CASINO RULES NOTICE NO. 9 OF 2002
Rules of the Game—Blackjack

By this notice, the Victorian Casino and Gaming Authority amends the Rules in respect of the game “Blackjack”¹ as set out in the Schedule.

This notice operates with effect from 4.00am on 16 April 2002.

Schedule

1. **Amendment** to rules for Magnificent Sevens.

After rule 25.5 **insert** —

25.5.1 “Magnificent Sevens” may be played according to one of two versions:

25.5.1.1 Version 1 utilising the payout schedule described in Table 1; or

25.5.1.2 Version 2 utilising the payout schedule described in Table 2.

25.5.2 Where a version of Magnificent Sevens as described in rule 25.5.1 is in play, all Magnificent Sevens tables must offer that particular version.

25.5.3 Where a decision has been made to change the version of Magnificent Sevens played, a notice conveying the change must be displayed for a reasonable period of time prior to changing from version 1 to version 2 or vice versa.

25.5.3.1 Where version 1 is in play and notice has been given that Magnificent Sevens will be played according to version 2, when the final tournament entry has been determined, the Pit Boss will notify the Shift Manager. The Shift Manager will ensure that all operational Magnificent Sevens games are closed down for a reasonable period of time prior to re-opening as version 2.

25.5.3.1.1 In the event that no tournament entries have been determined and providing that a notice conveying the intention to change to version 2 has been displayed according to 25.5.3, a Shift Manager or above may specify a time whereby all tables must commence playing the game according to version 2.

25.5.3.2 Where version 2 is in play and notice has been given that Magnificent Sevens will be played according to version 1, a time and date will be nominated at which point the game will be played according to version 1.
