1. Citation

This Order may be cited as the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003.

2. Application

This Order comes into operation on 30 June 2002.

3. Calculation of Premium

The methods to be used in calculating the premiums payable by employers for WorkCover insurance policies in force in respect of policy periods commencing on and after 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2002 and before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 are specified in clauses 4 to 10 and 13 to 15 and Schedules 1 to 8 of this Order.

4. Basic Formula

The premium payable by an employer for a WorkCover insurance policy referred to in clause 3 must, subject to Schedules 5 and 6, be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$P = (WP + B - Q - S) \times G$$

where-

P is the premium payable by an employer in respect of a policy period to which this Order relates;

WP is the WorkCover Premium referred to in clause 5;

B is the Buy-out Premium referred to in clause 7, if any;

Q is the Recovery Rebate, if any, in accordance with clause 8;

S is the Stabilisation Reduction, if applicable, calculated in accordance with clause 15;

G is 1.1

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***5. WorkCover Premium**

The WorkCover Premium of an employer is the amount derived by obtaining the sum of the premium for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer and multiplying that result by 1.17, where the premium for a period of coverage of a workplace is determined in accordance with the following formula:

$W \times PR$
where -

W is the assessable remuneration paid or payable to workers engaged in operations at the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace, calculated in accordance with Schedule 4;

PR is the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage calculated in accordance with clause 6.

6. WorkCover Premium Rate

(1) The WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage is calculated –

- (a) if the workplace is a start-up workplace, as IR; or
 (b) subject to sub-clauses (7), (8), (9), (10) and (11) and clause 14, if T for the employer or, if sub-clause (6) applies, for the relevant group of employers, has a value such that $T \times \frac{365}{N}$ is equal to

or less than \$1,000,000 and if, for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, WP for the employer was determined in accordance with Schedule 5 to that Order, as PR_M ; or

- (c) subject to sub-clauses (7), (8), (9), (10) and (11) and clause 14, if T for the employer or, if sub-clause (6) applies, for the relevant group of employers, has a value such that $T \times \frac{365}{N}$ is equal to or less than

\$1,000,000 and if, for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, WP for the employer was determined other than in accordance with Schedule 5 to that Order, in accordance with the following formula:

$$PR = \frac{\text{Base Premium}_I}{V_I} \quad ; \text{ or}$$

$$\frac{\text{Base Premium}_{IC}}{V_{IC}} \quad (\text{if that fraction is able to be calculated and gives a lesser rate}); \text{ or}$$

- (d) in all other cases,

(i) in accordance with the following formula:

$$PR = [(1 - Z) \times R] + (Z \times E); \text{ or}$$

(ii) as 10% of IR

whichever is the greater,

where –

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

- IR is the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 for the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace;
- T is the sum of the rateable remuneration payable by the employer or, if sub-clause (6) applies, by all employers who are members of the relevant group, to workers in respect of all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer or, if sub-clause (6) applies, of the relevant group of employers;
- N is the number of days of the policy period;
- PR_M is –
- (a) unless paragraph (b) applies, the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period which applies for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiration of that policy period; or
 - (b) the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period which applies for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after that policy period has expired if that WorkCover Premium Rate is less than the WorkCover Premium Rate referred to in paragraph (a);

$$\text{Base Premium}_1 \text{ is } \left(\frac{\text{PM}_1}{\text{SPM}_1} \right) \times \left(\frac{\text{WP}_1}{1.17} \right)$$

where –

- PM₁ is the premium for the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;
- SPM₁ is the amount derived by obtaining the sum of the premium for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;
- WP₁ is the value of the symbol WP for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 used in calculating the premium or adjusted premium in respect of the preceding policy period payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

$$\text{Base Premium}_{1C} \text{ is } \left(\frac{\text{PM}_{1C}}{\text{SPM}_{1C}} \right) \times \left(\frac{\text{WP}_{1C}}{1.17} \right)$$

where -

- PM_{1C} is the premium for the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after that policy period had expired;
- SPM_{1C} is the amount derived by obtaining the sum of the premium for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after that policy period had expired;
- WP_{1C} is the value of the symbol WP for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 used in calculating any adjusted premium in respect of the preceding policy period payable after that policy period had expired;
- V_1 is the value of the symbol W for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period for the purposes of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 used in calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;
- V_{1C} is the value of the symbol W for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period for the purposes of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 used in calculating any adjusted premium in respect of that policy period payable after that policy period had expired;
- Z is the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor for the employer calculated in accordance with Schedule 2;
- R is the prior rate for the workplace, being –
- (a) if there was no WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period, the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 for the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace; or
 - (b) in all other cases where sub-clause (1)(d) applies, $\text{PR}_1 \times \frac{\text{IR}}{\text{IR}_1}$.

where -

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

PR_1 is –

- (a) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was not a period of coverage of one or more predecessor workplaces, the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of that period of coverage; or
- (b) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of one or more predecessor workplaces, the average of PR_p for all predecessor workplaces weighted by the remuneration of the predecessor workplaces in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period, where PR_p is determined in accordance with sub-clause (4);

IR is the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 for the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace;

IR_1 is –

- (a) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was not a period of coverage of one or more predecessor workplaces, the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 for the workplace during that period of coverage; or
- (b) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of one or more predecessor workplaces, the average of the industry rates, within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 in respect of the last period of coverage of the predecessor workplaces in the preceding policy period, for all predecessor workplaces, weighted by the remuneration of the predecessor workplaces in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period;

E is the Experience Factor, calculated in accordance with Schedule 3;

- (2) For the purposes of this clause, a workplace is a start-up workplace if-
 - (a) the employer commences operations at the workplace on or after 1 July 2002; or
 - (b) the employer had commenced operations at the workplace before 1 July 2002 and, had not, before 1 July 2002, obtained a WorkCover insurance policy from an authorised insurer or

the Authority or been registered under section 197 of the Act and liable to pay levy under Part VII of the Act-

but not if the workplace has a predecessor which is not a start-up workplace under this sub-clause.

- (3) For the purposes of this clause, but only to the extent necessary to calculate the premium and any adjusted premium payable before the expiration of the policy period for which the premium is to be calculated, a workplace is a start-up workplace if T for the employer or, if sub-clause (6) applies, for the relevant group of employers, has a value such that $T \times \frac{365}{N}$ is greater than \$1,000,000 (where T and N have the same meaning as in sub-clause (1)) and-
- (a) the workplace was a start-up workplace within the meaning of clause 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 and the WorkCover premium rates for the workplace in respect of all periods of coverage coming within the 2001/2002 policy period are calculated in accordance with clause 6(1)(a) of that Order; or
 - (b) the employer commences operations at the workplace on or after 1 July 2002 and all predecessors of that workplace were start-up workplaces within the meaning of clause 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 and the WorkCover premium rates for those workplaces in respect of all periods of coverage coming within the 2001/2002 policy period are calculated in accordance with clause 6(1)(a) of that Order.
- (4) For the purposes of the definition of R in sub-clause (1), unless the Authority or authorised agent makes a determination under sub-clause (5), PR_p is the WorkCover Premium Rate for the predecessor workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the predecessor workplace in the preceding policy period.
- (5) If during the last period of coverage of the predecessor workplace in the preceding policy period, the predecessor workplace was not a workplace of the employer but was the workplace of another employer (in this sub-clause called "the predecessor employer"), on application by the employer and if the employer satisfies the Authority or authorised agent –
- (a) that the circumstances on which the application is based do not exist because of an arrangement, transaction, undertaking or act entered into or carried out with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable under this Order, and
 - (b) if the employer is a corporation and the predecessor employer was a corporation, that, at the time when the employer commenced operations at the workplace, the employer was not related, within the meaning of section 66 of the WorkCover Insurance Act, to the corporation which was the predecessor employer –

the Authority or authorised agent may determine that PR_p' is $[(1-Z) \times IR_p] + [Z \times PR_p]$, where –

- PR_p is the WorkCover Premium Rate for the predecessor workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the predecessor workplace in the preceding policy period;
- IR_p is the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 for the predecessor workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the predecessor workplace in the preceding policy period; and
- Z is the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor for the employer calculated in accordance with Schedule 2.

- (6) Unless two or more employers who are members of a group within the meaning of section 67 of the WorkCover Insurance Act are carrying on operations that are independent and unconnected and are not carried on with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable under this Order, for the purposes of sub-clause (1)(b) and (c) and sub-clause (3), the value of T may be calculated with reference to the rateable remuneration payable by all of the employers who are members of the group in the manner specified in the definition of T in sub-clause (1).
- (7) For the purposes of sub-clause (1)(b) and (c), if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of one or more predecessor workplaces, those paragraphs apply -
- (a) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of a single predecessor workplace, as if the references in paragraphs (b) and (c) and in the definitions of Base Premium_{1c} and Base Premium₁ to “the employer” in relation to the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, were references to the employer of whom or which the predecessor workplace was a workplace; and
- (b) if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of more than one predecessor workplace -
- (i) as if the references in paragraphs (b) and (c) and in the definitions of Base Premium_{1c} and Base Premium₁ to “the employer” in relation to the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, were references to the employer of whom or which each predecessor workplace was a workplace; and

- (ii) so as to provide a calculated WorkCover premium rate with reference to the last period of coverage of each predecessor workplace in the preceding policy period.
- (8) If sub-clause (7)(b) applies, the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage is calculated as the average of the WorkCover premium rates referred to in sub-clause (7)(b)(ii) weighted by the remuneration of the predecessor workplaces in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period.
- (9) For the purposes of sub-clause (1)(b) and (c), if the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period was a period of coverage of a predecessor workplace which was not a workplace of the employer but was the workplace of another employer (in this sub-clause called “the predecessor employer”), on application by the employer and if the employer satisfies the Authority solely -
- (a) that the circumstances on which the application is based do not exist because of an arrangement, transaction, undertaking or act entered into or carried out with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable under this Order; and
 - (b) if the employer is a corporation and the predecessor employer was a corporation, that at the time when the employer commenced operations at the workplace, the employer was not related, within the meaning of section 66 of the WorkCover Insurance Act, to the corporation which was the predecessor employer -

the Authority solely may determine that the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage is to be calculated in accordance with the formula $[(1 - Z) \times IR] + [Z \times PR_D]$, where -

- PR_D is the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage calculated in accordance with sub-clause 1(b) or (c) (as the case may be) in the absence of the application of this sub-clause and any application of sub-clause (10);
- IR is the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 for the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace; and
- Z is the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor for the employer calculated in accordance with Schedule 2.

- (10) For the purposes of sub-clause (1)(b) and (c), if the industry classification of the workplace in the period of coverage of the workplace is different from the industry classification within the meaning of the relevant premiums order of the workplace in the reference period of coverage of the workplace, the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

period of coverage is

$$PR_s \times \frac{IR}{IR_{REF}}$$

where –

PR_s is the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the period of coverage calculated in accordance with sub-clause (1)(b) or (c) or sub-clause (9) (as the case may be) in the absence of the application of this sub-clause;

IR is the industry rate within the meaning of item 8 of Schedule 1 for the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace; and

IR_{REF} is the industry rate within the meaning of the relevant premiums order for the workplace during the reference period of coverage.

(11) In sub-clause (10), “the reference period of coverage” means –

(a) if the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period is calculated in accordance with clause 6(1)(b) or (c) of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, the period of coverage identified by the expression “the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period” as that expression is used for the purposes of those paragraphs;

or

(b) in all other cases, the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period.

7. Buy-out Premium

The Buy-out Premium for an employer is -

(a) if the employer elects under section 125A (6) of the Act to eliminate the excess under section 125A (3), calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$B = WP \times 0.25; \text{ or}$$

(b) in any other case, 0.

8. Recovery Rebate

(1) The Recovery Rebate for an employer is -

$$(\text{sum of } K_c) \times Z \times F_R$$

where -

K_c is a recovery amount calculated in accordance with sub-clauses (2) and (3)

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

Z is the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor for the employer calculated in accordance with Schedule 2

F_R is the number determined in accordance with sub-clause (4).

(2) A recovery amount is, subject to sub-clause (3), the sum of all recoveries made -

- (a) in respect of a claim the cost of which has been used in the calculation of the Experience Factor E for a period of coverage of a workplace of the employer for the purposes of calculating the premium payable by the employer for a WorkCover insurance policy in accordance with a previous premiums order; and
- (b) by the Authority or an authorised agent during the policy period referred to in clause 3 in respect of which the employer's WorkCover insurance policy is in force -

which have not been used, and are not eligible to be used, in the calculation of the cost of the relevant claim for the purposes of this or any previous premiums order.

(3) (a) If a recovery amount calculated in accordance with sub-clause (2) exceeds the relevant maximum amount calculated in accordance with this sub-clause, the recovery amount is deemed to be that maximum amount.

(b) The maximum amount in respect of any recovery is -

$$\frac{(C_{OR} + C_{IR} + C_{2R})}{3}$$

to calculate a Recovery Rebate for the employer in respect of the relevant claim where, subject to paragraph (c) -

C_{OR} , C_{IR} and C_{2R} are respectively the cost of the relevant claim used in the calculation of C_0 , C_1 and C_2 for the purposes of calculating the Experience Factor E for the last period of coverage of a workplace of the employer in a policy period for the purposes of calculating the premium payable by the employer for a WorkCover insurance policy in accordance with a previous premiums order.

(c) If, in calculating any premium referred to in paragraph (b), WP for the employer was determined in accordance with Schedule 5 to the relevant premiums order, the value of C_{OR} , C_{IR} or C_{2R} (as is applicable) is deemed to be zero.

(4) F_R is -

- (a) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer, 1.000000; and
- (b) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003, such number as is

determined solely by the Authority and notified in the Government Gazette.

- (5) (a) In sub-clause (2)(a), the reference to a WorkCover insurance policy does not include any such policy in force before a WorkCover insurance policy of the employer has been cancelled where the employer has ceased as an employer if the employer's WorkCover insurance policy referred to in sub-clause (2)(b) was in force at any time after such cancellation.
- (b) In sub-clause (2)(b), the reference to the employer's WorkCover insurance policy means the policy the premium for which is being calculated in accordance with this Order.
- (6) This clause only applies -
 - (a) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer or any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003; and
 - (b) if the employer has, in accordance with section 23 of the WorkCover Insurance Act, provided the Authority with a certified statement of rateable remuneration paid or payable by the employer to workers employed by the employer during the policy period in respect of which the adjusted premium is to be calculated.
- (7) Notwithstanding Item 11 of Schedule 1, if, after a recovery has been made by the Authority or an authorised agent, a Court determines, or the Authority or the authorised agent agrees, that there was no legal entitlement to the recovery or any part thereof, and the value of that recovery or part is returned to the person from whom or which the recovery was made, the relevant adjusted premium referred to in sub-clause (6)(a) must be calculated, or a further adjusted premium must be calculated, as if the recovery or part had not been made.

9. Rounding

- (1) All rates and factors are to be calculated to 6 decimal places.
- (2) The WorkCover Premium, Buy-out Premium, Recovery Rebate and Stabilisation Reduction are to be rounded down to the nearest cent.
- (3) The premium payable by an employer, P, is to be rounded to the nearest cent.
- (4) The costs of claims are to be calculated to the nearest dollar.

10. Determinations and calculations

Unless otherwise expressly stated, any determination or calculation required to be made for the purpose of calculating a premium under this Order is to be made by the Authority or, if relevantly appointed to act on behalf of the Authority, by an authorised agent.

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***11. Registration Fee**

The registration fee for an employer pursuant to section 58 of the WorkCover Insurance Act is \$135.

12. Exemption Limit

For the purposes of paragraph (b) of the definition of “exemption limit” in section 3 (1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act, the amount prescribed in respect of the financial year ending 30 June 2003 is \$7500.

13. Payment of Premium and Discounts

The premium payable by an employer is to be paid and the amount of the premium payable by an employer is to be discounted in accordance with Schedule 7.

14. Stabilisation Adjustment

- (1) For the purposes of clause 6 of this Order, if the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period is calculated in accordance with clause 6(1)(b) or (c) of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002, clause 6(1)(b) and (c), (9), (10) and (11) of this Order apply as if the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 had been made with the modifications set out in sub-clause (3) and all relevant references in clause 6 of this Order to the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 and expressions used in that Order are to be construed accordingly.
- (2) To the extent that the operation of Schedule 6 requires the use of a WorkCover Premium Rate for a workplace in respect of a period of coverage the calculation of which –
 - (a) is made in accordance with clause 6(1)(b) or (c) or (9) or (10) of this Order; and
 - (b) is governed by sub-clause (1) –

Schedule 6 applies as if the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 had been made with the modifications set out in sub-clause (3) and all relevant references in that Schedule to the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 and expressions used in that Order are to be construed accordingly.

- (3) The modifications to the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 referred to in sub-clauses (1) and (2) are –
 - (a) In clause 6(1)(c) of that Order, for the expression

“PR = $\frac{\text{Base Premium}}{V_1}$ ”, substitute -

“PR = $\frac{\text{Base Premium}_1}{V_1}$ ”; or

Base Premium_{IC}

V_{IC} (if that fraction is able to be calculated and gives a lesser rate)";

- (b) In clause 6(1) of that Order, for the definition of "PR_M", **substitute** –

"PR_M is –

- (a) unless paragraph (b) applies, the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period which applies for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiration of that policy period; or
- (b) the WorkCover Premium Rate for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period which applies for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after that policy period has expired if that WorkCover Premium Rate is less than the WorkCover Premium Rate referred to in paragraph (a);";

- (c) In clause 6(1) of that Order, for the definition of "Base Premium", **substitute** -

"Base Premium_I is $\left(\frac{PM_I}{SPM_I}\right) \times \left(\frac{WP_I}{1.17}\right)$

where –

PM_I is the premium for the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;

SPM_I is the amount derived by obtaining the sum of the premium for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 for the purposes of calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

WP_1 is the value of the symbol WP for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 used in calculating the premium or adjusted premium in respect of the preceding policy period payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;

Base
Premium_{1c} is $\left(\frac{PM_{1c}}{SPM_{1c}}\right) \times \left(\frac{WP_{1c}}{1.17}\right)$

where –

PM_{1c} is the premium for the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after that policy period had expired;

SPM_{1c} is the amount derived by obtaining the sum of the premium for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer in the preceding policy period determined in accordance with clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium or payable after that policy period had expired;

WP_{1c} is the value of the symbol WP for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 used in calculating any adjusted premium in respect of the preceding policy period payable after that policy period had expired;”;

(d) In clause 6(1) of that Order, for the definition of “ V_1 ”, **substitute -**

“ V_1 is the value of the symbol W for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage of the workplace in the preceding policy period for the purposes of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 used in calculating the premium or adjusted premium payable immediately before the expiry of that policy period;

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

V_{ic} is the value of the symbol W for the workplace in respect of the last period of coverage in the preceding policy period for the purposes of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.8) 2000/2001 used in calculating any adjusted premium in respect of that policy period payable after that policy period had expired;”.

15 Stabilisation Reduction

- (1) This clause applies if –
 - (a) the calculation, in accordance with clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002, of the premium payable by the employer for a WorkCover insurance policy referred to in clause 3 of that Order requires the use of a WorkCover Premium Rate for a workplace in respect of the last period of coverage in the policy period ending at 4.00 pm on 30 June 2002 which is calculated in accordance with clause 6(1)(b) or (c) of that Order; and
 - (b) the premium so calculated (in this clause called “the calculated premium”) is greater than the premium payable by the employer for the WorkCover insurance policy which would have been calculated in accordance with clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No.9) 2001/2002 if that Order had been made with the modifications set out in clause 14(3) (in this clause called the “notional premium”).
- (2) If this clause applies, S is an amount equivalent to the difference between the calculated premium and the notional premium.

SCHEDULES
SCHEDULE 1
INTERPRETATION

1. General

In this Order-

“authorised agent” means a person appointed as an authorised agent under section 32 of the Act as in force before 1 December 1992 or a person appointed as an authorised agent under section 23 of the Act as in force on and after that date;

“establishment” has the same meaning as in section 181 of the Act as in force before the commencement of section 78 of the **Accident Compensation (Amendment) Act 1994**;

“period of coverage” means the period during a policy period for which a workplace remains in the same industry classification;

“policy” means a WorkCover insurance policy;

“policy period” has the same meaning as in section 3 (1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act;

“rateable remuneration”, except where expressly stated to the contrary, -

- (a) has the same meaning as in section 3 (1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act; and,
- (b) if used in relation to a period, has the meaning which applied under section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act in respect of that period;

“recovery” means-

- (a) an amount of money recovered by or on behalf of the Authority in relation to a claim other than a TAC claim from a person other than the employer; or
- (b) an amount of money recovered by or on behalf of the Authority in relation to a TAC claim from a person other than the employer or the Transport Accident Commission; or
- (c) in the case of a TAC claim in respect of an injury or death which the Authority or the authorised agent has determined was caused under circumstances creating in a person, other than the employer or a person for whose acts or omissions the employer is or may be vicariously liable, a legal liability to pay damages in respect of the injury or death, 50% of the amount of money recovered by the Authority from the Transport Accident Commission in respect of that injury or death-

but, for the purposes of clause 8, does not include any such amount recovered as the consequence of an overpayment of compensation to any person;

“TAC claim” means a claim in respect of an injury or death for which compensation is required under the Act to be paid and which arises out of a transport accident within the meaning of section 3 of the **Transport Accident Act 1986** on or after 1 July 2000;

“the Act” means the **Accident Compensation Act 1985**;

“the WorkCover Insurance Act” means the **Accident Compensation (WorkCover Insurance) Act 1993**.

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***1A. References to the Authority**

In this Order, notwithstanding any specific references to authorised agents, a reference to the Authority, unless the reference is specified as a reference solely to the Authority, and unless it would be inconsistent with the context or subject matter, includes an authorised agent appointed to act on behalf of the Authority in respect of the relevant matter.

2. Workplace

- (1) “Workplace”, in relation to an employer, means an area, or two or more contiguous areas, of land in Victoria occupied by an employer where workers employed by the employer work or through which such workers pass in the course of their employment, whether or not workers employed by another employer also work or pass through that area or those areas in the course of their employment.
- (2) For the purposes of sub-item (1), two or more areas of land are contiguous if they are within the same building or are separated only by a road or railway or other similar area across or around which movement is reasonably possible.
- (3) If workers employed by an employer are engaged in operations that are not carried on in a workplace of that employer within the meaning of sub-item (1), those operations shall be deemed to be carried on in the workplace where or from which those operations are managed or controlled or, if there is no such workplace, the place determined to be the workplace in respect of those operations.
- (4) If workers employed by an employer who is a member of a group within the meaning of section 67 of the WorkCover Insurance Act are not engaged in operations at a workplace of that employer but are engaged in operations at a workplace of another employer who is a member of the group, the second-mentioned workplace shall be deemed to be the workplace of the first-mentioned employer for the purposes of this Order.
- (5) Unless two or more employers who are members of a group within the meaning of section 67 of the WorkCover Insurance Act and are carrying out their operations from two or more neighbouring workplaces are carrying out operations that are independent and unconnected and are not carried on with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable under this Order, the Authority solely may determine that two or more such neighbouring workplaces shall be deemed to be one workplace for the purposes of determining the predominant activity and the relevant industry rate.
- (6) Any reference to workplace includes any predecessor workplace of the workplace in accordance with item 6.
- (7) A reference to workplace includes, where applicable, a reference to an establishment within the meaning of Part VII of the Act as in force prior to 1 July 1993 which corresponds to the workplace.

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***3. Predominant Activity**

- (1) “Predominant activity” in relation to a workplace of an employer means the activity of the employer that, during such period as is determined in accordance with clause 10, is the activity of the employer which contributes or is likely to contribute more than any other activity to the value of goods or services or goods and services produced or provided by the employer from operations carried on in the workplace.
- (2) In determining the predominant activity in relation to a workplace, regard must be had to, but must not be limited by, measures of activity during the preceding period of 12 months or less consisting of data relating to sales, cost of goods produced, cost of labour or gross profit, taken from -
 - (a) a statement prepared and signed by a registered company auditor, accountant or tax agent; or
 - (b) where an employer did not engage a registered company auditor, accountant or tax agent during the period to which the information refers, a return by the employer.
- (3) Subject to sub-items (4) and (5), if, at a workplace of an employer that comprises two or more contiguous areas, the predominant activity carried on at each of those areas is different, the Authority or an authorised agent may in accordance with clause 10 determine that each of those areas is a workplace of that employer for the purposes of this Order.
- (4) Unless sub-item (6) or sub-item (8) applies, sub-item (3) does not apply in relation to a contiguous area if –
 - (a) the predominant activity carried on at that area is wholly or mainly dependent on, or occurs wholly or mainly as a consequence of, or is wholly or mainly ancillary to, the predominant activity carried on at one or more other contiguous areas; or
 - (b) the goods or services or goods and services produced or provided by the employer from operations carried on in the area are wholly or mainly produced or provided (as the case may be) for the use or purposes of, or to support the operations carried on in, one or more other contiguous areas.
- (5) Without derogating from sub-item (4), unless sub-item (6) or sub-item (8) applies, sub-item (3) does not apply in relation to a contiguous area if the predominant activity carried on at that area comes within one or more of the following categories of services and is carried on wholly or mainly in relation to the operations carried on in one or more other contiguous areas –
 - (a) clerical services;
 - (b) management services;
 - (c) administrative services;
 - (d) sales and marketing services;
 - (e) warehousing services associated with manufacturing, wholesaling or retailing.

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

- (6) Notwithstanding sub-items (4) and (5), if, at a workplace of an employer that comprises two or more contiguous areas –
- (a) either I6185T – Corporate Head Office Administration, Private Sector or I6186V - Corporate Head Office Administration, Public Sector is the WorkCover industry classification in Schedule 8 to which the predominant activity for the employer at a contiguous area corresponds (but not if either classification is the WorkCover industry classification to which such predominant activity merely most closely corresponds);
- and
- (b) at least one of the workplaces of the employer for which that contiguous area is engaged in corporate administration is not one of the contiguous areas which comprise the first mentioned workplace –

whether or not that contiguous area is to be treated as a separate workplace is to be determined in accordance with sub-item (3) without regard to sub-item (4) or sub-item (5).

- (7) For the purposes of sub-item (6)(b), the expression “at least one of the workplaces of the employer” includes an area, or two or more contiguous areas, of land outside Victoria but within Australia, not otherwise a workplace for the purposes of this Order, occupied by the employer where workers employed by the employer work or through which such workers pass in the course of their employment, whether or not workers employed by another employer also work or pass through that area or those areas in the course of their employment.
- (8) Notwithstanding sub-items (4) and (5), if a contiguous area has been, before 4 June 2002, determined to be a separate workplace under Item 3(3) of Schedule 1 to a previous premiums order, whether or not that area is to be treated as a separate workplace for the purposes of this Order is to be determined in accordance with sub-item (3) without regard to sub-item (4) or sub-item (5).

4. Employer with two or more workplaces

- (1) Unless the Authority or an authorised agent determines otherwise in accordance with clause 10, if a worker is engaged in operations at two or more workplaces of an employer and the remuneration paid or payable to the worker in respect of operations in each workplace is not identified, the proportion of the remuneration attributable to each workplace is the same proportion as the number of hours during which the worker is engaged in operations in the workplace is of the total number of hours during which the worker is engaged in operations in those workplaces.
- (2) If an employer has two or more workplaces and it is not reasonably possible to determine the proportion of the remuneration paid or payable by the employer that is attributable to each workplace, the Authority or an authorised agent may, in accordance with clause 10, subject to such terms and conditions as it determines, authorise the employer to pay premium on the basis of estimates of the proportion.

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***5. *Workplaces of employer may be grouped***

If the predominant activities carried on at two or more workplaces of an employer are of the same kind any of those workplaces may be determined to be one workplace unless the determination would result in the calculation of the premium or an adjusted premium payable by the employer in an amount different from the amount which would have been calculated in accordance with this Order if the determination had not been made.

6. *Predecessor*

A workplace is the predecessor of another workplace if the predominant activity that was being carried on in the former is being carried on, in substance, in the latter and in succession to the former, notwithstanding that, when carried on in the former, it may have been carried on by a different employer or at a different physical location or both.

7. *Industry Classification*

The industry to which a workplace is classified for an employer is the WorkCover industry classification in Schedule 8 to which the predominant activity for that employer at that workplace corresponds or most closely corresponds.

8. *Industry rate*

- (1) The relevant industry rate for a workplace is -
 - (a) the rate per centum per annum in Schedule 8 corresponding to the relevant WorkCover industry classification in that Schedule; or
 - (b) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired, where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003, the rate per centum per annum determined solely by the Authority and notified in the Government Gazette corresponding to the relevant WorkCover industry classification in Schedule 8.
- (2) For the purposes of sub-item (1)(b), if the rate per centum per annum determined by the Authority is the same as the rate per centum per annum in Schedule 8 corresponding to the relevant WorkCover industry classification in that Schedule, the rate determined by the Authority is deemed to have been sufficiently notified in the Government Gazette if the Notice relevantly complies with sub-item (3) or (4).
- (3) If all rates per centum per annum determined by the Authority for the purposes of sub-item (1)(b) are the same as the rates per centum per annum in Schedule 8 corresponding to the relevant WorkCover industry classifications in that Schedule, it is sufficient for the purposes of sub-item (2) if the Notice states that fact without further elaboration.

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

- (4) In all other cases, it is sufficient for the purposes of sub-item (2) if the Notice identifies by reference to the relevant classification class numbers (either specifically or as coming within a range or one of a number of ranges) all those WorkCover industry classifications in Schedule 8 the rate per centum per annum for which determined by the Authority is the same as the rate per centum per annum in that Schedule and states that the rates so determined are the same as the rates in the Schedule for the corresponding classifications.

9. Determination of rateable remuneration

- (1) For the purposes of this Order the rateable remuneration paid or payable by an employer to workers engaged in operations at a workplace may be determined having regard to -
 - (a) except as provided in paragraph (b) any relevant estimate or assessment provided or made under the WorkCover Insurance Act; or
 - (b) a relevant certified statement of rateable remuneration provided or, if this is not provided as required, a relevant assessment made under section 23 of the WorkCover Insurance Act.
- (2) For the purposes of this Order, rateable remuneration paid or payable by the contractor in respect of workers under a relevant contract under section 9 or 10 of the Act does not include remuneration in respect of which the principal is liable under section 9 or 10 to pay premium.

10. Grouping of Employers

Unless two or more employers who are members of a group within the meaning of section 67 of the WorkCover Insurance Act are carrying out operations that are independent and unconnected and are not carried on with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable under this Order the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor and the assessable remuneration for the premium payable by each of those employers may be calculated with reference to all workplaces of all of the members of that group in the manner specified in Schedules 2 and 4 respectively.

11. Recoveries

- (1) For the purposes of this Order, a recovery referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) of the definition of "recovery" in Item 1 is taken to have been made when the amount of the recovery is received by the Authority or the authorised agent (as the case requires) or when a decision is made by the Authority or the authorised agent to set off an amount equivalent to the amount of the recovery against the amount of the recovery.
- (2) For the purposes of this Order, a recovery referred to in paragraph (c) of the definition of "recovery" in Item 1 is taken to have been made when the amount of which the recovery forms part is received by the Authority or when a decision is made by the Authority to set off an amount equivalent to the amount of which the recovery forms part against the amount of which the recovery forms part.

SCHEDULE 2**SIZING AND EXPERIENCE ADJUSTMENT FACTOR Z**

1. Subject to Item 2, the Sizing and Experience Adjustment Factor, Z, for an employer is calculated in accordance with the formula:

$$Z = \frac{0.9 \times X}{X + 360\,000}$$

where -

X is

- (a) for the purposes of calculating the premium and any adjusted premium payable before the expiration of the policy period -

the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with the formula $W_1 \times IR$ in respect of the first period of coverage of all workplaces of the employer or, if item 10 of Schedule 1 applies, of the relevant group of employers, where the workplace is in operation at the start of the policy period;

- (b) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer -

the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with the formula $W_1 \times IR$ in respect of the first period of coverage of all workplaces of the employer, or if item 10 of Schedule 1 applies, of the relevant group of employers;

- (c) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired, where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 -

the sum of the amounts calculated in accordance with the formula $Y_0 \times IR$ in respect of each period of coverage of all workplaces of the employer, or if item 10 of Schedule 1 applies, of the relevant group of employers;

where -

- Y_0 is the rateable remuneration paid or payable by the employer to workers engaged in operations at the workplace during the period of coverage of the workplace and in respect of the first period of coverage includes the remuneration paid or payable to workers engaged in operations at any predecessor workplace within the period of this Order;

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

W_1 is the rateable remuneration paid or payable by an employer to workers engaged in operations at the workplace during the financial year preceding the policy period;

IR has the same meaning as in clause 6.

2. For the purposes of the definition of X in Item 1, the expression “rateable remuneration” in the definition of W_1 and in the definition of Y_0 is to be applied as if the relevant remuneration did not include superannuation benefits within the meaning of section 5 of the Act.

SCHEDULE 3

EXPERIENCE FACTOR E

1. (1) The Experience Factor, E, for a period of coverage of a workplace is to be calculated:
- (a) for the purposes of calculating the premium and any adjusted premium payable before the expiration of the policy period for which the premium is to be calculated, in accordance with the following formula:

$$E = \frac{(F_1 \times C_1) + (F_2 \times C_2)}{(W_1 + W_2)}$$

- (b) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer, in accordance with the following formula:

$$E = \frac{(F_1 \times C_0) + (F_1 \times C_1) + (F_2 \times C_2)}{(W_0 + W_1 + W_2)}$$

- (c) for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003, in accordance with the following formula:

$$E = \frac{(F_0^c \times C_0) + (F_1^c \times C_1) + (F_2^c \times C_2)}{(W_0 + W_1 + W_2)}$$

where -

- C_1, C_2 are respectively, subject to sub-items (3) and (5), the totals of the costs of claims in respect of workers engaged in operations at the workplace which were received by the authorised agent (or the Authority under Part 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Act) during the last and second last financial year before the commencement of the policy period;

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

C_0 is the total of the cost of claims in respect of workers engaged in operations at the workplace received by the Authority or the authorised agent during the period from the start of the policy period until the end of the period of coverage;

W_1, W_2 are respectively, subject to sub-items (4) and (5) and subject to Item 7, the rateable remuneration paid or payable by an employer to workers engaged in operations at the workplace during the last and second last financial years preceding the policy period;

W_0 subject to Item 7, is the rateable remuneration paid or payable by an employer to workers engaged in operations at the workplace during the period from the start of the policy period until the end of the period of coverage;

F_1, F_2 for the purposes of sub-item (1)(a) are respectively the relevant numbers specified in the following Table of Factors, opposite the authorised agent which calculated the costs of claims of the workplace -

- (b) if the costs of claims of the workplace were calculated by an authorised agent not named in the above Table of Factors, the numbers determined solely by the

Authority and notified in the Government Gazette in respect of that authorised agent.

- F_0^c, F_1^c, F_2^c are such numbers as are determined solely by the Authority and notified in the Government Gazette which apply according to the authorised agent which calculated the costs of claims of the workplace.
- (2) Where the cost of claims of a workplace is calculated by more than one authorised agent, F_1, F_2, F_0^c, F_1^c and F_2^c are, respectively, the sum of the proportion of F_1, F_2, F_0^c, F_1^c or F_2^c for each relevant authorised agent where the proportion is the proportion that the cost of claims calculated by each authorised agent bears to the total cost of claims of the workplace for the purposes of the relevant calculation.
 - (3) For the purposes of sub-item (1), the values of C_1 and C_2 must be increased respectively by an amount equivalent to the proportion specified in sub-item (5) of the total of the costs of claims-
 - (a) in respect of workers engaged in operations at all workplaces of the employer which had ceased to exist during the last or second last financial year before the commencement of the policy period and which have not been classified as the predecessor of another workplace; and
 - (b) received by the authorised agent (or the Authority under Part 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Act) during, in the case of C_1 the last and, in the case of C_2 , the second last financial year before the commencement of the policy period.
 - (4) For the purposes of sub-item (1), the values of W_1 and W_2 must be increased respectively by an amount equivalent to the proportion specified in sub-item (5) of the total rateable remuneration paid or payable by the employer during, in the case of W_1 the last and, in the case of W_2 , the second last financial year before the commencement of the policy period to workers engaged in operations at all workplaces which had ceased to exist during the last or second last financial year before the commencement of the policy period and which have not been classified as a predecessor of another workplace.
 - (5) For the purposes of sub-items (3) and (4), the proportion is the proportion which the value of W for the workplace bears to the total of the values of W for all workplaces of the employer for which a premium has been calculated in accordance with this Order, where W has the same meaning as in clause 5.
 - (6) For the purposes of sub-item (1) (c), if the value of C_0, C_1 and C_2 is in each case zero for all periods of coverage of all workplaces of the employer, the calculation of the Experience Factor, E , may be made notwithstanding that the Authority has not determined and notified in the Government Gazette the relevant numbers constituting F_0^c, F_1^c and F_2^c .

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***2. Definition of cost of claims**

For the purposes of this Schedule “**cost of claims**” means -

the total, calculated by an authorised agent, or the Authority on review, of the costs of each individual claim, other than an excluded claim, received by the Authority or the authorised agent during the relevant period.

3. Cost of an individual claim

(1) The cost of an individual claim is -

the sum of -

- (a) the payments of compensation, if any, made by the Authority or an authorised agent in respect of the claim pursuant to the Act;
- (b) the payments, if any, of damages at common law or of amounts paid in settlement of claims or proceedings for such damages in respect of the claim;
- (c) costs and expenses, if any, paid by the Authority or an authorised agent in relation to the claim;
- (d) the most accurate estimation for the time being in accordance with Item 5 of the Authority’s outstanding liability to pay all of the payments, expenses and costs of the claim;

but -

- (e) does not include any remuneration paid or payable to relevant authorised agents in accordance with their agency agreements;
 - (f) shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to the sum of the amounts of all input tax credits and decreasing adjustments within the meaning of the A New Tax System (Goods and Services) Act 1999 of the Commonwealth which have arisen in relation to the payments, costs and expenses referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c);
 - (g) shall be reduced by recoveries made by the Authority or authorised agents;
 - (h) if the employer elects under section 125A (6) of the Act to eliminate the excess under section 125A (3), does not include payments which would otherwise have been met by the employer under the excess; and
 - (i) shall not include any payments, costs or expenses in relation to the claim to the extent to which the worker has been found guilty of an offence under section 81, 82, 83 or 83A of the **Crimes Act 1958** or under section 248, 248A (2) or 249 of the Act in relation to the claim.
- (2) If the cost of an individual claim calculated under sub-item (1) exceeds \$168,000, the cost of the individual claim is deemed to be \$168,000.

*WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003***4. Excluded claims**

- (1) "Excluded claims" refers to claims in respect of injuries to workers participating in a return to work program funded and operated by the Authority or approved by the Authority.
- (2) In sub-item (1), the references to the Authority do not include authorised agents.

5. Estimation of outstanding liability

- (1) The estimation referred to in Item 3(1)(d) of this Schedule must be made -
 - (a) by the authorised agent responsible for the administration of the claim; or
 - (b) by the Authority on review.
- (2) The estimation referred to in item 3 (1) (d) of this Schedule must be made in accordance with procedures determined solely by the Authority and must include an amount equivalent to the sum of all amounts, of which the authorised agent has notice, paid by the employer in relation to the claim or in satisfaction or purported satisfaction of the employer's or the authorised insurer's or the Authority's liability or potential liability in respect of the claim (other than any amount paid in satisfaction of the liability of the employer under section 125 (1) (a) or 125A (3) of the Act) which have not been reimbursed to the employer by the authorised insurer or the Authority or the authorised agent.

6. Date of determination of cost of claims

The cost of claims is calculated -

- (a) for the purposes of calculating the premium payable before the expiration of the policy period -

as at a time nominated solely by the Authority before the commencement of the policy period;
- (b) for the purposes of calculating the premium payable after the policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer -

as at the time when the employer ceased as an employer;
- (c) for the purposes of calculating the premium payable after the policy period has expired where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 -

as at a time nominated solely by the Authority after the policy period.

7. Exclusion of superannuation benefits

For the purposes of Item 1 (1), the expression “rateable remuneration” in the definition of W_0 and in the definition of W_1 , W_2 is, in each case, to be applied as if the relevant remuneration did not include superannuation benefits within the meaning of section 5 of the Act.

divided by

the sum of the rateable remuneration in respect of the last period of coverage for the preceding policy period of all workplaces corresponding to a workplace of the employer referred to in clause 5 of this Order; or

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

(b) in all other cases, -

the sum of the imputed workplace premiums in respect of the last period of coverage for the preceding policy period of all workplaces corresponding to a workplace of the employer referred to in clause 5 of this Order

divided by -

the sum of the rateable remuneration in respect of the last period of coverage for the preceding policy period of all workplaces corresponding to a workplace of the employer referred to in clause 5 of this Order -

where the imputed workplace premium in respect of the last period of coverage for the preceding policy period of a workplace is -

(i) if W for the workplace in respect of that period of coverage is a number greater than zero, calculated as follows -

WP_U is the calculated WorkCover Premium within the meaning of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 of the relevant employer in respect of the policy period including that period of coverage without regard to the operation of Schedule 5 or Schedule 6 of that Order; or

(ii) if W for the workplace in respect of that period of coverage is zero, calculated as follows -

W is the value of that symbol for the workplace in respect of that period of coverage for the purposes of clause 5 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002;

WP is the value of that symbol for the purposes of clause 4 of the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 9) 2001/2002 used in calculating the premium payable by the relevant employer in respect of the policy period including that period of coverage;

R is the rateable remuneration in respect of that period of coverage;

R_1 is the sum of the rateable remuneration in respect of all periods of coverage for the preceding policy period of all workplaces of the relevant employer.

SCHEDULE 7**PAYMENT OF PREMIUM AND DISCOUNTS**

1. An employer may elect to pay premium in an annual instalment and, if the premium payable is calculated to be \$1,000 or less, the employer must pay the premium in this manner.
2. A premium payable by way of an annual instalment is –
 - (a) if the employer is, as at 9 June 2002, an employer referred to in clause 6(1)(b) or (c), due on 1 October 2002; or
 - (b) in any other case, due on 7 August 2002 –and, if such a premium is paid by the applicable due date, the amount of the premium is, subject to Schedule 5, to be discounted by 5%.
3. If a premium has been discounted in accordance with item 2., for the purposes of calculating –
 - (a) any adjusted premium payable after the employer's policy has been cancelled before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 and where the employer ceases as an employer; or
 - (b) any adjusted premium payable after the policy period has expired where the policy period expires at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2003 –

the amount of premium so calculated is to be reduced by the amount by which the premium was reduced as the result of the discount.

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 10) 2002/2003

4. If an employer has not elected under and in accordance with item 1, or is not required under that item, to pay premium in an annual instalment, the employer may elect to pay premium by monthly instalments or by quarterly instalments.
5. Unless and until an employer referred to in item 4. has made an election under and in accordance with that item, the employer must pay premium –
 - (a) if the premium is calculated to be less than \$50,000, by quarterly instalments; and
 - (b) if the premium is calculated to be \$50,000 or more –
 - (i) if the employer is, as at 9 June 2002, an employer referred to in clause 6(1)(b) or (c), by quarterly instalments; or
 - (ii) in any other case, by monthly instalments.
6. (1) Quarterly payments of premium are payable in 4 equal instalments, or as varied in accordance with guidelines issued solely by the Authority.
 - (2) Quarterly payments are due on the first day of September, December, March and June.
7. (1) Monthly payments of premium are payable in 12 equal instalments unless varied in accordance with guidelines issued solely by the Authority.
 - (2) Monthly payments are due 7 days after the end of the month, unless deferred in accordance with guidelines issued solely by the Authority.

DETAILED CLASSIFICATION

DIVISION A : AGRICULTURE, FORESTRY, FISHING AND HUNTING

1. This Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in “agriculture, forestry, fishing and hunting” or in providing related services, such as sheep shearing, aerial agricultural services, harvesting or forest protection. Agricultural extension or advisory services provided by government departments are, however, included as activities predominant to Public Administration in Subdivision 71.
2. The term “agriculture” is used here in the broad sense to include the breeding, keeping or cultivation of all kinds of animal or vegetable life except forest trees and marine life. Sun-drying of fruit is also included in this Subdivision.
3. Institutional farms such as research farms and prison farms are not included in this Division, but are classified to those classes in Division K, which include the institutions concerned.
4. “Forestry” includes afforestation or the harvesting or gathering of forest products. Logging operations such as felling, hewing or rough shaping of timber in the forest are included in this Division.
5. “Fishing” includes the catching, gathering, breeding or cultivation of marine life from ocean, coastal or inland waters (coastal waters include estuaries and inlets). Included also is the processing of ocean and coastal water fishery products aboard vessels predominantly engaged in both catching and processing those products.
6. “Hunting” includes the catching or taking of all types of animal wildlife on land. The catching or taking of wildlife such as crocodiles in inland waters is also included.

DIVISION B : MINING

1. This Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in ‘mining’, in mineral exploration on own account, in the provision of a wide variety of services to mining and mineral exploration on a contract or fee basis, as well as mining workplaces under development. The term ‘mining’ is used here in the broad sense to include the extraction of minerals occurring naturally as solids such as coal and ores, liquids such as crude petroleum, or gases such as natural gas by such processes as underground or open-cut mining, dredging, quarrying, the operation of wells or evaporation pans, or by recovery from ore dumps or railings.
2. Workplaces predominantly engaged in dressing or beneficiating ores or other minerals by crushing, milling, screening, washing, flotation or other, including chemical beneficiation, processes, or predominantly engaged in briquetting or iron ore pelletising are included in this Division. These activities are generally carried out at or near mine sites as an integral part of mining operations and are therefore regarded as predominant to this Division. Natural gas absorption, purifying and similar treatment plants are also included in this Division.
3. Excluded from this Division are workplaces predominantly engaged in refining or smelting of minerals or ores (other than preliminary smelting of gold), or in the manufacture of such products of mineral origin as coke, cement or fertilisers.
4. Workplaces which are predominantly engaged in undertaking mineral exploration on own account, ie: workplaces classifiable to the classes in Group 161, cannot be classified, as is usual in the case of other workplaces, on the basis of their gross receipts. Instead their classification will be determined, where possible, on the basis of their gross expenditures.

1. This Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in manufacturing the various categories of products summarised below.
2. The term ‘manufacturing’ is used here in the broad sense to relate to the physical or chemical transformation of materials or components into new products, whether the work is performed by power-driven machines or by hand. In addition, repair or re-conditioning of products, unless elsewhere classified, shall be included in this Division and classified to the same classification as the original manufactured product.
3. In the summary which follows below an indication is given (by no means comprehensive) of the treatment of particular repair, installation, blending, assembly, packing, bottling or other activities which are typically carried on outside the scope of this Division in an attempt to more clearly describe the activity contents of this Division.
4. Broadly, then, this Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in manufacturing:
 - (a) Food, beverages or tobacco products (Subdivision 21). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in sun-drying fruit, processing fish aboard vessels which also catch fish (these are included in Division A), in washing or packing fresh fruit, pulping or other processing of eggs, bottling wine or spirits, repacking flour, cereal food products, dried fruits or in blending or repacking tea (these are included in Subdivision 47 in Division F). However, milk receiving depots treating milk by grading, testing, filtering or cooling and milk distribution depots predominantly engaged in bulk handling of milk are included in this Subdivision.
 - (b) Textiles, clothing and footwear (Subdivisions 23 and 24) including workplaces predominantly engaged in cotton ginning or other preparation of fibres for further processing. Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in making or installing curtains, in mens or womens custom tailoring or dressmaking or in boot and shoe repairing (these are included in Subdivision 48 in Division F) or in installing blinds or laying carpets or other floor coverings (these are included in Division E). Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of textiles, clothing and footwear are included in Division I.

- (c) Wood products and furniture (Subdivision 25). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in hewing or rough shaping of railway sleepers, posts, etc., in the forest (these are included in Division A) or in fabrication of joinery at construction sites, erecting prefabricated wooden buildings or installing wooden framed windows (these are included in Division E). Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing wooden products and furniture are included in Division I.
- (d) Paper or paper products (Subdivision 26), including workplaces predominantly engaged in publishing or in publishing and printing newspapers, magazines, books, music, maps, etc., or in providing printing trade services, such as electrotyping and bookbinding. Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of paper and paper products are included in Division I.
- (e) Chemical, plastic, coal, petroleum, glass, clay, cement or other non-metallic mineral products (Subdivisions 27 and 28 and Group 347 in Subdivision 34). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in screening, crushing, dressing or other rudimentary treating of minerals, construction materials, etc., in briquetting coal or in purifying natural gas (these are included in Division B), or in blending lubricating oils and greases or in glazing (these are included in Subdivision 47 in Division F). Workplaces predominantly engaged in plastering, in manufacturing and/or laying of hotmix bituminous paving or in the installation of insulation materials or of bituminous roofing materials are included in Division E. Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of chemical, plastic, glass etc., products are included in Division I.
- (f) Metals and metal products including machinery, transport or other equipment, scientific apparatus, and household appliances (Subdivisions 29, 31, 32 and 33), leather or rubber products, ophthalmic articles, jewellery, sporting equipment, etc. (Groups 345, 346 and 348 in Subdivision 34). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in iron ore pelletising or in dressing or other preliminary treating of metallic ores (these are included in Division B), in repairing motor vehicles (except workplaces predominantly engaged in engine reconditioning – these are included in Division C), most types of household appliances, lawn mowers, marine outboard engines, toys, sporting equipment, photographic equipment, watches, clocks and

jewellery, etc., tractors, farm and construction machinery or business machines (these are included in Subdivision 48 in Division F), in the erection or on-site assembly (from prefabricated components) of boilers, industrial furnaces, heavy electrical machinery, metal silos and storage tanks or structural steel, or in the installation of radio or T.V. broadcasting equipment, telephone or telegraph equipment, hot water systems, domestic exhaust fans, heating, refrigeration and airconditioning equipment, fire alarm and sprinkler systems, metal awnings, screens or windows, etc. (these are included in Division E). Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of metal products, tools, household appliances, sporting equipment, etc., are included in Division I.

5. In general the manufacture of parts or components is a predominant activity of the same class as the manufacture of the finished product except where the manufacture of parts or components is specifically shown as a predominant activity of another class.
6. In some instances two or more activities are vertically integrated in the one manufacturing workplace in that the products of one activity are used as materials in the other. In these cases workplaces are generally included in the class to which the final activity is predominant. In some cases, however, the classes have been defined so that certain workplaces are included in the class to which the initial activity is predominant.

1. This Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in the trading of goods either as a retailer, wholesaler (physically handling the goods and, usually, taking title to the goods) or as an agent or purchasing, marketing or buying office. The term 'agency' is used here to include those operations which trade in goods but do not usually take title to the goods traded and do not physically handle the goods. Typically an agency receives commission or fees which are directly related to the value of goods traded. A purchasing, marketing or buying office is a separate workplace, of a multi workplace employer, which is predominantly engaged in buying or marketing goods for use by other workplaces of the employer. Such a workplace which buys or markets for other workplaces of the employer does not physically handle the goods.
2. The term 'wholesale trade' is used here in the broad sense to include the sale (as principals) of new or used goods to retailers or other wholesalers. The more important types of businesses engaged in wholesale trade are wholesale merchants who take title to the goods they sell and separately located sales branches or sales offices (not being retail stores), operated by manufacturing enterprises, which do not merely take orders but supply goods to customers from stocks physically held at their own premises. Workplaces engaged in storing and distributing goods to other workplaces of the employer are included in Division G.
3. The term 'retail trade' is used here, generally speaking, to include the activity of selling new or used goods to final consumers. The more important types of business engaged in retail trade are department stores or other shops, stalls, mail order houses, hawkers, door to door sellers, milk or bread vendors, vending machine operators or consumer cooperatives. However, cafes, restaurants, licensed hotels, motels, wine saloons and clubs are included in Division L, Recreation, Personal and Other Services.
4. In addition to the foregoing it may be useful to note that while most types of goods can enter wholesale trade, not all goods may be considered to enter the retail sector even though they may be sold to the final consumer. Goods not normally entering retail trade include cereal grains, metal ores, crude petroleum, industrial chemicals, iron and steel and industrial machinery and equipment.

SCHEDULE 8—*continued*

5. Workplaces predominantly engaged in selling their own goods by auction are included in this Division, but workplaces (except stock and station agents) which are predominantly engaged in providing auctioning services for others are included in Division I, Finance, Property and Business Services.
6. Workplaces predominantly engaged in leasing goods (not manufactured by the same workplaces) for periods in excess of one year, without operators, from stocks physically handled by the workplace are included in this Division, as are workplaces predominantly engaged in the hiring out of most types of consumer goods.
7. Certain kinds of activity other than selling are commonly carried out by workplaces classified to this Division and have therefore been designated as predominant to the relevant classes of either Subdivision 47 or 48. The more important of these activities are:
 - (i) Glazing (Class F4728R).
 - (ii) Blending industrial or lubricating oils from refinery base stock (Class F4741J).
 - (iii) Washing or packing (incl. contract packing) fresh fruit or vegetables (Class F4764X).
 - (iv) Pulping, dehydrating or preserving eggs (Class F4765A).
 - (v) Bottling or breaking down bulk quantities of wine or spirits (incl. contract packing) (Class F4767F).
 - (vi) Blending or repacking tea (incl. contract packing), repacking (incl. contract packing) flour, cereal food products, dried fruits or a wide range of other groceries (Class F4769K).
 - (vii) Custom tailoring or dressmaking (Class F4840R).
 - (viii) Repairing footwear (Class F4846C).
 - (ix) Making or installing curtains (Class F4847F).
 - (x) Repairing locks or providing key duplicating services (Class F4853A).
 - (xi) Repairing non-electric household appliances (Class F4856J).
 - (xii) Repairing or installing household electric appliances (except heating equipment) not requiring electrical work (Class F4857K).
 - (xiii) Repairing or servicing motor vehicles (Class F4861A).

- (xiv) Repairing tractors, agricultural or construction machinery (Class F4863F) .
 - (xv) Repairing or servicing business machines or equipment (Class F4897C) .
8. The treatment of such activities as installation, assembly, blending, bottling and packing is usually specified in the class descriptions. Where these activities have not been specified it should be assumed that they are included in the class that trades in the product.
 9. Workplaces predominantly engaged in both baking and retailing bread or cakes are included in this Division, but workplaces predominantly engaged in baking bread or cakes are included in Division C, Manufacturing.
 10. In the case of workplaces which have goods manufactured for them on commission or contract a variety of situations are encountered with different treatments applicable to each. In general, if a workplace has no goods producing facilities itself (or, if it has, does not use these or does not employ contractors to use them on its behalf), ie: the workplace undertakes no goods producing activities at all, then all its sales of goods produced for it on commission are treated for classification purposes as wholesale or retail sales, as appropriate.
