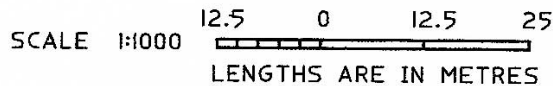
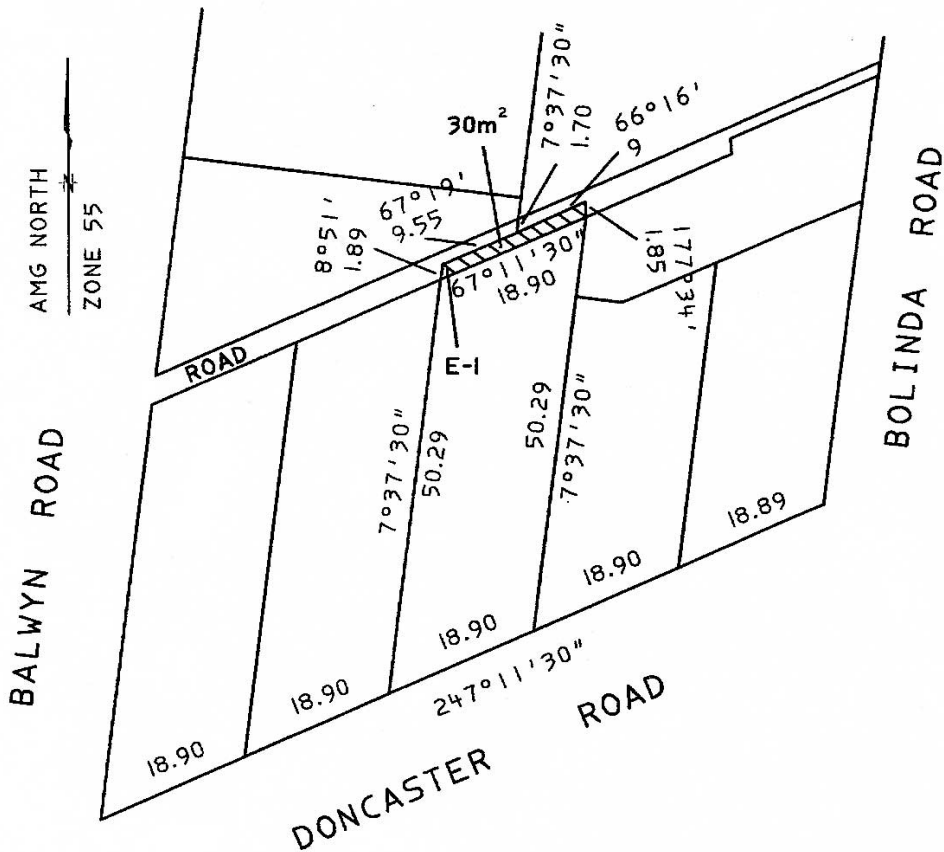

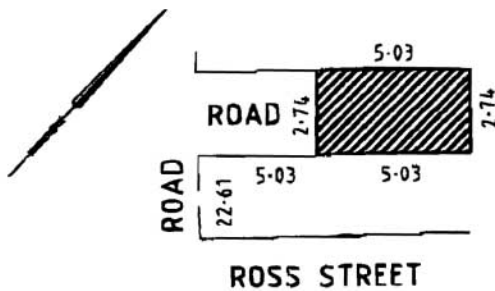

- (b) “Chinaman’s Bridge” – is the current bridge located on the Heathcote–Nagambie Road.
- (c) “Goulburn River” – is all the water between the exposed banks of the main river course.
- (d) “Goulburn Weir” is all the waters of the Weir downstream from the Goulburn River entrance to the Weir adjacent to the location known as “Verge’s Jetty”.
- (e) “Lake Nagambie” – is all the water east of an imaginary line extending from the waters edge at the northern extremity of Vickers Island to the waters edge adjacent to the prolongation of Racecourse Road, Nagambie, and east of the western entrance to the location known as the scour where it joins the Goulburn River.
- (f) “Un-powered vessel” – a vessel that does not have an engine that is used or is capable of being used for propulsion.

2. 5 knot speed restriction zones for the purposes of Clause 7.

All the waters of this Schedule are subject to a speed restriction of 5 knots between one hour after sunset and one hour before sunrise, excluding zones where the operation of vessels is prohibited.

GOULBURN RIVER (from Hughes Creek to Goulburn Weir) and GOULBURN WEIR

3. Specification of exemptions to Clauses 3(a) (5 knots within 50 metres of the waters edge) and 3(b) (5 knots within 50 metres of a fixed or floating structure).

The following waters of the Goulburn River are excluded from the provisions of Clauses 3(a) and 3(b) as described below.

- (a) The provisions of Clause 3(a) do not apply to the waters of the Goulburn River from Hughes Creek to entrance to Goulburn Weir, excluding the waters described in Item 4(a) of this Schedule.

- (b) The provisions of Clause 3(b) do not apply to the waters of the Goulburn River described in Item 8 of this Schedule in relation to fixed or floating structures associated with waterskiing activities.

- (d) From approximately 800 metres downstream of Teddy Bear Island to adjacent to Lobbs Island at the entrance to the eastern backwater and as marked by signs on or near each bank.
- (e) From the downstream extremity of Turner Island to Kirwan's Bridge and as marked by signs on or near each bank.

6. Areas where water-skiing is prohibited for the purposes of Clause 8.

The following waters are prohibited for the purposes of waterskiing.

- (a) The waters of the Goulburn River between Hughes Creek and Kirwan's Bridge, except as provided in the "exclusive use and special purpose zone" described in Item 8 of this Schedule.
- (b) All backwaters.

7. Areas where vessels are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 9.

The following waters of the Goulburn Weir are prohibited to vessels:

- (a) Between the Weir wall of the Goulburn River and the Stuart Murray Canal and a line approximately 200 metres upstream to an imaginary line between two beacons on opposite shores marked "Stop" and "Prohibited Water Beyond This Point";
- (b) Within approximately 90 metres of the Cattanach Canal Offtake and as marked by red buoys;
- (c) Within 90 metres of the Goulburn Channel Offtake and as marked by red buoys.

7A. Areas where vessels are prohibited for the purposes of Clause 9.

The provisions of Item 7A will apply between 15 January 2007 and 15 March 2007.

The following waters of Lake Nagambie and the Goulburn River are prohibited to vessels: Lake Nagambie (as defined in Schedule 91 of Notice No. 1 made under Section 15(2) of the **Marine Act 1988**):

- (a) the operation of powered vessels is prohibited on the waters of Lake Nagambie between sunrise and midday, excluding vessels engaged with coaching, safety management and rowing course maintenance; and

8. Exclusive use and special purpose areas for the purposes of Clause 13.

- (a) The waters of the Goulburn River between the "5 knot zone" described in Item 4(a)(iii) of this Schedule and approximately 1300 metres downstream from Sandy Creek and as marked at each end by signs on or near each bank are set aside exclusively for water-skiing and activities associated with waterskiing, excluding vessels transiting the zone and keeping as close as practicable to the river bank.
- (b) The application of Clause 2(c)(b) of this Notice is limited to vessels engaged in water-skiing and activities associated with water-skiing.

- (a) The waters of Lake Nagambie south and east of an imaginary line commencing at a red buoy on the north-west corner of the "No Boating Zone" as described in Item 13(a) of this Schedule, then in a north-easterly direction for approximately 200 metres to a "5 knot zone" marker buoy, then north approximately 120 metres to a "5 knot zone" marker buoy, then in a westerly direction for approximately 170 metres to a "5 knot zone" marker buoy or beacon located approximately 60 metres from the waters edge adjacent to and south-westerly of Hutton's Point, then north-westerly to a "5 knot zone" sign on the shore approximately 130 metres west of the "No Boating Zone" described in Item 13(b) of this Schedule.
- (b) All the waters of Lake Nagambie west of an imaginary line commencing from a sign adjacent to the north-western extremity of the McNamara Point boat ramp then north-westerly to a "5 knot" buoy or marker approximately 30 metres off Vickers Island and then continuing the line approximately 30 metres from the shore to the buoy marking southern boundary of the "no boating zone" described in Item 12(c) of this Schedule.
- (c) The waters of Lake Nagambie within the cove at Lobbs Point approximately 350 metres west of the northern extremity of the 5 knot zone described in Item 10(a) and as marked by 5 knot buoys, beacons or signs.

All the waters of Lake Nagambie south and east of an imaginary line extending from a sign on the foreshore at McNamara's Point and extending in a north-easterly direction to a "5 knots zone" buoy or marker approximately 60 metres south-westerly of Hutton's Point, as described in Item 10(a) of this Schedule, and the following the boundary of that "5 knot zone" to where it finishes on the foreshore at Buckley Park are set aside for –

- (a) Un-powered vessels with a draught of less than one metre; and
- (b) Vessels with a draught of less than one metre travelling at less than 5 knots directly accessing structures licensed by the Shire of Strathbogie or Goulburn Murray Water;
- (c) Vessels involved with course or waterway maintenance and management; and
- (d) The commercial vessel "Major Mitchell" when crossing the zone opposite Buckley Park.

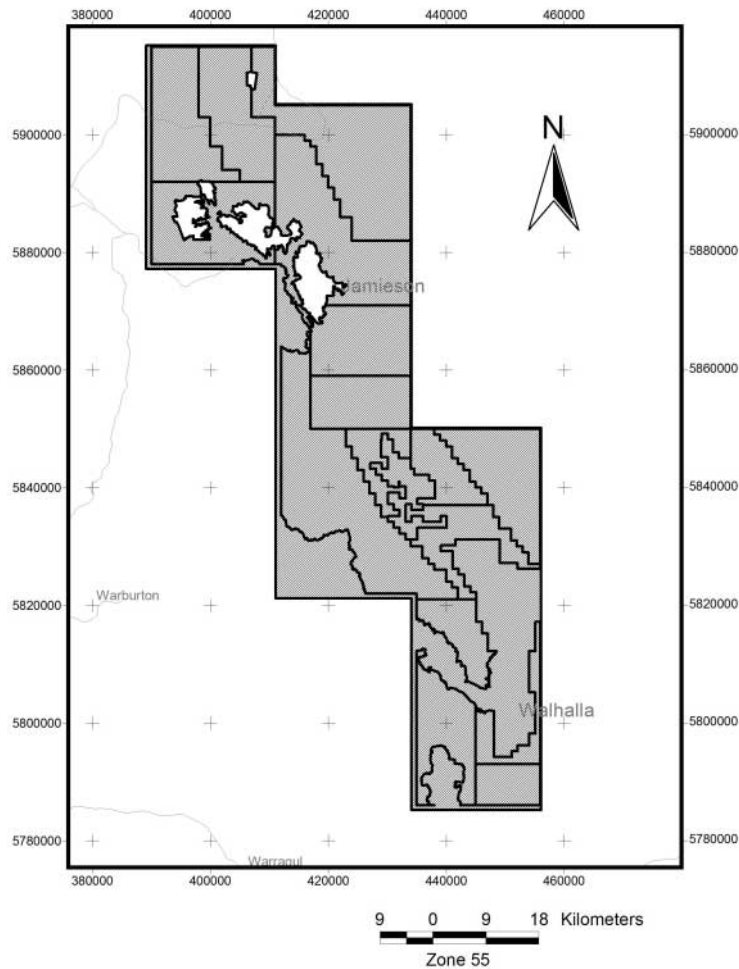

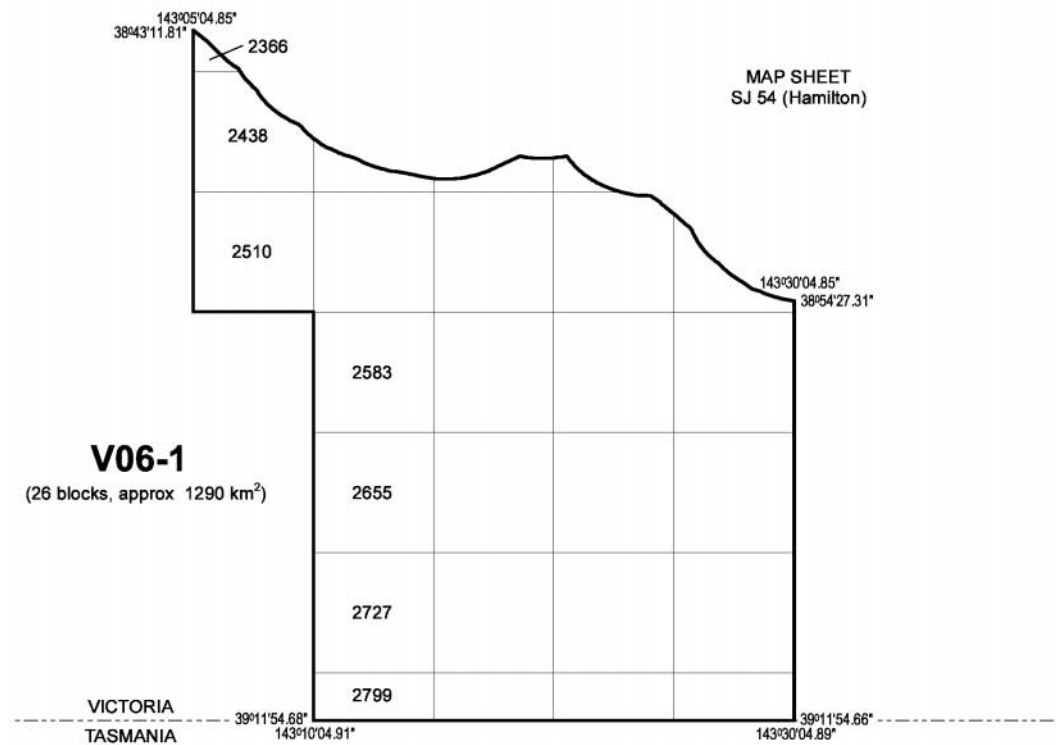

Livestock Disease Control Act 1994

EXEMPTION ORDER UNDER SECTION 6(3A)

The Governor in Council makes the following Order:

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to exempt certain classes of cattle and certain classes of person from certain identification requirements in the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994** and Livestock Disease Control Regulations 2006.

2. Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 6(3A) of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994**.

3. Revocation

The following Order is revoked –

Order of Exemption under section 6(3A) of the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994** made by the Governor in Council on 8 August 2006 and published in Government Gazette G32 on 10 August 2006 at pages 1695–1698.

4. Definitions

In this Order –

‘**Butcher’s PIC**’ means a Butcher’s Property Identification Code;

‘**Vendor Declaration**’ means –

- (a) a declaration made in relation to the movement of livestock –
 - (i) in the case of cattle, the National Vendor Declaration (Cattle) and Waybill Edition 1, and the European Union Vendor Declaration (Cattle) and Waybill Edition 1 and the National Vendor Declaration (Bobby Calves) 1st Edition.
 - (ii) in the case of sheep, the National Vendor Declaration (Sheep & Lambs) and Waybill Edition 1.
 - (iii) in the case of goats, the National Vendor Declaration (Goats) and Waybill Edition 1.
 - (iv) in the case of pigs, the Pig Pass National Vendor Declaration Edition 1; or
- (b) any other form of declaration made in relation to the movement of livestock that contains the same particulars that are contained in the declaration referred to in paragraph (a) including –
 - (i) the property identification code that identifies the property of dispatch of the livestock; and
 - (ii) the date of dispatch of the livestock; and
 - (iii) the number of livestock being dispatched; and
 - (iv) the name and signature of the person making the declaration; and
 - (v) the date the declaration is made; and
 - (vi) the intended destination of the livestock;

‘**NLIS**’ means the National Livestock Identification System;

‘**NLIS database**’ means the database system managed by Meat and Livestock Australia Ltd. for the administration of the NLIS;

‘**NLIS database account**’ means the account that enables access to the NLIS database through the NLIS internet site for the recording of cattle movement information onto the database system;

‘**NLIS device**’ means a device for the permanent identification of livestock licensed by Meat and Livestock Australia Ltd for the purpose of the NLIS;

‘Principal Scientist Livestock Quality Assurance’ means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Principal Scientist Livestock Quality Assurance in the Department of Primary Industries;

‘Regulations’ means the Livestock Disease Control Regulations 2006;

‘saleyard’ means the venue where a public auction of cattle is conducted or a public scale operation where cattle are sold;

‘Stock Agent PIC’ means a Stock Agent Property Identification Code;

‘the Act’ means the **Livestock Disease Control Act 1994**.

5. **Exemptions**

- (1) A person is exempt from the requirements of Regulations 8(b) & (d) with respect to cattle that are –
 - (a) identified with an NLIS device; and
 - (b) accompanied by an accurate and fully completed Vendor Declaration.
- (2) The owner of any cattle is exempt from the requirements of section 9A(1)(a) and 9A(1)(b) of the Act and regulation 21(1)(a) of the Regulations with respect to –
 - (a) cattle that remain continuously on their property of birth; or
 - (b) cattle that are less than 6 weeks of age that are consigned directly to a knackery for disposal; or
 - (c) cattle moved in accordance with a permit issued by an Inspector of Livestock employed by the Department of Primary Industries and accompanied by an accurate and fully completed Vendor Declaration.
- (3) The owner of any cattle is exempt from the requirements of regulation 21(1)(b) of the Regulations with respect to –
 - (a) cattle that arrive at a knackery or abattoir; or
 - (b) cattle that arrive at a saleyard where the saleyard operator or scale operator holds a current permit issued by the Principal Scientist Livestock Quality Assurance on the basis that the facilities at the saleyard are not suitable to safely apply NLIS devices to cattle; or
 - (c) cattle that have been identified with an NLIS device.
- (4) A person is exempt from the requirements of section 9A(2) of the Act in the case of cattle identified by an NLIS device, where –
 - (a) the microchip within the NLIS device cannot be electronically read using a correctly functioning and tested reader and the device was not deliberately damaged; and
 - (b) a record is kept of the property identification code and the individual number on the tag on the identification device; and
 - (c) replacement tag or identification device is immediately attached to the cattle in accordance with section 9A(1) of the Act and regulation 21 of the Regulations; and
 - (d) the information on the microchip and the property identification code and the number identifying the individual cattle printed on the replacement tag or identification device is provided to the Secretary or the NLIS database administrator of Meat & Livestock Australia Limited within 24 hours in the manner required by the Secretary; and
 - (e) a written record is kept by the person of all details and relevant circumstances in relation to the removal of the tag.

- (5) Where cattle are exhibited for sale at a saleyard with an NLIS device with a number that cannot be read electronically, a selling agent or scale operator is exempt from the requirements of section 9(b) of the Act if –
- (a) the cattle are identified prior to leaving the saleyard with a blue tail tag supplied by the Secretary and bearing an identification code assigned by the Secretary to the selling agent or scale operator; and
 - (b) the requirements of sub-clause (7) are complied with.
- (6) Where cattle are exhibited for sale at a saleyard and have arrived at the saleyard without an NLIS device, a selling agent or scale operator is exempt from the requirements of section 9(b) of the Act –
- (a) if –
 - (i) cattle are identified before sale with an NLIS device bearing a property identification code allocated to that saleyard under section 9B of the Act; and
 - (ii) the requirements of sub-clause (7) are complied with; or
 - (b) if in the case of a bull considered unsafe to apply an NLIS device at the saleyards or scales –
 - (i) the bull is identified before sale with a blue tail tag supplied by the Secretary and bearing an identification code assigned by the Secretary to the selling agent or scale operator; and
 - (ii) the bull is sold for slaughter; and
 - (iii) the requirements of sub-clause 7 are complied with; or
 - (c) where the facilities are not suitable to safely apply NLIS devices to cattle, and a permit has been issued to the saleyard operator or scale operator by the Principal Scientist Livestock Quality Assurance on that basis, if –
 - (i) the cattle are identified prior to leaving the saleyard with a blue tail tag supplied by the Secretary and bearing an identification code assigned by the Secretary to the selling agent or scale operator; and
 - (ii) the requirements of sub-clause (7) are complied with.
- (7) For the purposes of sub-clauses 5(b) and 6(b), the following details are to be recorded by the selling agent or scale operator by close of business on the day the device or tag is applied –
- (i) the property identification code of the property from which the cattle were dispatched; and
 - (ii) the name and address of the person who dispatched the cattle; and
 - (iii) the number on the device or tag applied; and
 - (iv) the date on which the device or tag was applied.
- (8) A record of details made for the purposes of sub-clause (7) must be kept for 2 years.
- (9) A person subject to the requirements of section 94A(2)(b) who is a stock and station agent or is purchasing cattle intended for slaughter within 7 days is exempt from complying with regulation 57(c)(ii) where that person, or his or her representative –
- (a) has applied for and been allocated a property identification code by the Secretary that is –
 - (i) in the case of a stock and station agent, a Stock Agent PIC; or
 - (ii) in the case of a person purchasing cattle intended for slaughter within 7 days, a Butcher's PIC; and

- (b) provides the code referred to in paragraph (a) to the auctioneer or scale operator selling the cattle in place of the property identification code or the property on which the cattle are to be kept after the purchase; and
 - (c) holds a current NLIS database account with the administrator of the NLIS database.
- (10) A person to which sub-clause (9) applies must ensure that, where the cattle are not slaughtered within 7 days, the NLIS database is notified of the property identification code of the property to which the cattle were first taken after their purchase.
- (11) A person who carries on business as a cattle scale operator is exempt from regulation 61(b)(ii) where the scale operator provides the Stock Agent PIC or Butcher's PIC (if provided by the purchaser of the cattle) to the Secretary or a person nominated by the Secretary for the purposes of regulation 61, by close of business on the next day after the cattle are sold.
- (12) A person who conducts a public auction of cattle, other than at a saleyard, is exempt from regulation 62(b)(ii) where the auctioneer provides the Stock Agent PIC or Butcher's PIC (if provided by the purchaser of the cattle) to the Secretary or a person nominated by the Secretary for the purposes of regulation 62 by close of business on the next day after the cattle are sold.
- (13) A person who conducts a public auction of cattle at a saleyard is exempt from regulation 63(1)(a)(iii) where the auctioneer provides the Stock Agent PIC or Butcher's PIC (if provided by the purchaser of the cattle) to the person nominated by the Secretary, for the purposes of regulation 63, by midday on the next day after the cattle are sold.
- (14) A person who operates a saleyard at which cattle are sold or passed in is exempt from regulation 64(b)(ii) where the saleyard operator provides the Stock Agent PIC or Butcher's PIC (if provided by the purchaser of the cattle) to the Secretary or a person nominated by the Secretary, for the purposes of regulation 64, by close of business on the next day after the cattle are sold or passed in.
- (15) The operator of a knackery is exempt from section 94B(a)(ii) of the Act for cattle slaughtered or disposed of prior to 1 July 2007 provided the operator records the following details for each head of cattle –
- (a) the name and address of the person who owns or is responsible for the cattle; and
 - (b) the location of the property from which the cattle are collected; and
 - (c) the date of slaughter or disposal; and
 - (d) the details of the number identifying the individual cattle.
- (16) A record of details made for the purposes of sub-clause (15) must be kept for 2 years.
- (17) The operator of a knackery is exempt from section 94B(a)(iv) of the Act.
