No. 51/2000 **Courts and Tribunals Legislation (Further Amendment) Act 2000**

No. 51/2000 (1) This Act, except sections 5 and 6, comes into operation on the day after the day on which it receives the Royal Assent.

(2) Subject to sub-section (3), sections 5 and 6 come into operation on a day or days to be proclaimed.

(3) If section 5 or 6 does not come into operation before 1 January 2001, it comes into operation on that day.

## Order in Council

The City of Melbourne resolved at its meeting on 29 August 2000 to make an Order pursuant to Section 26(2) of the **Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994**. The Order will take effect on 13 September 2000.

## 1. Dogs on Leash

The owner of any dog must keep the dog under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 3 metres held by the owner and attached to the dog while the dog is in a reserve or any public place in the municipality, except where otherwise designated by signs as being a designated reserve.

## 2. Owners Obligations

A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in a designated reserve provided the owner:

- Carries a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 3 metres in length, sufficient to bring the dog under effective control if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or animal;
- Remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog and within constant sight of the dog so as to be able to promptly place the dog on a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 3 metres in length if that becomes necessary; and
- Does not allow the dog to worry or threaten any person or animal, and does not allow the dog to attack any person or animal.

If a dog is off a chain, cord or leash, it must be brought under effective control by means of a chain, cord or leash not exceeding 3 metres in length if the dog is within 20 metres of:

- a children's play equipment area;
- a permanent barbecue or picnic area.

## 3. Dogs Prohibited

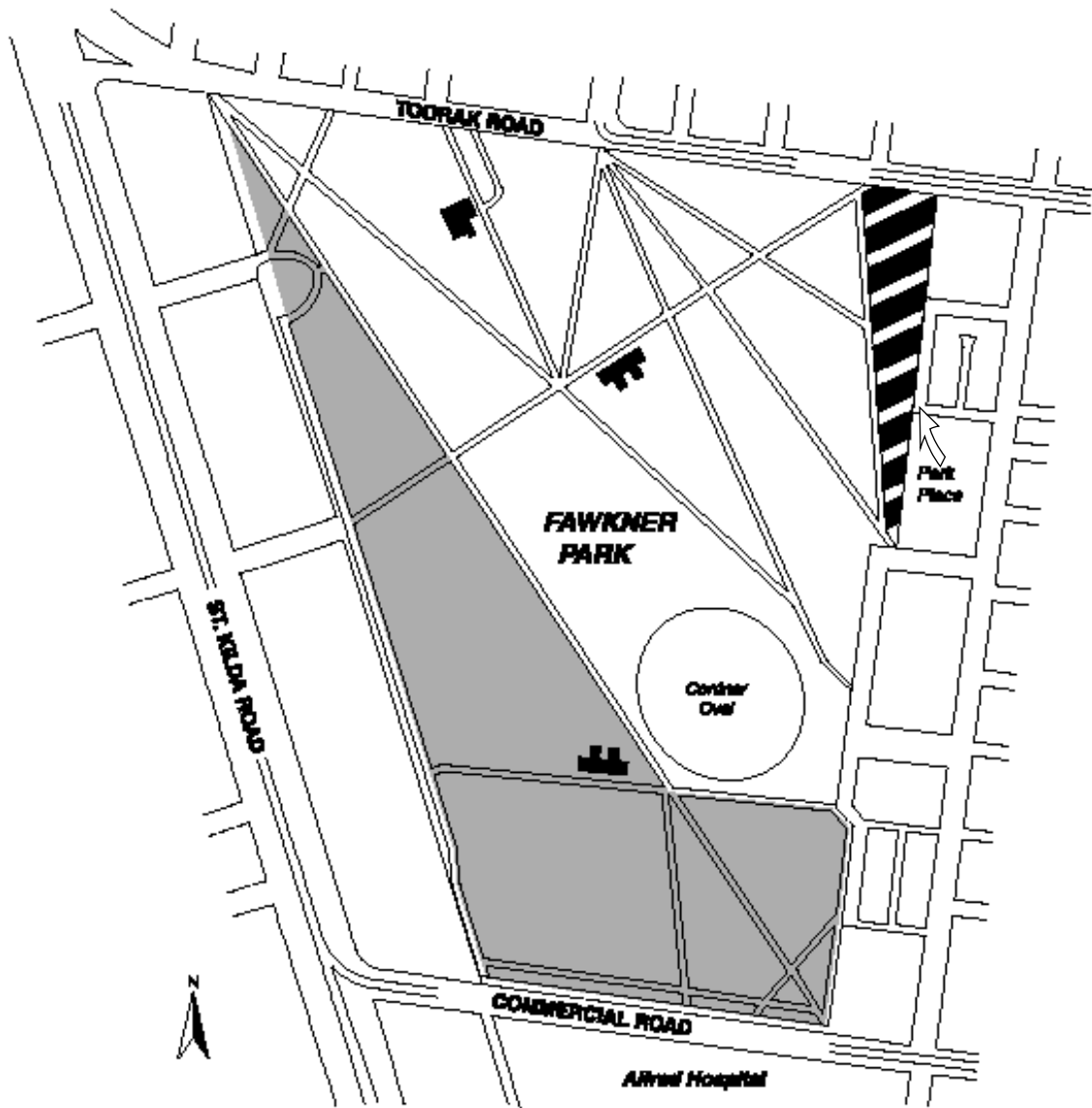
Dogs are prohibited from entering or remaining in a prohibited area at any time of the day.

- Woorarra Inc. is a Women's Refuge providing crisis, short-term supported

accommodation to women and women with dependent children in crisis as a result of domestic violence.

- A support worker involves the worker working directly with children and mothers, affording them safe and secure accommodation and assisting them in re-establishing their lives in the wider community.
- In circumstances of domestic violence it is considered women's needs are best met by assistance and support from other women.
- The applicant was granted a previous exemption in 1994 which expired on 20 October 1997.

The Tribunal grants an exemption from the operation of Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 1995** to enable the applicant to advertise for and employ women only as support workers in a women's refuge.

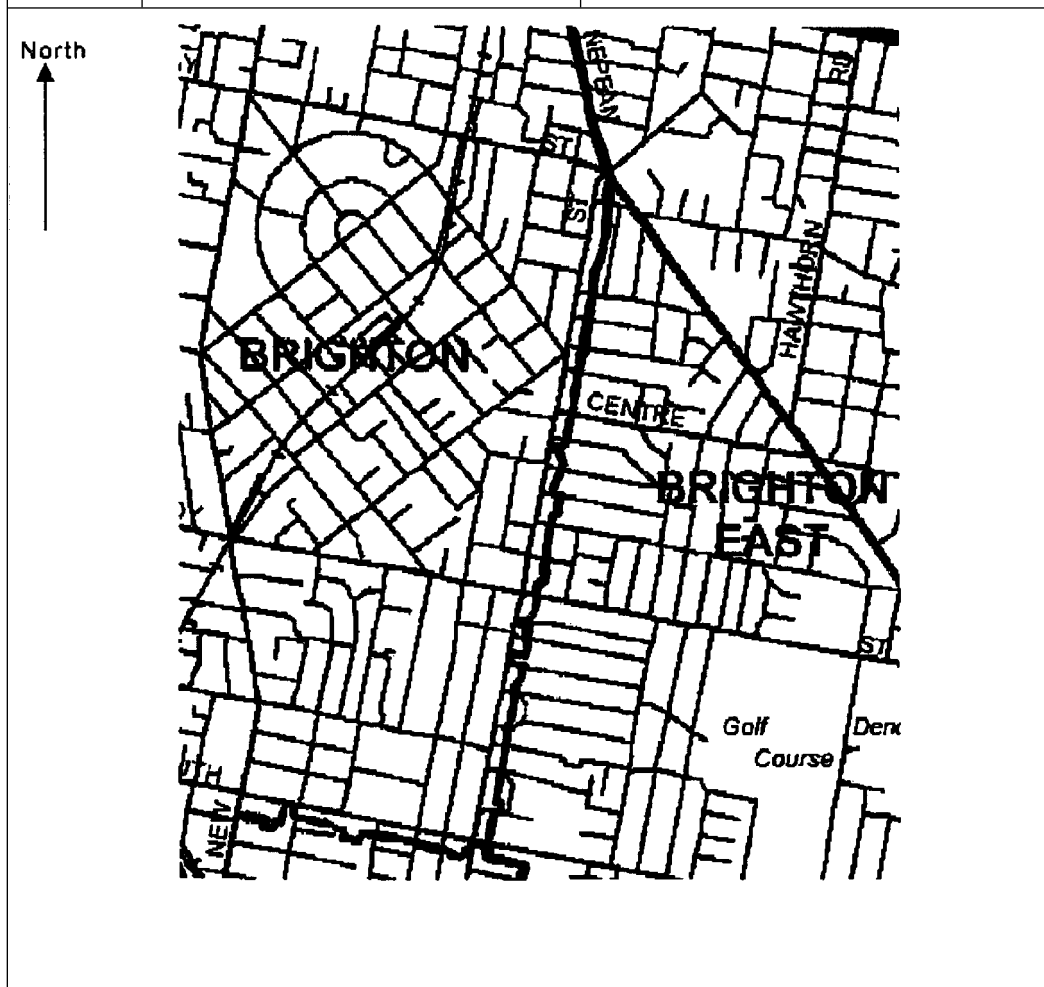

### **Electricity Safety Act 1998**

#### **DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 4**

##### **Order in Council**

The Governor in Council under Section 4 of the **Electricity Safety Act 1998** (the Act), declares that certain provisions of the Act specified in this Order, do not have effect to the extent specified –

#### **Section 4(1)(a) of the Electricity Safety Act 1998 Electrical contractors and electrical workers**

1. Sections 30 and 36 of the Act do not have effect in relation to an **electrical contractor** contracting or undertaking to carry out the disconnection or reconnection of a consumers mains or submains neutral for the purpose of conducting neutral and polarity testing using a Victorian Electricity Supply Industry (“VESI”), Neutral and Supply Tester.
2. Sections 36 and 38(a) of the Act do not have effect in relation to an **electrical installation worker** disconnecting or reconnecting a consumers mains or submains neutral for the purpose of conducting neutral and polarity testing using a VESI Neutral and Supply Tester if the electricity supplier supplying or to supply electricity to the electrical installation has authorised the worker to carry out the testing and has certified that the worker has satisfactorily completed –
  - (a) the VESI Neutral and Supply Tester Course; and
  - (b) a practical assessment in performing the functions of the VESI Neutral and Supply Tester; and

- (c) training in the safety aspects of the disconnection and reconnection of consumers mains or submains neutrals and of neutral and polarity testing; and
  - (d) a practical assessment in safely disconnecting and reconnecting consumers mains or submains neutrals; and
  - (e) training in the limitations of the work.
3. Sections 45(1) and 45A of the Act do not have effect in relation to a registered electrical contractor or a licensed electrical installations worker who is a responsible person under section 41A of the Act responsible for the carrying out of the disconnection or reconnection of a consumers mains or submains neutral for the purpose of conducting neutral and polarity testing using a VESI Neutral and Supply Tester.

Except where expressions are defined in the Act, expressions used in this Order have the same meaning as they have in the **Electricity Safety (Installations) Regulations 1999**.

#### **AMENDMENT OF ORDER IN COUNCIL**

The Governor in Council acting under section 4 of the **Electricity Safety Act 1998** (the Act) and section 27 of the **Interpretation of Legislation Act 1984**, makes the following amendment to the Order in Council made under section 4 of the Act dated 28 April 1999 –

##### **Part 3**

#### **Section 4(1)(c) of the Electricity Safety Act 1998 Electrical work**

For paragraph (d) of Part 3, **substitute** –

- “(d) involving the installation, maintenance or removal of surveillance devices or enhancement equipment within the

meaning of the **Surveillance Devices Act 1999** carried out by a serving member of the Victorian Police Force who has satisfactorily completed a training course approved by the Office and in conjunction with a warrant granted under the **Surveillance Devices Act 1999**.”
