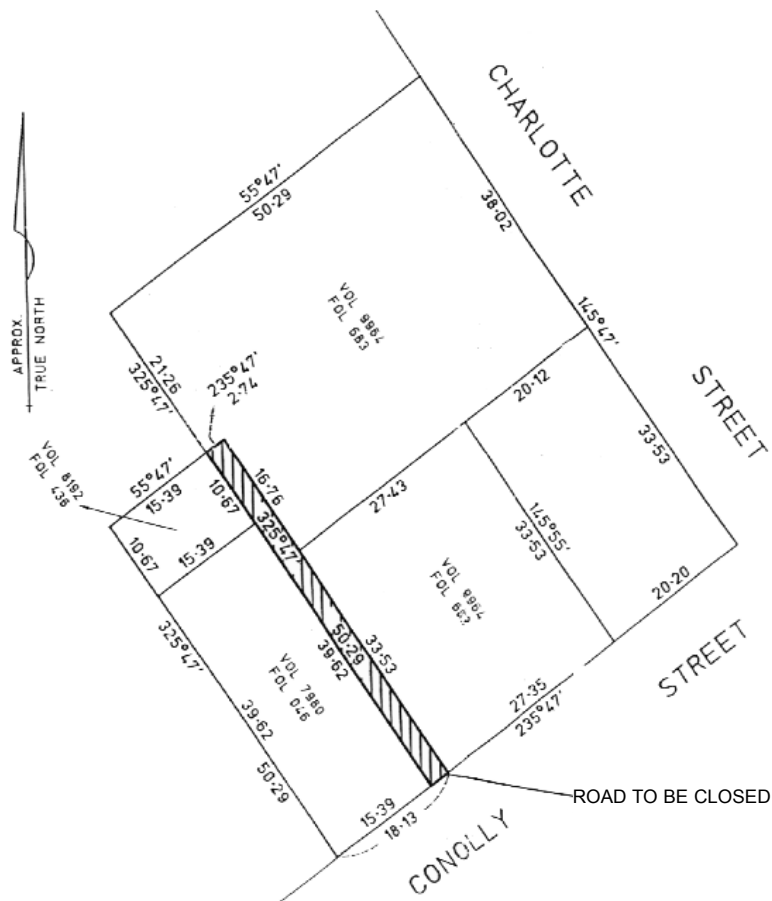

STRATHBOGIE SHIRE COUNCIL

Amendment to Local Law No. 1
– Meeting Procedures and Common Seal

The abovementioned Local Law provides a framework for the conduct of Council meetings and use of Council's Common Seal. It is proposed that the Local Law be amended to extend the period for notice of meeting for an Ordinary Meeting from at least 48 hours to at least 6 days.

The proposed amendment was approved by Council at its meeting of 16 April 2002.

- updates the comments of the "key features" of Wallan;
- identifies the intention of Council to improve the amenity of the commercial area in Wandong/Heathcote Junction and improve the linkages between the commercial area and the balance of the township;
- updates the Structure Plans for each of the townships;
- inserts a section into the Town Strategy for Seymour identifying the potential for a neighbourhood renewal program of the public housing areas;
- inserts additional implementation measures in the Policy on Hilltop and Ridgeline Protection;

Medical Practice Act 1994

Nurses Act 1993

On 18 April 2002, a panel appointed by the Nurses Board of Victoria, found that Carolyn Ynys Newport, identification number 100214, registered in division 2, had engaged in unprofessional conduct of a serious nature.

The panel determined that:

1. Pursuant to s.48(1)(e) **Nurses Act 1993**, the following conditions, limitations or restrictions be imposed on the nurse's registration, and remain there until removed pursuant to paragraphs 2 and 3 of this determination.
 - (a) The nurse must undergo consultations and counselling with a psychiatrist or psychologist ("counsellor") chosen by agreement between the nurse and the Board, such consultations to commence by 21 June 2002, and to occur at least once a month or more often if the counsellor so recommends, for at least 12 months.
 - (b) Within one month of the anniversary of the first consultation undertaken in compliance with the condition imposed pursuant to sub-paragraph (a), the nurse must provide the Board with a report from the counsellor of the consultations and counselling, which report must be satisfactory to the Board.
 - (c) Within seven months of obtaining regular employment as a registered nurse with a health services establishment or a registered funded agency, as those terms are defined in s. 3 **Health Services Act 1988**, the nurse must provide the Board with an appraisal from her employer of her performance during the first six months of that employment, which appraisal must be satisfactory to the Board.
2. After receipt of a satisfactory report from the counsellor in compliance with the condition imposed pursuant to paragraph 1(b) of this determination, the Board must revoke the conditions, limitations and restrictions imposed on the nurse's registration pursuant to sub-paragraphs 1(a) and (b) of this determination.
3. After receipt of a satisfactory appraisal report from the nurse's employer in

compliance with the condition imposed pursuant to sub-paragraph 1(c) of this determination, the Board must revoke the condition, limitation or restriction imposed on the nurse's registration pursuant to that sub-paragraph.

4. Pursuant to s. 48(2)(d) of the Act, the nurse be required to undertake, and satisfactorily complete by 30 June 2003, further education in professional ethics for nurses, the course and institution at which the education is to be undertaken to be approved in writing by the Board before tuition commences.

REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

Freedom of Information (Access Charges) (Amendment) Regulations 2002

A Regulatory Impact Statement has been prepared in relation to the proposed Freedom of Information (Access Charges) (Amendment) Regulations 2002.

The proposed Regulations amend the Freedom of Information (Access Charges) Regulations 1993 to include maximum fees for two forms of access to health information provided under the **Health Records Act 2001**. These two forms of access are:

- The provision of explanations of health information:
 - by public sector organisations that are health service providers. The maximum fee is \$25 per quarter hour (or part of a quarter hour) spent giving the explanation, or \$80, whichever is the lesser; and
 - by private health service providers of health information held by public sector organisations that are not health service providers. The maximum fee is the usual fee of the suitably qualified health service provider for a consultation of a comparable duration.
- The provision of an accurate summary of health information where the summary does not exist before the request is made. The maximum fee is \$25 per quarter hour (or part of a quarter hour) spent in preparing the

summary, or \$80, whichever is the lesser.

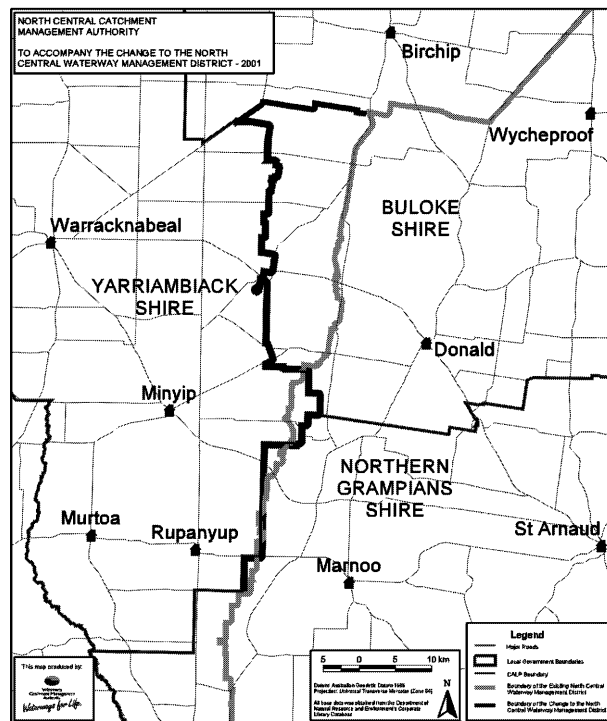
