NOTICE OF MAKING LOCAL LAW NO. 2
(FURTHER AMENDMENT)
LOCAL LAW 2001

Hobsons Bay City Council, at its meeting on 8 May 2001, made Local Law No. 2 (Further Amendment) Local Law 2001.

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend Local Law No. 2 ("the Principal Local Law") relating to:

- Outdoor advertising signs and the display of goods and motor vehicles for sale on roads or Council land, the establishment of outdoor eating facilities, the use of recreational vehicles within the municipality and the parking of vehicles on Council reserves;
- Update references to legislation;
- Provide for the peace, order and good governance of the municipality.

The local law will amend the Principal Local Law by:

- inserting a new definition of recreation vehicle;
- permitting Council to designate areas within which the use of recreational vehicles is permitted, upon such conditions as Council sees appropriate and to grant permits to use recreational vehicles outside the designated area;
- creating an offence to use a recreation vehicle outside a designated area or not in accordance with Council's conditions on Council permit;
- creating offences to:
 - place or allow to be placed any advertising sign, display or allow to be displayed any goods, or display or allow to be displayed a motor vehicle for sale on a road or Council land except in accordance with a permit; and
 - establish an outdoor eating facility on a road or Council land unless in accordance with a permit;
- adding a definition of "parking control sign";
- creating an offence of parking a vehicle on a reserve without a permit, or in specified circumstances;

- providing that specific penalty provisions in a clause prevail over the general penalty provisions.

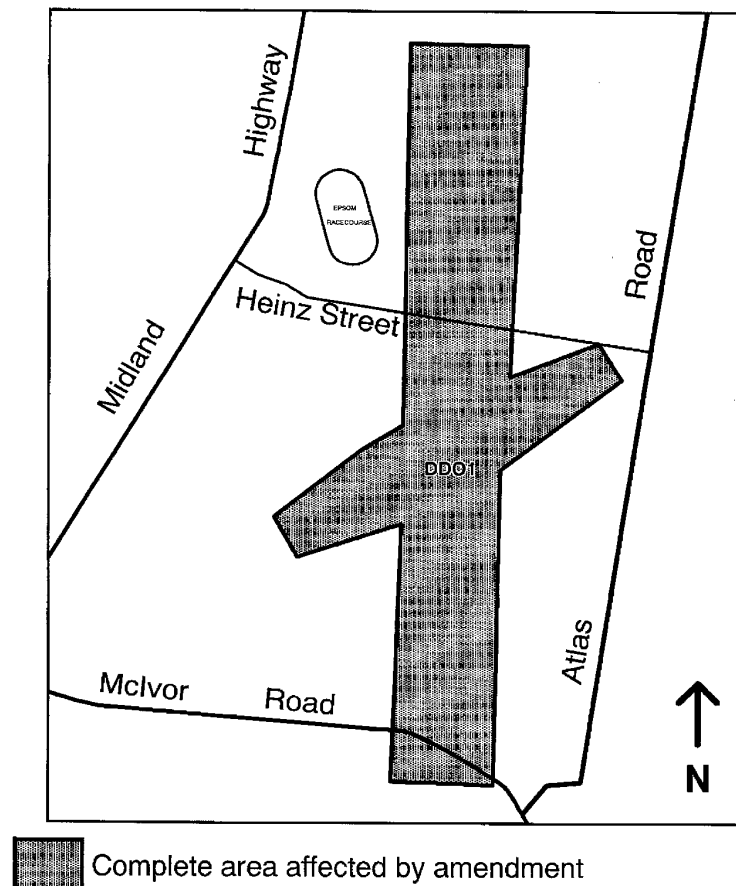

maintain the credibility of the position, both locally, nationally and internationally and even more importantly with the indigenous Australian community. The position needs to work with that community and numbers of indigenous students because of the various programs of the University, the indigenous studies program and bridging program are targeted primarily, although not entirely, at indigenous students.

- The University was granted a previous exemption (37 of 1998) which expires on 20 May 2001.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption to the applicant from the operation of Sections 13, 100 and 195 of the Equal Opportunity Act 1995 to enable the applicant to advertise for and employ an indigenous person to the position of Chair of Australian Indigenous Studies and Director of the Monash Aboriginal Programs.

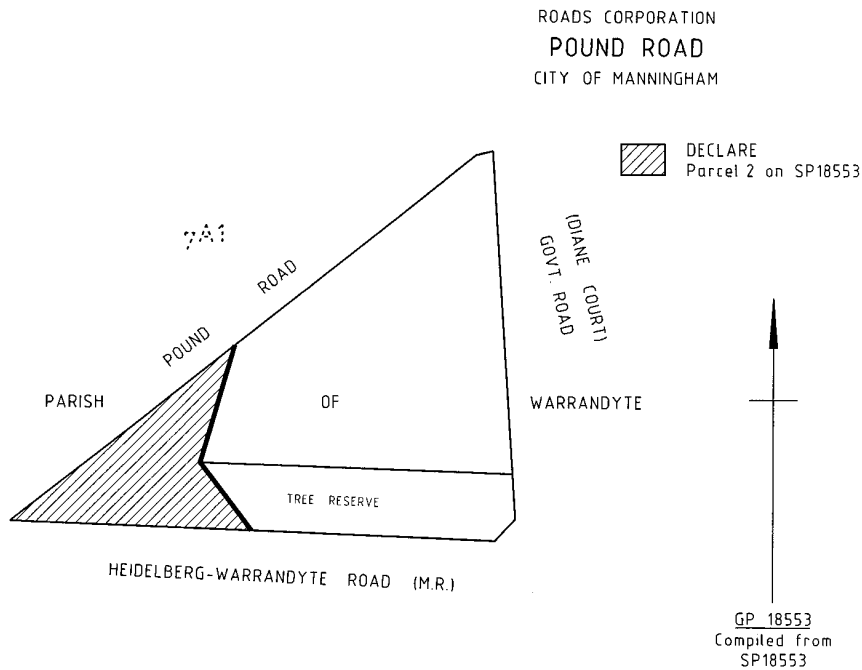


19/01 Northern Route in the City of Manningham shown hatched on plan numbered GP 18952.

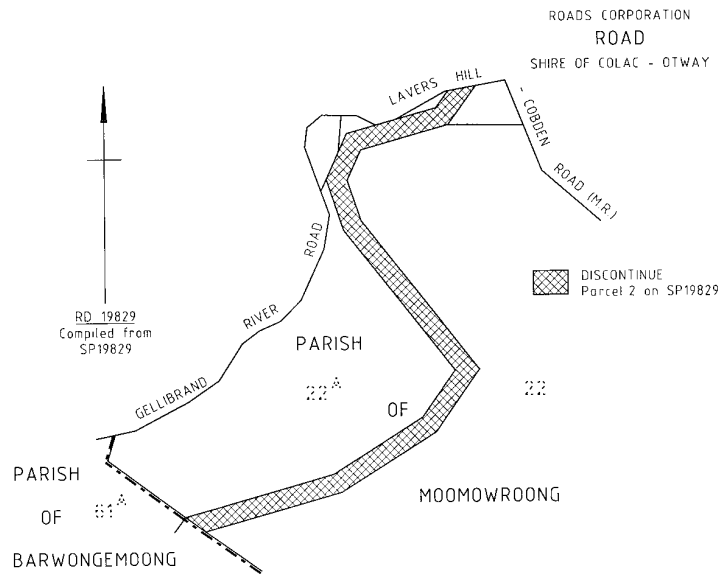

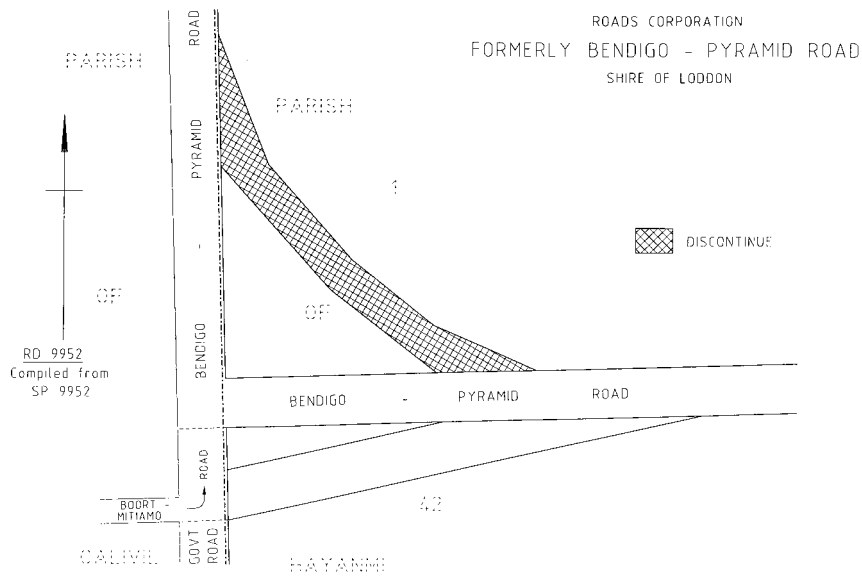
