## Marine Act 1988

### Notice under Section 15 (1)

The Director of Marine Safety, acting on the recommendation of Goulburn Murray Water, the local authority for the Waters of the Lake Hume:

1. revokes the rules regulating the operation of vessels on the Waters of Lake Hume set out in Schedule 95 of the Notice made under section 15(1) of the **Marine Act 1988** and published in the Government Gazette; and
2. gives notice of the following rules regulating the operation of vessels on the Waters of Lake Hume.

### SCHEDULE 95 WATERS-LAKE HUME

*Local Authority-Goulburn-Murray Water*

#### **Vessel Operating and Zoning Rules for water levels above 170.5 metres Australian Height Datum (AHD) — as measured at the head gauge board located on the western pier of the Bethanga Bridge crossing of Lake Hume.**

1. Excluded speed limits for the purposes of Clause 3(a).  
The waters of Lake Hume are not subject to the requirements of Clause 3(a) of this notice.
2. Access lane for the purposes of Clause 5.
  - (i) At Kookaburra Point those waters within 60 metres of the waters edge for the time being between 30 metres and 120 metres east of the boat ramp and marked by beacons on the shore and green buoys in the water are an access lane;
  - (ii) At Ludlows Reserve those waters within 60 metres of the waters edge for the time being between 310 metres and 560 metres south of the boat ramp and marked by beacons on the shore and green buoys in the water are an access lane.
3. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.  
The waters of Lake Hume—
  - (a) in the bay immediately south of Jackson's Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
  - (b) in the bay immediately north of Kookaburra Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores near the entrance to the bay;
  - (c) in the bay immediately south of Kookaburra Point Reserve west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores near the entrance to the bay, except all those waters within the bay which are prohibited areas;

- (d) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in an area approximately 40 metres wide with the centre of the outward boundary being marked by one yellow buoy in the water immediately in front of the launching ramps at the following locations:
  - (i) adjacent to the southern point of Kookaburra Point Reserve;
  - (ii) adjacent to the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve;
  - (iii) adjacent to Ebden Reserve;
  - (iv) adjacent to Huon Reserve;
  - (v) adjacent to Ludlows Reserve;
- (e) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being in two areas approximately 20 metres wide and situated—
  - (i) adjacent to the eastern boundary of the swimming area adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park; and
  - (ii) adjacent to the western boundary of the swimming area adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park, the boundaries of each area furthest from the swimming area being marked by a yellow buoy in the water;
- (f) in the bay adjacent to the western shore of the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve approximately 150 metres south of the swimming area and south of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
- (g) in the bay adjacent to the eastern shore of the Tallangatta Recreation Reserve approximately 600 metres east of the public launching ramp and south-west of a line between two beacons located on opposite shores within the entrance to the bay;
- (h) in Bethanga Bay north-west of a line between beacons located on the foreshore on each side of the entrance to the bay –

are subject to a 5 knot speed restriction.

4. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.

The waters of Lake Hume—

- (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof passing through a beacon inscribed “Stop” and “Prohibited Water Beyond this Point” on the Victorian shore and red buoys in the water;
- (b) in a swimming area located in the large central bay adjacent to the southern shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed “Swimming Area” located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
- (c) in a swimming area located in the bay adjacent to the south-west shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed “Swimming Area” located on opposite shores of the bay;
- (d) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by two red buoys at the following locations:
  - (i) in a swimming area approximately 40 metres wide on the northern shore of Scotchman’s Point;
  - (ii) in a swimming area approximately 80 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north-west of the public launching ramp at Ebden Reserve;

- (iii) in a swimming area approximately 150 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north of the public launching ramp at Ludlow's Reserve; and
- (iv) in a swimming area approximately 130 metres wide located approximately 20 metres west of the concrete retaining wall adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park

are prohibited to vessels.

**Vessel Operating and Zoning Rules for water levels 170.499 metres AHD or less – as measured at the head gauge board located on the western pier of the Bethanga Bridge crossing of Lake Hume.**

1. 4 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.  
The whole of the waters of Lake Hume except in the prohibited area are subject to a speed restriction of 4 knots.
2. Areas prohibited to vessels for the purposes of Clause 9.  
The waters of Lake Hume–
  - (a) between the dam wall and a line approximately 200 metres to the south thereof passing through a beacon inscribed "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond this Point" on the Victorian shore and red buoys in the water;
  - (b) in a swimming area located in the large central bay adjacent to the southern shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed "Swimming Area" located on opposite shores at the entrance to the bay;
  - (c) in a swimming area located in the bay adjacent to the south-west shore of Kookaburra Point Reserve and north of a line between two beacons inscribed "Swimming Area" located on opposite shores of the bay;
  - (d) extending approximately 60 metres from the edge of the water for the time being between side boundaries marked by two red buoys at the following locations:
    - (i) in a swimming area approximately 40 metres wide on the northern shore of Scotchman's Point;
    - (ii) in a swimming area approximately 80 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north-west of the public launching ramp at Ebdon Reserve;
    - (iii) in a swimming area approximately 150 metres wide located approximately 25 metres north of the public launching ramp at Ludlow's Reserve; and
    - (iv) in a swimming area approximately 130 metres wide located approximately 20 metres west of the concrete retaining wall adjacent to the Tallangatta Caravan Park

are prohibited to vessels.
