Kingston City Council is considering an amendment to its Environment and Amenity Local Law. Public submissions regarding the proposed amendment are now invited.

Proposed Local Law

Council proposes to make an amending local law, to be known as "Environmental and Amenity (Amendment) Local Law". The following information about the proposed local law is provided in accordance with Section 119 of the **Local Government Act 1989**.

Purpose of the Proposed Local Law

The purpose of this Local Law is to amend the Environment and Amenity Local Law in order to protect trees and vegetation within the municipal district; and provide for the peace, order and good governance of the municipal district.

General Purport of the Proposed Local Law

The proposed local law, if made, will amend Parts 1 and 8, and Schedules 1, 7 and 8 of the Principal Local Law. For example, it will make it an offence for an owner or occupier of land to allow environmental weeds to be grown on that land, and will allow Council or an authorised officer to direct such persons to remove the weeds.

It will also make it an offence to interfere with certain trees on private property, namely trees and vegetation which are listed in Council's Significant Tree and Vegetation Register, trees with a maximum trunk circumference greater than 110 cm measured at their base and multi-stemmed trees where the sum total of their exterior stems equals a combined maximum trunk circumference greater than 110cm measured at their base. In particular, a person must not remove, damage, destroy, prune, cut, trim or carry out works near such trees or vegetation, or direct, authorise or allow any such acts to be done, without a permit. The owner of private property on which such trees or vegetation are located is also guilty of an offence in these circumstances unless the owner can prove that the interference was undertaken by another party without authorisation. Council or an authorised officer may direct persons to replace a tree or vegetation that has been interfered with.

Any person affected by the proposed local law may make a submission relating to it, to the Council. 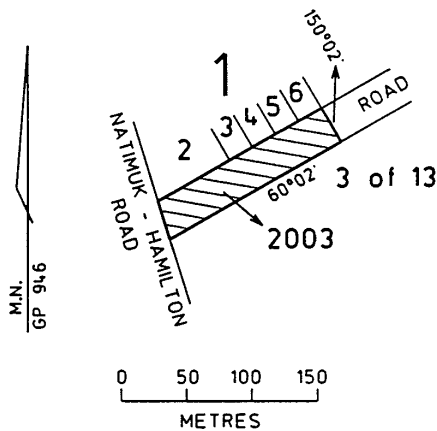
