CASINO RULES NOTICE NO.2 OF 2002

Rules of the Game-Blackjack

By this notice, the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority **amends** the Rules in respect of the game "Blackjack" as set out in the Schedule.

This notice operates with effect from 4.00am on 7 March 2002.

Schedule

1. New rule 28

After rule 27.2.1, insert—

28 Perfect Pairs

28.1 Where the version of Blackjack or Crown Blackjack in play incorporates "Perfect Pairs" the approved rules of Blackjack or Crown Blackjack shall apply, except where the rules are inconsistent with the rules of "Perfect Pairs", in which case the rules of "Perfect Pairs" shall prevail.

28.2 Equipment

- 28.2.1 The table cloth shall be marked in a manner similar to that shown in Diagram J with:
 - 28.2.1.1 areas for wagers, the number of betting areas being nine or less,
 - 28.2.1.2 areas for "Perfect Pairs" wagers, the number of betting areas being nine or less, and

The game of Blackjack and its rules were approved by notices published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 24 April 1997 (S44). The rules have subsequently been amended by—

- 28.2.1.3 inscriptions to the effect that:
 - 28.2.1.3.1 Blackjack pays 3 to 2.
 - 28.2.1.3.2 Depending on whether Blackjack or Crown Blackjack is in play, the Dealer must stand on 17 and must draw to a total of 16; or the Dealer must stand on hard 17 and must draw to 16 and soft 17.
 - 28.2.1.3.3 Insurance pays 2 to 1.
 - 28.2.1.3.4 "Perfect Pairs".
- 28.2.2 the name and or logo of the casino imprinted thereon.
- a table sign indicating the payout odds for winning Perfect Pairs wagers.

28.3 Additional Definitions

- 28.3.1 In these rules the following meanings apply:
 - 28.3.1.1 "Coloured pair" means 2 red cards of different suits each with the same face value or 2 black cards of different suits each with the same face value.
 - 28.3.1.2 "Mixed pair" means 1 red card and 1 black card each with the same face value.
 - 28.3.1.3 "Perfect pair" means 2 cards of the same suit with the same face value.

28.4 Wagers

- 28.4.1 Prior to the first card being dealt for each round of play, players shall be given the opportunity to place a "Perfect Pairs" wager by placing a chip/s on the appropriate area of the table layout.
- A player may place one "Perfect Pairs" wager for each valid Blackjack wager that he/she has placed.
- A player may wager on more than one Blackjack playing area and shall be entitled to place one "Perfect Pairs" wager for each valid Blackjack wager.
- 28.4.4 The cost of a "Perfect Pairs" wager shall be displayed on a sign at the table.
- 28.4.5 A "Perfect Pairs" wager shall win if the initial two cards dealt to a player(s) are a pair as described in 28.3.1.1, 28.3.1.2 or 28.3.1.3.
- 28.4.6 A "Perfect Pairs" wager shall lose if the initial two cards dealt to a player(s) hand do not comprise a pair as described in 28.3.1.1, 28.3.1.2 or 28.3.1.3.

28.5 Settlement

- 28.5.1 All Perfect Pairs wagers will be settled during the Interim Settlement prior to any winning Blackjack wagers being paid in accordance with rule 9.1.1
- 28.6 "Perfect Pairs" Payout Odds


