REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

Gaming Machine Control (Advertising) Regulations 2001

Notice is given under section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in relation to the proposed Gaming Machine Control (Advertising) Regulations 2001.

The objective of the Regulations is to foster responsible gaming by regulating advertising relating to the playing of gaming machines.

There is a voluntary industry code of practice for the advertising of gambling that covers advertising of machine gaming. General consumer protection measures that address aspects of advertising generally also cover advertising of machine gaming.

However, a report by the Productivity Commission in 1999 on Australia's gambling industries concluded that, notwithstanding existing general consumer protection measures, there are grounds for legislatively based codes specific to gambling. Responses to the Victorian Minister for Gaming's Responsible Gambling Consultation Paper, released in March 2000, recognised the importance of advertising in tackling problem gambling. An important aspect of the Victorian Government's responsible gambling strategy is the regulation of gaming advertising. For these reasons, the Regulations are proposed.

The proposed Regulations impose restrictions and requirements on the content and form of gaming advertisements. A gaming advertisement is defined in the proposed Regulations as including but is not limited to—

- (a) any writing, still or moving picture, sign, symbol or other visual image; and
- (b) any audible message or sound that gives publicity to the playing of a gaming machine or otherwise advertises or is intended to advertise the playing of a gaming machine.

A RIS has been prepared in respect of the proposed Regulations. The RIS estimates the costs and benefits of the proposed Regulations in comparison to identified alternatives. The RIS concludes that the net social benefits of the proposed Regulations are expected to be positive but that the financial costs may be negative.

By this notice, the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority amends the Rules in respect of the game "Blackjack" as set out in the Schedule.

This notice operates with effect from 4.00am on 3 February 2001.

Magnificent Sevens

For rule 25.1, **substitute**—

"25.1 Where the version of Blackjack or Crown Blackjack in play incorporates "Magnificent Sevens" the approved rules of Blackjack and/or Crown Blackjack will apply, except where the rules are inconsistent with the rules of "Magnificent Sevens", in which case the rules of "Magnificent Sevens" will prevail."

For rule 25.3.1, **substitute**—

"25.3.1 "Magnificent Sevens wager" means a wager that may be made in addition to a players original Blackjack or Crown Blackjack wager in the space provided for Magnificent Sevens wagers."

For rule 25.4.2, substitute-

A player may only place a "Magnificent Sevens" wager if they have already "25.4.2 placed a Blackjack or Crown Blackjack wager."

For rule 25.4.3, substitute-

"25.4.3 A player may wager on more than one playing area and will be entitled to place a "Magnificent Sevens" wager for each wager placed."

For rule 25.6.1.1, substitute—

- "25.6.1.1 "The hand is settled according to the payout odds stated in Table 1 immediately there is a result. The hand is then completed according to the Blackjack and/or Crown Blackjack rules."
- The game of Blackjack and its rules were approved by notices published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 24 April 1997 (S44). The rules have subsequently been amended by-
