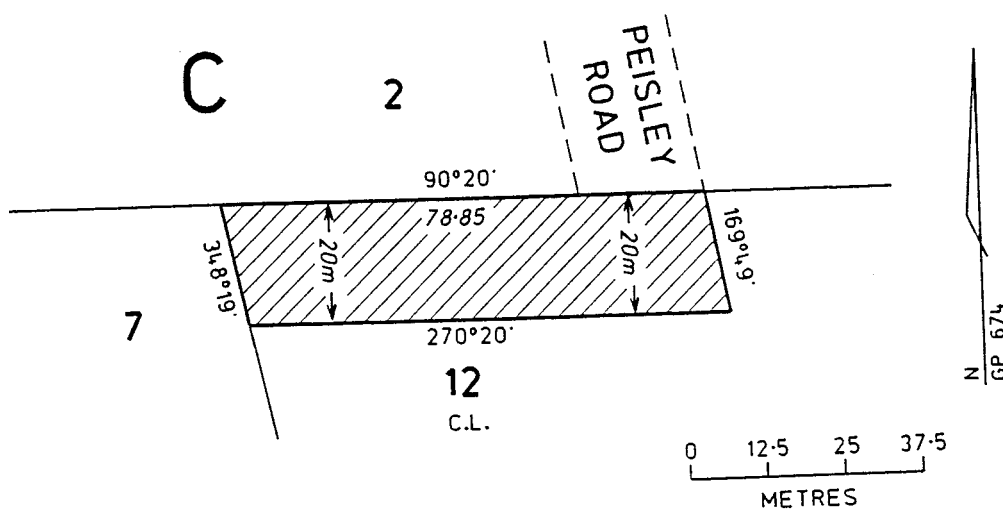

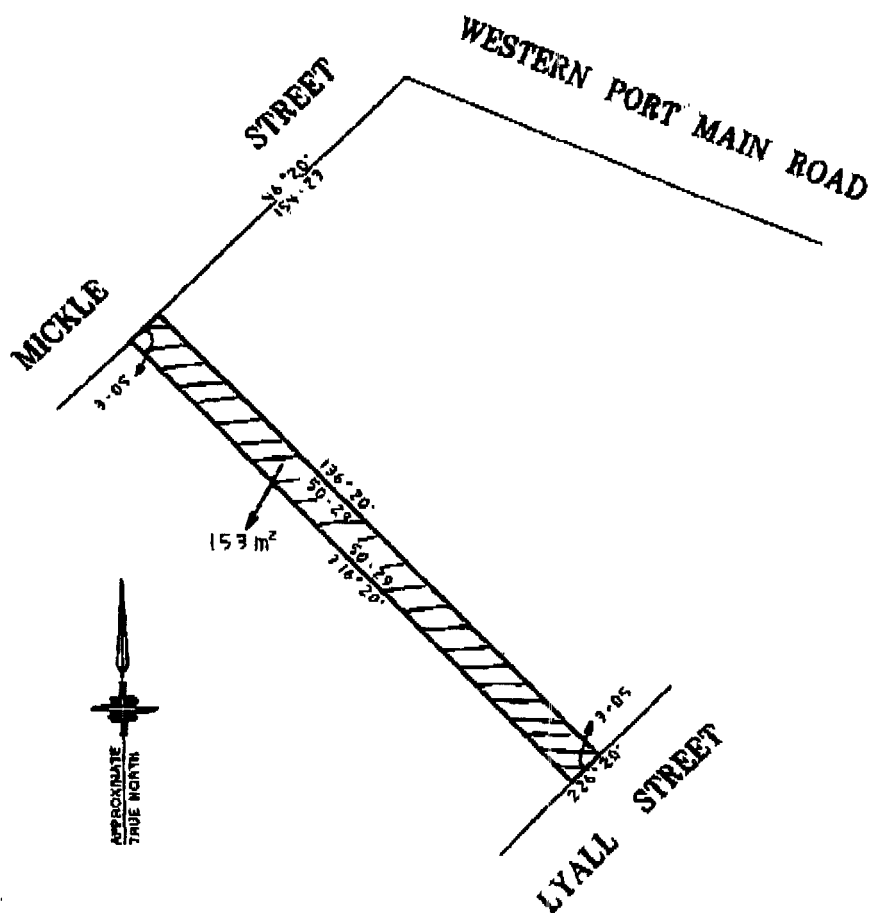

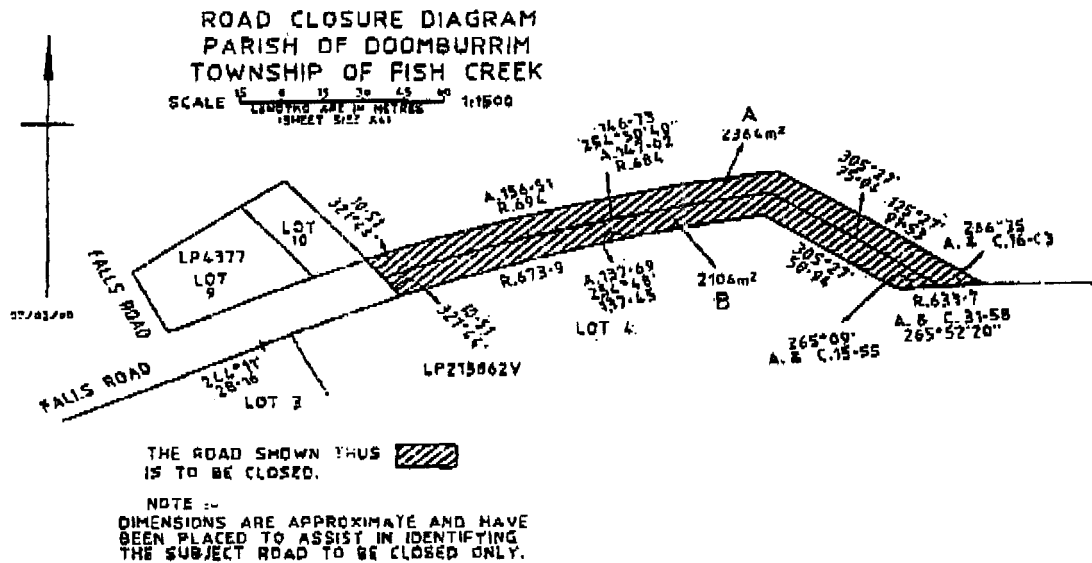

2. Dogs must be under effective control

The Owner of any dog must keep the dog in effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash, not exceeding 1.5 metres in length, attached to the dog and either

- a) held by the Owner who must be capable of restraining the dog; or
- b) fixed securely to post or other fixture, while the dog is in any public area of the municipal district of the Council, except where Clause 3 of this Order applies.

3. Owner's obligations

A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a Leash Free Area designated by the Council, if the Owner:

- a) carries a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length, sufficient to bring the dog under effective control, and
- b) remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog so as to be able to promptly bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length if that becomes necessary whether to comply with the provisions of this order or for any other reason.
- c) If a dog is off a chain, cord or leash in a Leash Free Area designated by the Council, the dog must be brought under the effective control of the Owner by means of chain, cord or leash not exceeding 1.5 metres in length if the dog roams, or is likely to roam, to within 50 metres of:
 - (i) the principal location of an organised sporting event;
 - (ii) a children's play equipment area;
 - (iii) the entrance of a school during school hours and 15 minutes prior to and after school hours;
 - (iv) the principal location of an organised public meeting, or
 - (v) a permanent barbecue or picnic area.
 or if the dog does or is likely to worry, threaten, rush or attack any person or other animal.

Fair Trading Act 1999

ORDER PROHIBITING THE SUPPLY OF DANGEROUS GOODS AND REVOKING PREVIOUS ORDER IN RESPECT OF CERTAIN OF THE SAME GOODS

I, Marsha Thomson, Minister for Consumer Affairs, pursuant to the powers conferred on me by Part 3 Division 1 of the **Fair Trading Act 1999** hereby make an order:

- (a) prohibiting the supply in Victoria of children's nightwear and limited daywear which do not comply with goods of a kind specified in Division 1 of the Schedule to the Commonwealth's Consumer Protection Notice No. 9 of 1999 titled "Consumer Product Safety Standard for Children's Nightwear And Limited Daywear Having Reduced Fire Hazard", as varied by Division 3 of the Schedule, made for the purposes of section 65C of the **Trade Practices Act 1974** (as amended from time to time);
 - (i) requiring that the standard first mentioned in Division 2 of the Schedule to the Consumer Protection Notice No. 9 above, being Australian Standard AS 1249 – 1990, Children's nightclothes having reduced fire hazard and the amendments to that standard in Division 3 of the above Notice, shall cease to have effect from 1 September 2001;
 - (ii) advising that where more than one standard is specified for a particular

class of these goods, the goods need comply with only one of the standards specified; and

- (b) prohibiting the supply in Victoria of paper patterns for children's nightwear which do not comply with goods of a kind specified in Division 1 of the Schedule to the Commonwealth's Consumer Protection Notice No. 10 of 1999 titled "Consumer Product Safety Standard For Paper Patterns For Children's Nightwear", as varied by Division 3 of the Schedule, made for the purposes of section 65C of the **Trade Practices Act 1974** (as amended from time to time);
 - (i) requiring that the standard first mentioned in Division 2 of the Schedule to the Consumer Protection Notice No. 10 above, being Australian Standard AS 1249 – 1990, Children's nightclothes having reduced fire hazard and the amendments to that standard in Division 3 of the above Notice, shall cease to have effect from 1 September 2001; and
 - (ii) advising that where more than one standard is specified for a particular class of these goods, the goods need comply with only one of the standards specified.

I make this order noting the requirements imposed by the Commonwealth on children's nightwear and limited daywear, and paper patterns for children's nightwear, thereby satisfying the requirement of sections 40(1) and 40(2)(b) of the **Fair Trading Act 1999**.

Pursuant to the powers conferred on me by Part 3 Division 1 of the **Fair Trading Act 1999** I hereby revoke the previous order in respect of children's nightclothes, dated 5 November 1998 and published in the Victoria Government Gazette No. G45 of 12 November 1998.

Explanatory Note

The new mandatory safety standards adopt the latest Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 1249:1999, Children's nightwear and limited daywear having reduced fire hazard, which was published on 5 April 1999.

The new mandatory safety standard covers design, performance and labelling of garments of a type suitable for nightwear in sizes ranging from 00 to 14 in accordance with AS 1182. Included are pyjamas, pyjama-style overgarments, nightdresses, nightshirts, dressing gowns, bathrobes and infant sleepbags, and garments such as all-in-ones and boxer shorts of a loose style commonly used as nightwear. Excluded are articles of headwear, leggings either with or without a foot, footwear and handwear.

The standard also simplifies labelling requirements. Nightwear will need to be labelled either 'LOW FIRE DANGER' or 'WARNING HIGH FIRE DANGER KEEP AWAY FROM FIRE' with a flame symbol, depending on the risk category of the garment. The standard also requires paper patterns for children's nightwear to be labelled with the appropriate warning.

The new mandatory safety standards allow the goods to comply with either the Australian/New Zealand Standard AS/NZS 1249:1999 or the Australian Standard AS 1249 — 1990 until 31 August 2001, to allow time for existing stocks to be sold. After this date the Australian Standard AS 1249 — 1990 will cease to have effect. The new mandatory safety standards will cease to have effect on 1 November 2004.
