Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995

ORDER REQUIRING PERSONS RECEIVING SPECIFIED PLANT MATERIALS FROM INTERSTATE TO BE IN POSSESSION OF CERTIFICATION

I, Sherryl Garbutt, Acting Minister for Agriculture, make the following Order-

1 Objective

The objective of this Order is to minimise the risk of exotic pests and diseases entering Victoria by requiring persons who receive certain plants, plant products, equipment and packages from interstate to have in their possession at the time of delivery of the material the appropriate certification.

2 Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 24 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995.

3 Commencement

This Order comes into operation on 30 June 2002.

4 Definitions

In this Order—

"agricultural equipment" means any machinery, hand tools, equipment or vehicle used for propagating, cultivating, spraying, harvesting, handling, packing, transporting or marketing of specified materials;

"agricultural machinery" means any machinery, equipment or vehicle used for cultivating, spraying, harvesting, processing, packing and transporting of specified materials;

"containerised plant" means plant in a container in potting media or soil or with potting media or soil attached;

"package" means any package used for propagating, harvesting, packing, marketing or transporting specified materials and includes any box, pot, bin, crate or pallet;

"plant cutting" means any stem of a plant with leaves;

"plant mulch" means any organic mulch, potting media, hay and straw;

"specified materials" means the materials specified in column 2 of the schedule;

"the Act" means the Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995;

"the Regulations" means the Plant Health and Plant Product Regulations 1995;

"used container" means any container which contains or is known to have contained or may reasonably be suspected of containing or having contained specified materials and includes bins, crates and pallets used for harvesting, packing or transporting specified materials.

5 Requirement to possess certification

A person must not-

(a) import, introduce or bring into Victoria materials specified in column 2 of the schedule that are hosts of or have the potential to spread the exotic pests and diseases specified in column 1 of the schedule opposite those materials from a State or Territory or a part of a State or Territory specified in column 3 of the schedule opposite those materials; or

(b) cause or permit any of the things in paragraph (a) to be done—

unless the person has in his or her possession at the time the materials are delivered to the person in Victoria a copy of—

- (i) an assurance certificate; or
- (ii) a plant health certificate; or
- (iii) a plant health declaration.
