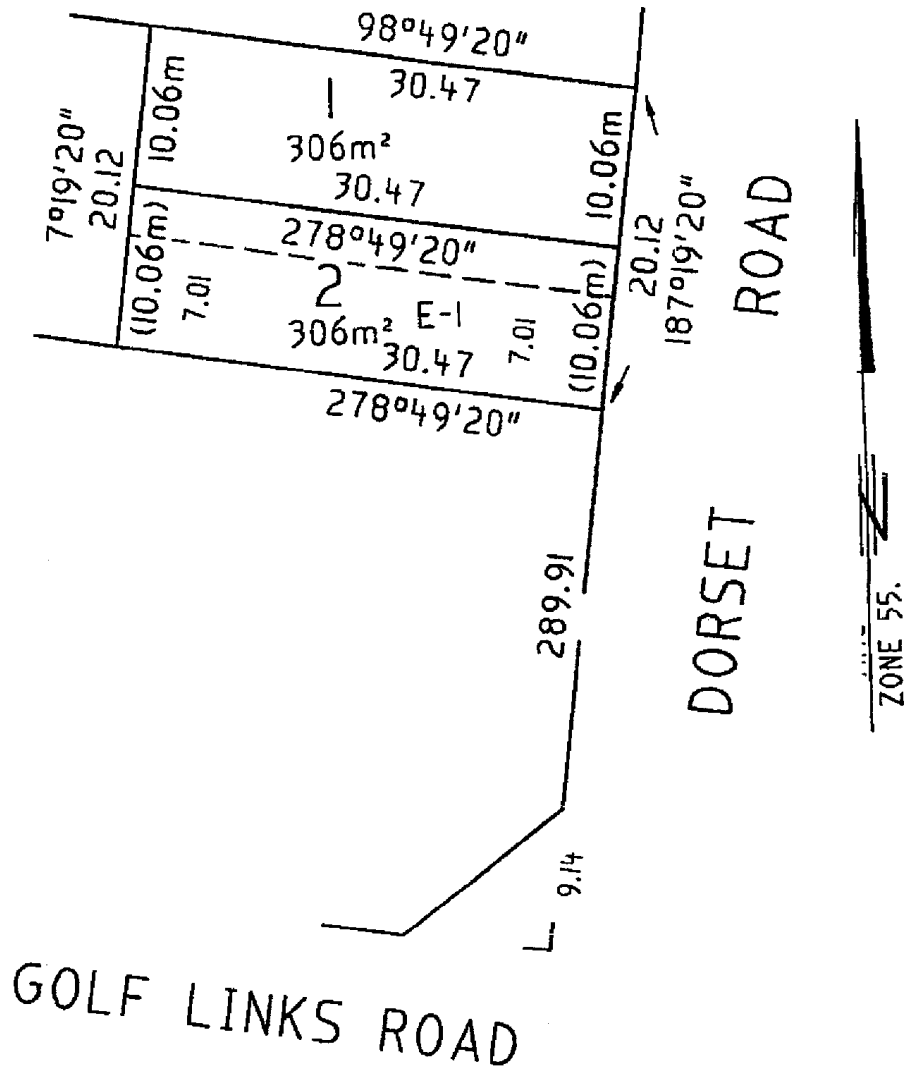

LOCAL LAW No. 1 Meeting Procedure

Council proposes to make Local Law No. 1 to provide for the orderly conduct of Council Meetings, election of the Mayor and use of the City Seal.

The Local Law deals with agendas, quorums, keeping of minutes, business of the meeting, voting at meetings, addressing a meeting, motions, speaking time, points of order, formal motions, amendments and rescission motions, public participation, election of the Mayor and use of the City Seal.

The Local Law also fixes penalties for breach of certain provisions.

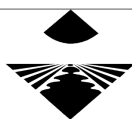

- The Department of Victorian Communities (the Department) was established to promote community services and infrastructure within Victorian communities. The Department includes Aboriginal Affairs Victoria. That division is the central advisor to the Government on Indigenous issues.
- As part of its plan to implement the Indigenous employment strategy, the Department aims, by July 2005, to introduce 5 cadetships open only to Indigenous Australians. The Department also aims to provide cadetships thereafter at the rate of 2 or 3 a year. The cadetships will only be provided to people who have completed their first year of university education, and consist of a study allowance to assist in completing their courses, work placements with the Department of a minimum of 2 weeks a year, and the offer of an on-going position with the Department at VPS 3 level on successful completion of studies. The Department aims to provide assistance to cadets through a mentoring program.
- Through this initiative, the Department aims to address the under-representation of

Indigenous people in the Victorian public sector (particularly at the higher level), help to address the issue of significant unemployment of Indigenous Australians, provide a goal which will encourage the Indigenous cadets to complete their university studies, and encourage workplace diversity within the Victorian public sector.

- On 5 November 2003 the Tribunal granted an exemption to the Department to permit it to employ an ATSI person as Human Resources Project Officer for the cadetship program.

Road Management (Works and Infrastructure) Regulations 2005

Notice is given in accordance with section 11 of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, that a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared in connection with the proposed Road Management (Works and Infrastructure) Regulations 2005.

The Victorian Parliament passed the **Road Management Act 2004** in May 2004. Many provisions of the Act came into effect on 1 July 2004. The remaining provisions, which include works and infrastructure in road reserves, came into effect on 1 January 2005.

Road Management (Works and Infrastructure) (Interim) Regulations 2004 were made to take effect on 1 January 2005 to support the effective operation of the **Road Management Act 2004**. These Regulations expire on 30 June 2005 and were made without compliance with the RIS process in accordance with a Premier's certificate issued under section 9(3) of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**.

VicRoads has prepared the proposed Road Management (Works and Infrastructure) Regulations 2005, which are proposed to come into operation on 1 July 2005. This RIS is concerned with these proposed Regulations.

The objectives of the proposed Regulations are to:

- prescribe exemptions from the consent and notification requirements under the Act;
- prescribe restrictions on the powers of a coordinating road authority to impose conditions on consents given under the Act;
- vary periods in which certain notices must be given or consent is to be taken to have been given;
- prescribe particulars for the purpose of clause 16 of Schedule 7 of the Act; and
- prescribe fees for applications for consent required under the Act.

Among other things, the RIS assesses the costs and benefits of the proposed Regulations and other alternative means of achieving the same objectives. It concludes that the benefits of the proposed Regulations are likely to outweigh any expected costs.

The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment C29 to the Wodonga Planning Scheme.

The Amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The Amendment rezones Lot 1 on PS 93668 from the Rural Zone (RUZ) to Township Zone (TZ) and the balance of land on PS 93668 from Rural Zone to the Low Density Residential Zone (LDRZ). The Amendment introduces a Development Plan Overlay over all of the land

affected by the Amendment. The Development Plan Overlay ensures that the subdivision of land occurs in accordance with the Bonegilla Structure Plan adopted by the City of Wodonga, July 2003. The Amendment changes the Development Plan Overlay that applies to land already zoned Township to ensure consistency with the adopted Bonegilla Structure Plan, and amends the schedule to Clause 61.01-04.
