Re-advertised due to change in areas impacted that will affect properties that were previously not included

- 9.8 In the event that a 'single deck card shuffling shoe' jams, stops shuffling or fails to complete a shuffle cycle, the cards will be reshuffled.
- 9.9 If during a round of play two or more cards are dealt simultaneously and:
  - 9.9.1 the order of the cards cannot be determined, those cards will be discarded, the result for each wager will be settled on the result standing prior to the error and the round of play will be terminated;
  - 9.9.2 the order of the cards can be determined the first card in the sequence will be used to determine the result for each wager, the remaining card/s will be deemed to be a card/s dealt in error and the round of play will be terminated.
- 9.10 Where an action round has been terminated in accordance with rule 9.5 or 9.9 and a result for a particular wager cannot be determined, that wager will be returned to the player.

## Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988

The **Flora and Fauna Guarantee Act 1988** enables members of the public to nominate species, communities and potentially threatening processes for listing under the Act. Nominations under the Act are considered by a Scientific Advisory Committee, which makes recommendations to the Minister.




