

- 2. resolved to discontinue the road and sell by private treaty to the abutting property owners subject to any requirements by public authorities.



Proposed Review of a Road Management Plan

Public Notice Inviting Submissions

In accordance with the provisions of the **Road Management Act 2004** and the Road Management (General) Regulations 2005, the City of Casey gives notice of its intention to review its Road Management Plan and invites public submissions on the proposed review. The City of Casey Road Management Plan was adopted on 21 December 2004 and applies to all roads within the City of Casey's boundaries for which the Council is the Responsible Road Authority, as identified in the Council's register of public roads.

The Casey City Council has recently adopted its Civil Infrastructure Asset Management Plan, which documents the tactics used by the Council to manage its road-related assets taking into account risk, customer expectations, affordability and changes forecast over the next 20 years. A summary document has been prepared which provides background for the proposed review of the Council's Road Management Plan.

The purpose of the review is to:

a) remove background information from the Road Management Plan that is now included in the Summary of the Civil Infrastructure Asset Management Plan, with the Road Management Plan focussing on the standards, policies and management system that the Council uses to inspect, maintain and repair the public roads for which it is responsible, and b) revise inspection schedules and intervention levels to reflect the Asset Management Plan processes and changes in operational practices.

VICTORIA PLANNING PROVISIONS

Notice of Approval of Amendment Amendment VC38

The Minister for Planning has approved Amendment VC38 to the Victoria Planning Provisions and all planning schemes in Victoria, except the Port of Melbourne Planning Scheme.

The Amendment comes into operation on the date this notice is published in the Government Gazette.

The Amendment changes the Victoria Planning Provisions (VPP) and planning schemes by amending:

- Clause 15.09 of the State Planning Policy Framework (SPPF): Planning and responsible authorities must have regard to Victoria's Native Vegetation Management – A Framework for Action (the Framework) and the three-step approach of 'avoid', 'minimise' and 'offset' is explained in more detail. The clause also encourages the use of property vegetation plans and native vegetation precinct plans.
- Clause 52.17 of the Particular Provisions: The purpose of the clause requires consideration of the three-step approach and encourages the use of two new planning tools: native vegetation precinct plans and property vegetation plans. The first is a tool for managing the removal and protection of native vegetation in an area or precinct; the second is a tool for managing native vegetation at a property scale. Exemptions from the permit requirements of the clause are now included in a table and minimum permit application requirements have been introduced. The decision guidelines have also been repackaged to strengthen the consideration of land protection, conservation significance and offset matters.
- Clause 66.02 of the General Provisions:
 This clause now requires more complex permit applications for native vegetation removal to be referred to the Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE), and facilitates a simpler assessment of those applications that do not need to be referred. An application now needs to be referred to DSE if:

- more than 5 large scattered native trees are to be removed.
- more than 15 small scattered native trees are to be removed.
- more than 0.5 hectare of native vegetation in an EVC with a Bioregional Conservation Status (BCS) of endangered, vulnerable or rare is to be removed.
- more than 1 hectare of native vegetation in an EVC with a BCS of depleted or least concern is to be removed.
- a property vegetation plan applies to the site
- the vegetation is on Crown land which is occupied or managed by the responsible authority.
- Clause 72 General terms of the Definitions: Introduces a new definition for 'property vegetation plan'.
