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Stock (Seller Liability and Declarations) Act 1993

NOTICE SPECIFYING FORM OF DECLARATION UNDER SECTION 18A

- I, Peter Harris, Secretary to the Department of Primary Industries, under section 18A of the **Stock (Seller Liability and Declarations) Act 1993** (the Act) –
- 1. specify that a declaration made by, or on behalf of, a seller of stock that relates to the Johne's disease status of beef cattle that is in, or in to the like effect of, the form appearing in the Schedule below is a declaration to which section 18A of the Act applies; and
- require that a selling agent who receives a declaration made under section 18A retain the
 declaration for a minimum of two years from the date of the sale to which the declaration
 relates.

This notice takes effect from 20 August 2005.

SCHEDULE

Explanatory Notes

Part A. BJD Zones: This map shows where the BJD zones are in Australia. WA is a Free Zone. Light grey areas are Protected Zones, mid-grey are Control Zones and dark-grey are Residual Zones.



Part A2. Introduced or purchased cattle:

If the animals for sale have been purchased or introduced into your herd, to be eligible for any of the beef trading statuses listed on this form you MUST have a BJD Animal Health Statement like this one, or a BJD Vendor Declaration, signed by the vendor, before you can declare their status.

Part B. Beef Only:

Point 1. Non-Assessed (NA), Check tested (CT), Tested to MAP standard (TMS), Beef Cattle Trade Assurance Scheme (BC-TAS) and CattleMAP herds are eligible for Beef Only status.

You may tick "applicable" in Part B and one other Part (C or D) if your herd meets the requirements of those parts.

Point 2. Grazing contact with dairy cattle — in the last 5 years an eligible herd must not have grazed with:

- any cattle of a dairy breed;
- any cattle that are first generation dairy cross breeds; or
- any other cattle that have been born, reared, or been run on a property that was
 part of a milk producing dairy enterprise at the time those cattle were present.
 Unless those cattle were part of a CattleMAP herd

Point 3. Grazing history of the land – an eligible herd must not, at any time in the past, have grazed on land that had, in the 12 months before the arrival of the beef herd, been grazed by adult dairy cattle. The only exception is if the adult dairy cattle were part of a CattleMAP herd.

A Beef Only herd may graze areas that have been previously grazed by dairy cattle

Point 4. Introduced or purchased cattle - If the animals for sale have been purchased or introduced into your herd, to be eligible for Beef Only status you MUST have a BJD Animal Health Statement like this one, or a BJD Vendor Declaration indicating their Beef Only status that has been signed by the vendor.

Point 5. NLIS identification – cattle for sale as Beef Only store cattle must be identified with an NLIS device.

Part D. BC-TAS herds:

To be able to tick this box your cattle herd must be registered under the Beef cattle Trade Assurance Scheme and must still comply with the requirements of that scheme. You must be able to provide a copy of a current BC-TAS certificate to the purchaser of your cattle or to any authorised officer (for example an Inspector of Livestock), on request.

Part D. Check Tested herd:

To be able to tick this box, within the last 12 months, at least 50 cattle in your herd (specifically those from the older age groups bred in the herd or those introduced in the past 4 years) must have been tested by a veterinarian approved by the State for Johne's disease programs, and all of the cattle tested must have given negative results for Johne's disease.

You must be able to provide a copy of the testing result and/or a certificate from your vet, to the purchaser of your cattle or to any authorised officer (for example an Inspector of Livestock), on request.

Part D. Tested to MAP Standard herd:

To be able to tick this box, within the last 12 months, a herd test equivalent to a Sample Test under CattleMAP must have been conducted by a veterinarian approved by the State for Johne's disease programs, and all the cattle tested must have given negative results for Johne's disease.

You must be able to provide a copy of the testing result and/or a certificate from your vet or local DPI District Veterinary Officer, to the purchaser of your cattle or to any authorised officer (for example an Inspector of Livestock), on request.

Part E. Declaration:

Audits will be conducted by authorised officers (for example, an Inspector of Livestock), both in the sale yards and on the property of origin of the cattle. You will be notified in advance if your property is selected for an on-farm audit. The officer involved will identify themselves and will indicate the information required to complete the audit.
