- require builders or appointed agents to obtain an Asset Protection Permit before commencing building activities which have the potential to damage Council assets.

- create an offence for an owner of land, builder engaged to carry out building work on land or an appointed agent of either the owner or builder
 - to carry out or allow to be carried out building work on land unless an Asset Protection Permit has been obtained;
 - to deliver to a building site any equipment or material unless an Asset Protection Permit has been obtained;
 - not to ensure that no entry to the land takes place other than from a temporary vehicle crossing and that no materials are deposited on any part of the road without the approval of Council;
 - not to notify Council in writing of proposed building work at least seven days before the building work commences, and provide the Council written notice of any prior damage to any part of the road at least seven days before the building work commences or any equipment or materials are delivered to the land;
 - not to repair (to the satisfaction of Council) any damaged road, channel, drain, vehicle crossing or other asset vested in Council adjacent to the land where the building work takes place or which is likely to be affected by the building work;
 - not to ensure that the building site is developed and managed to minimise the risk of stormwater pollution, through the contamination of run-off by chemicals, sediments, animal wastes or gross pollutants, in accordance with currently accepted best practice;
 - not to provide a refuse facility for the purpose of disposing of builder's refuse, and do various things both in relation to the builder's refuse and the refuse facility itself;
 - not to provide a sewerage or portable toilet on land before undertaking or

carrying on any building, engineering or other work necessitating the employment or engagement of persons on that land

- specify what an Asset Protection Permit may allow or require;
- provide for the inspection of building sites and empower authorised officers to take specified action;
- delete clause 24.4 – 24.11 (inclusive) of Council's Local Law No. 3;
- renumber clauses 24.12 and 24.13 of Council's Local Law No. 3.

Following a formal hearing into the ability to practise of Robert Kline of 63 Hume Avenue 08-02, Hillview Green, Singapore 598742, identification number 1855269, registered in division 1, a panel appointed by the Nurses Board of Victoria found, on 11 April 2001, that the ability of the nurse to practise is adversely affected because he has an incapacity.

The panel determined that:

- 1. The registration of the nurse be suspended for 12 months ending on 11 April 2002, subject to paragraph 2.
- 2. After 11 April 2002, the suspension of the nurse's registration may be removed on written application, but only if the following

conditions, limitations or restrictions are and have been observed.

- (a) From 16 May 2001 until the suspension is removed, the nurse must not work in any capacity for:
 - (i) a registered funded agency, nor
 - (ii) a health service establishment,
 as those terms are defined in s.3 **Health Services Act 1988** of Victoria, nor as or for a nurse's agent, as defined in s.3 **Nurses Act 1993**.
- (b) During at least 12 months preceding the application to remove the suspension, the nurse must provide the Board with eight (8) reports of random drug-free urine screens conducted progressively over that period.
- (c) During at least 12 months preceding the application to remove the suspension, the nurse must undergo consultations with a psychiatrist approved in writing by the Board, such consultations to occur at least once a month, or more frequently if the psychiatrist recommends.
- (d) Before or with the application to remove the suspension, the nurse must provide the Board with a written report from the psychiatrist:
 - (i) of the consultations pursuant to sub-paragraph (c); and
 - (ii) addressing the question of whether the ability of the nurse to practise is adversely affected because:
 - of the physical or mental health of the nurse;
 - the nurse has an incapacity; or
 - the nurse is an alcoholic or drug-dependent person,

which report must be satisfactory to the Board, and a copy of which report must be provided to the independent psychiatrist referred to in sub-paragraph (e).

- (a) Before the application to remove the suspension is considered by the Board, a copy of the report provided pursuant to

sub-paragraph (d) must be provided to Dr Walton, or to some other independent psychiatrist appointed by the Board for this purpose. The nurse must be examined by that psychiatrist, who will also provide the Board with a report of that examination, and addressing the question raised in sub-paragraph (d)(ii), which additional report must be satisfactory to the Board.

INQUIRY INTO IMPROVING SAFETY FOR
OLDER ROAD USERS

The Victorian Government recognises that many older road users continue to drive and use Victoria’s roads safely for many years.

However, changes associated with the ageing process may affect the safety of some older users of the road network.

As Victoria’s population ages it is important that the Government and the Parliament seek ways of maximising the continued safety and mobility of older road users.

The Governor in Council under Section 4F of the **Parliamentary Committees Act 1968**, refers the matters outlined below to the Road Safety Committee.

To inquire into, consider and make recommendations on the issues affecting the safety of older road users and in particular to report on –

1. The extent to which older drivers, older pedestrians and other older road users are involved in motor vehicle accidents on Victorian roads, and the factors affecting severity of crash outcome for all older road users.
2. Strategies and programs which assist older road users to retain their mobility.
3. The suitability of the current arrangements for competency and medical testing for older drivers.
4. The duration of licences issued to drivers, and the issue of restrictions, including those that can currently be placed on the licence, based on impairment of a driver’s ability to drive safely.
5. The role of health services and government and other agencies in assisting older drivers to manage the transition from driver to non-driver.
6. The mobility options available for older persons who give up driving, including public transport and the road safety implications of any alternative means of transport.
7. The need for change to legislation or statutory requirements to implement any recommendations made as a result of this inquiry.

In conducting the inquiry, the Committee is requested to seek information from Government, non-Government Agencies, the community, aged care organisations, interstate and overseas jurisdictions and public transport providers.
