others marked 1 to 36 coloured alternately red and black around the wheel; and".
