Proposed New Local Law No.3
Maude Street Mall

Notice is given that the Greater Shepparton City Council proposes to make Local Law No.3 to:

- (a) provide for the peace, order and good management and operation of the Maude Street Mall; and
- (b) provide for those matters which require a Local Law under the **Local Government Act 1989**, and any other Act; and
- (c) provide for the administration of Council powers and functions, in relation to the Maude Street Mall, and for the issue of permits and infringement notices; and
- (d) prohibit, regulate and control activities, events, practices or behaviour in the Maude Street Mall so that no detriment is caused to the amenity of the Mall, nor nuisance to any person, nor detrimental affect to a person's property.

The Local Law covers the use and approval of vehicles and velocipedes in the Mall; prescribed hours for Mall activities; the nature of activities that require a permit from the Council; prohibition as to animals and birds in the Mall; damage to property, official signs; seizure, removal and detention of property unlawfully in the Mall; noise, signs and advertisements; and offensive behaviour.

The Local Law replaces existing Local Law No.3 with the inclusion of a new clause relating to offensive behaviour.

Meeting Procedures (Amendment) Local Law

FRANKSTON PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Amendment
Amendment C7

The Frankston City Council has prepared amendment C7 to the Local Section of the Frankston Planning Scheme.

This notice forms part of the re-exhibition of Amendment C7 due to the omission of Map 1 to the Development Plan Overlay schedule 7 from the original notification dated 21 December 2000. As part of this re-exhibition the length of time for submissions about the amendment has been extended to 9 February 2001.

This Amendment proposes to:

- Rezone approximately 101 hectares of land at 160 Potts Road, Langwarrin from Special Use Zone 2 to Residential 1 and Environmental Rural.
- Include the land in a Development Plan Overlay, which requires the preparation of a subdivision concept plan, nature conservation management plan and traffic management plan. It also requires that any subdivision generally follow a concept development plan that is included in the schedule to the Development Plan Overlay.
- Reduce the extent of the Environmental Significance Overlay that currently applies to the whole of the land. The overlay will remain in those areas where the vegetation has been identified as being highly significant for nature conservation.
- Make a number of consequential changes, including changes to some strategic maps in the Municipal Strategic Statement.

The land affected by the Amendment and the application is located on the north-west corner of Plenty Road and Settlement Road, Bundoora. 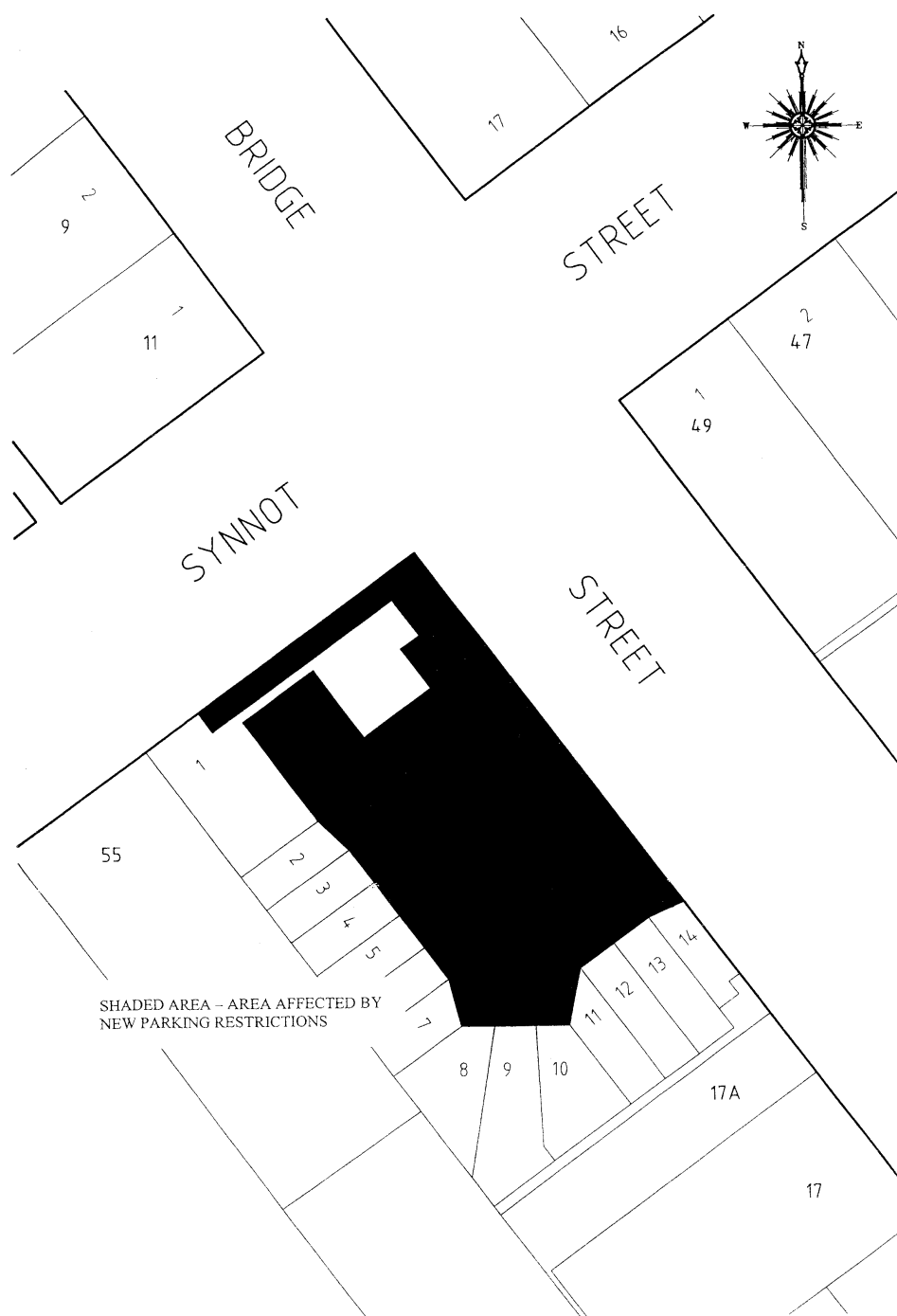

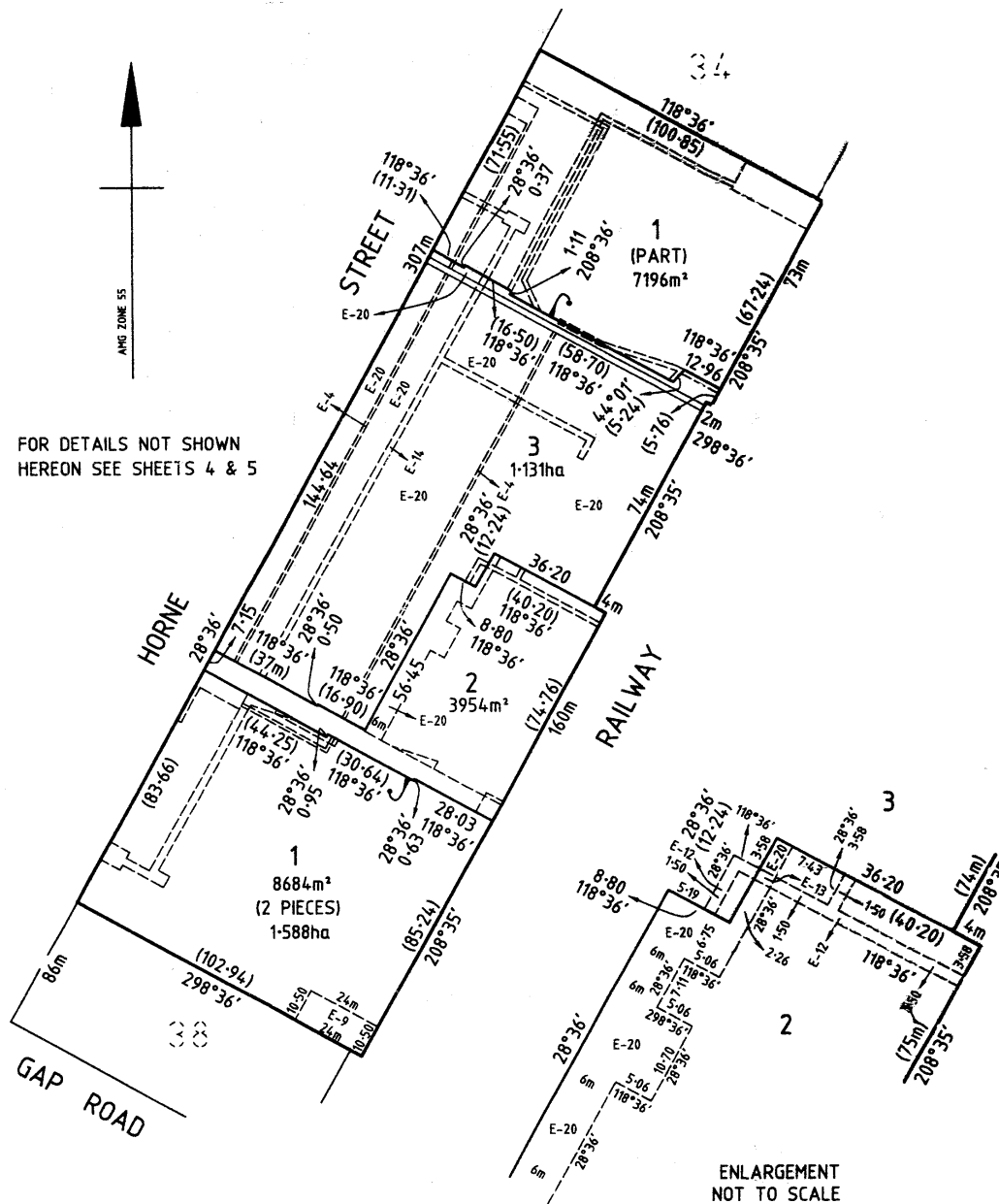

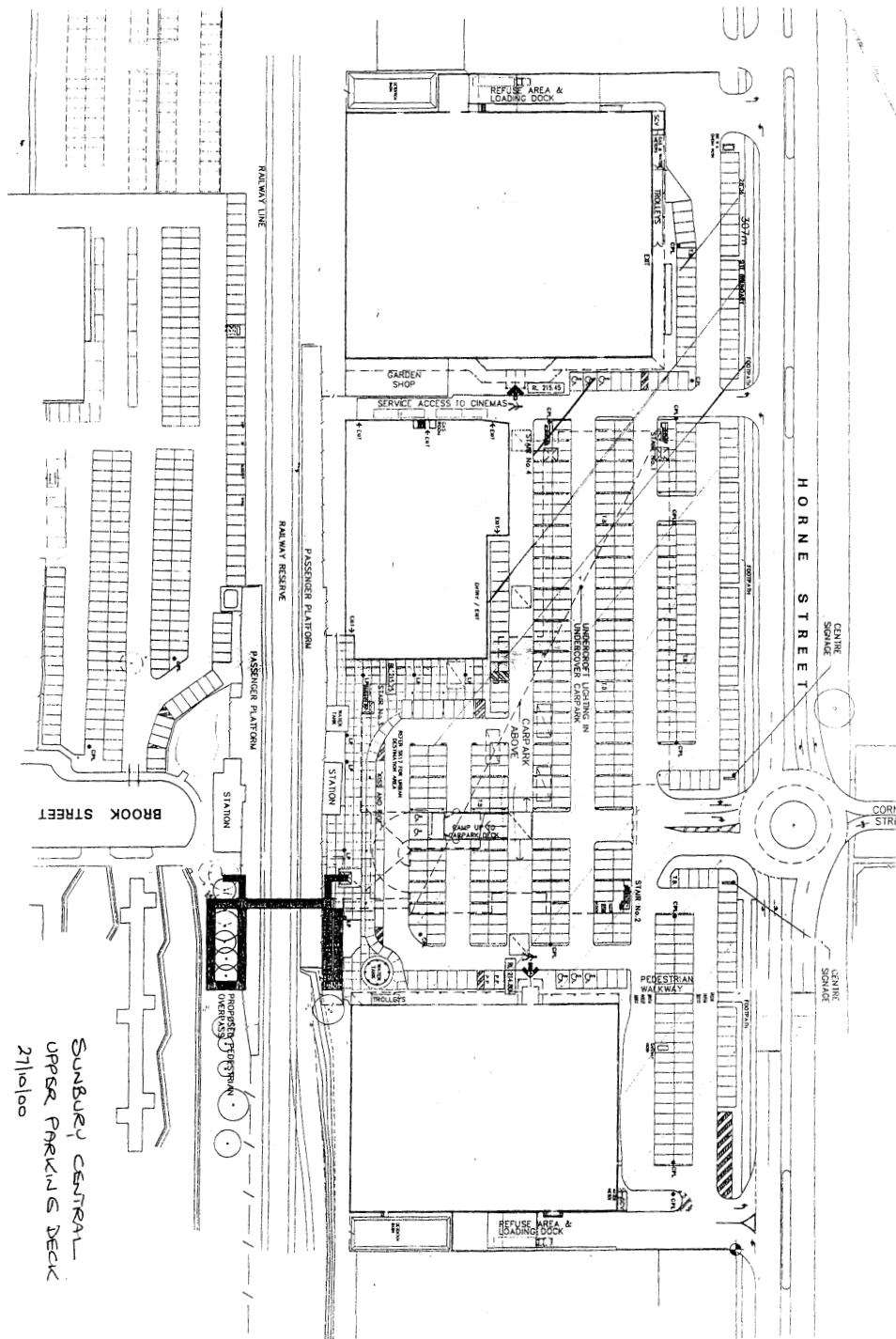
