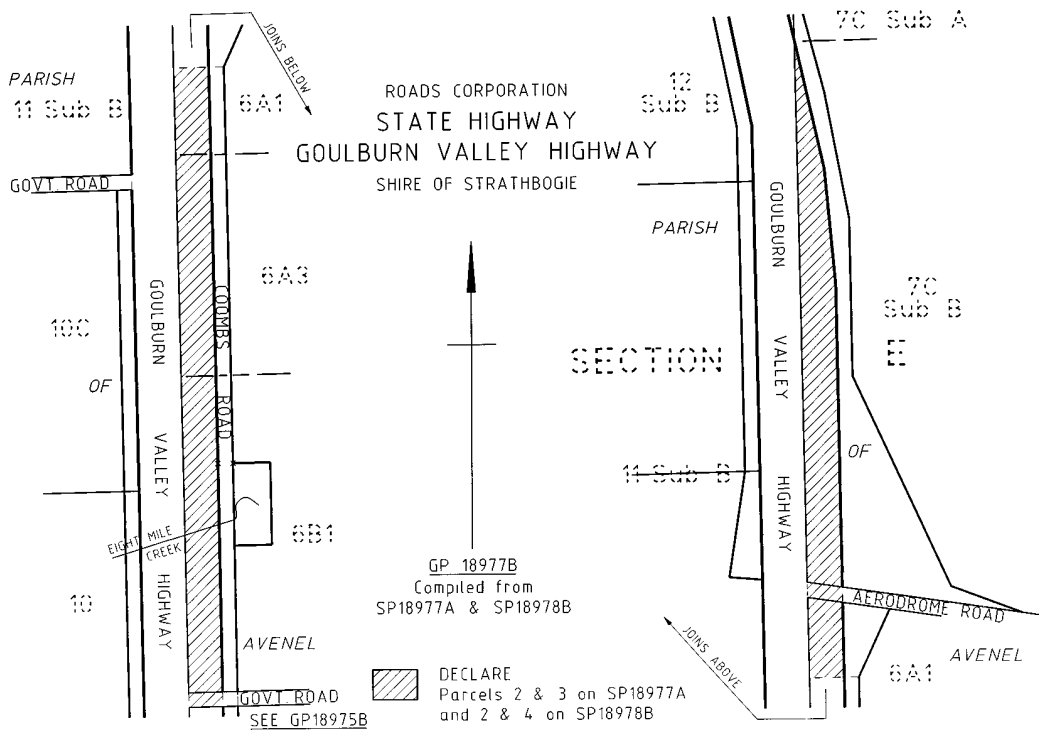
08/01 Goulburn Valley Highway in the Shire of Strathbogie shown hatched on plan numbered GP 18973B.



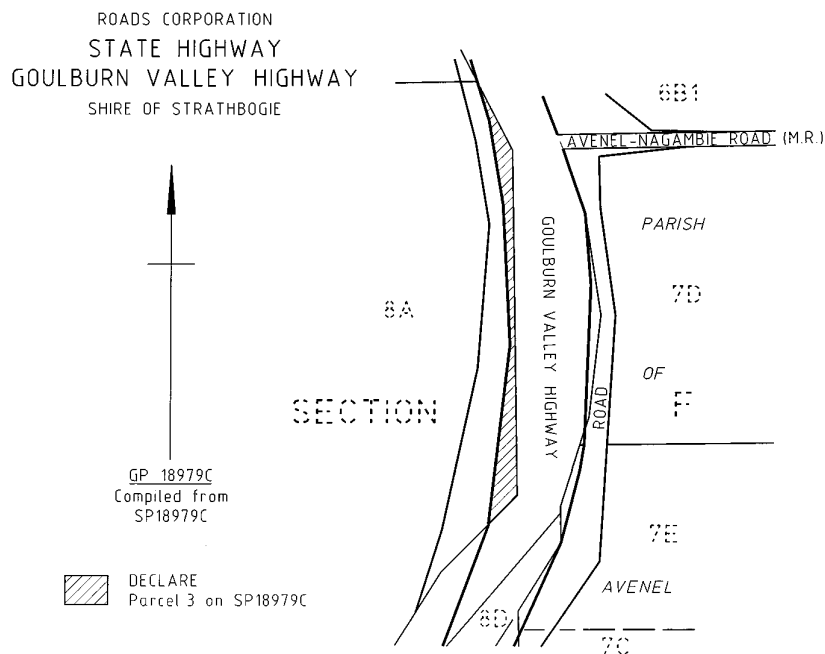
09/01 Goulburn Valley Highway in the Shire of Strathbogie shown hatched on plan numbered GP 18975B.

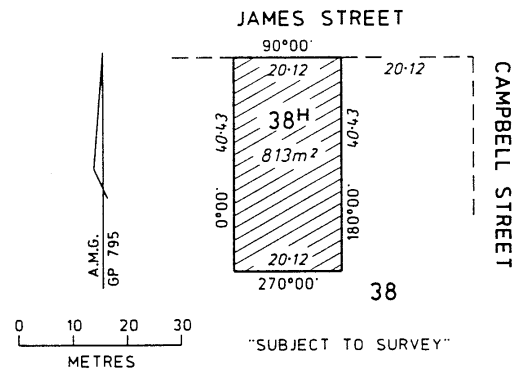
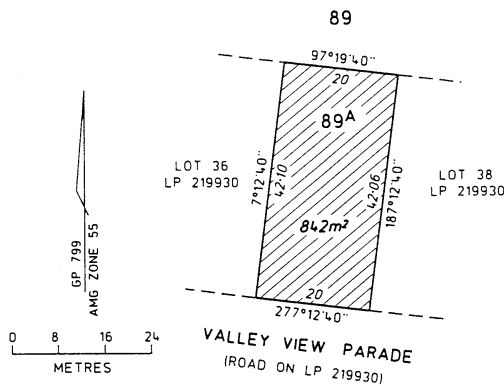

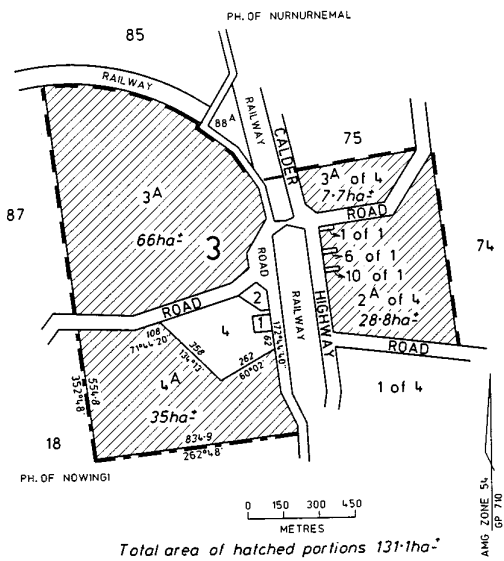
