- a) to repeal Local Law No. 6 – "Itinerant Trading";

- b) to make a new Local Law regulating itinerant trading within the municipal district; and
c) to amend Local Law No. 10 – "Enforcement".

NOTICE OF INTENTION TO MAKE
A LOCAL LAW

Notice is given pursuant to sections 119 and 223 of the **Local Government Act 1989** (the Act) that the Mildura Rural City Council proposes to amend its Processes of Municipal Government (Procedures for meetings) Local Law No 1 by making a new Local Law to be known by Processes of Municipal Government (Procedures for meetings) Local Law No 1.1.

The purpose of the local law is to:

- provide a mechanism to facilitate the good government of the Mildura Rural City Council through its formal meeting procedure to ensure effective and efficient Council decisions are made in a manner which acknowledges the role of local government within the Australian system of Government;
- regulate and control the election of Mayor, any Deputy Mayor and the chairperson of any Special Committees and the procedures governing the conduct of meetings;
- regulate and control the use of the Council's seal; and
- provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district.

The proposed local law, if made, will amend the original local law as follows:

1. Old Sections 3.4 to 3.6 dealing with Special and Advisory Committees have been deleted as they are covered in the Act.
2. Old Section 3.7 (new 12) dealing with Notice of Meeting, the Municipal Association of Victoria has suggested shortening this from

three days to 48 hours for Ordinary Council and Special Committee meetings and 24 hours for Special Council meetings.

3. New Section 26 dealing with the content of Council meeting minutes. This procedure is how we record the minutes currently and has been moved from the old standards section.
4. In the new Section 29, Change to Order of Business, it is proposed to change this to reflect the current practice of bringing a matter forward if it is clear that a number of people in the Gallery have attended for that item. Therefore, the order "...may only be altered by general agreement of the Council" rather than by resolution.
5. Old Sections 6.3 Chairperson's Casting Vote and 6.12 Demand Production of Documents have been deleted as these are covered in the Act.
6. New Section 69 Final Ruling on a Point of Order, the Municipal Association of Victoria has suggested a clause whereby the Chair's ruling on a point of order may be overturned if a motion of dissent is successfully carried.
7. New Division 6 (Section 88) dealing with Notice of Amendment or Rescission clears up previous anomalies.
8. New section 100(1) changes the old provision that Council had to unanimously agree to deal with a petition to only a majority resolution to do so.
9. New Section 100(2) where petitions containing less than 20 signatories may, at the discretion of the Chief Executive Officer, be dealt with as a "Request for Service" rather than coming to Council.
10. Old Part 10 (page 32) relating to Enforcement and Penalties has been pruned back to the essentials not covered in other legislation.
11. The previous Part 11 on standards has been dispensed with as these have been articulated in the relevant sections of the local law.

Any person may make a submission on the proposed local law to the Council. All submissions received within 14 days after the publication of this notice will be considered in accordance with section 223(1) of the Act by Council in committee. Any person who has made a written submission to Council and has requested to be heard in support of that submission is entitled to appear in person, or by a person acting on his or her behalf, before Council in committee, scheduled to be held on Thursday 13 February 2003 commencing at 4 pm in the Benetook Room, The Alfred Deakin Centre, corner of Deakin Avenue and Twelfth Street, Mildura.

- to prescribe the requirements for enclosures for restricted breed dogs; and
- to prescribe the requirements for warning signs for restricted breed dogs; and
- to prescribe an application fee for review of a restricted breed dog declaration.

The Regulations are to be made under the **Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994**. The RIS discusses possible alternatives to the proposed Regulations. The proposed Regulations were considered the best means of achieving the stated objectives and the most appropriate means to improve the management of restricted breed dogs, to reduce the possibility of restricted breed dog attacks and to fund hearings by restricted breed dog review panels.

The RIS assesses the costs and benefits of the proposed Regulations and concludes that the benefits of the Regulations are greater than the costs they impose.


