ORDER DECLARING A RESTRICTED AREA AT MYRTLEFORD FOR THE CONTROL OF QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY

I, Bob Cameron, Minister for Agriculture, under sections 20 and 22 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** make the following Order declaring a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly and specifying the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at Myrtleford, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under sections 20 and 22 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order—

“**Act**” means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**; and

“**Queensland fruit fly**” means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

“**Queensland fruit fly host material**” means any fruit or vegetable listed as a host of Queensland fruit fly in Schedule 5 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Regulations 1996.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 1.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) This order does not apply to Queensland fruit fly host material grown within the restricted area if accompanied by –
 - (a) an assurance certificate issued by a person who is accredited by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) a plant health certificate issued by an authorised inspector – certifying that the Queensland fruit fly host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.
- (2) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.
- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 2 must give access to such land at all times to an inspector, after 24 hours notice is given to the occupier or if the occupier consents to the entry, for the purpose of inspection, placing on such land any lures or traps, applying on such land any spray material or bait and performing any other actions in accordance with the Act which in the opinion of the inspector are necessary for the eradication or prevention of the spread of the pest.

SPECIAL

- (4) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 2, on instruction from an inspector, must strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

Schedule 1

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the Great Alpine Way and Pound Lane, then heading in a southerly direction along Pound Lane to the intersection of Pound Lane and Paddy Gully Road, then in a straight line in a southerly direction to the intersection of Whorouly–Bowmans Road and Whorouly Road, then in a southerly direction along Whorouly Road to the intersection of Whorouly Road and Snow Road, then in a north-westerly direction along Snow Road to the intersection of Snow Road and Racecourse Road, then in a generally westerly direction along Racecourse Road, which becomes Kneebones Gap Road, to the intersection of Kneebones Gap Road and Monument Lane, then in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the intersection of Whorouly South Road and Carboor–Whorouly Road, then in a southerly direction along Carboor–Whorouly Road to the intersection of Carboor–Whorouly Road and Whorouly South Road, then in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the intersection of Bread and Butter Gap Road and Hallet Road, then in a straight line in a south-easterly direction to the intersection of Buffalo River Road and Long Corner Creek Road, then in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the intersection of the Great Alpine Way and Wobonga Lane, then in a straight line in a northerly direction to the intersection of Happy Valley Road and Havilah Road, then in a generally northerly direction along Happy Valley Road to the intersection of Happy Valley Road and Cartwrights Lane, then in a straight line in a northerly direction to the intersection of Byers Lane and Pini Lane, then in a westerly direction along Pini Lane to the intersection of Pini Lane and Blacks Flat Road, then in a northerly direction along Blacks Flat Road to the intersection of Blacks Flat Road and Woodsides Lane, then in a northerly direction along Woodsides Lane to the intersection of Woodsides Lane and Barwidgee Lane, then in a westerly direction along Barwidgee Lane to the intersection of Barwidgee Lane and Myrtleford–Yackandandah Road, then in a north-easterly direction along Myrtleford–Yackandandah Road to the intersection of Myrtleford–Yackandandah Road and Tunnel Gap Road, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the intersection of Granite Creek Road and Circular Creek Road, then in a north-westerly direction along Circular Creek Road to the intersection of Circular Creek Road and Myrtleford–Stanley Road, then in a straight line in a westerly direction to the intersection of Buckland Gap Road and Lee Morrison Road, then in a westerly direction along Lee Morrison Road to the intersection of Lee Morrison Road and Chinaman Flat Road, then in a southerly direction along Chinaman Flat Road to the intersection of Chinaman Flat Road and Murrungee Road, then in a generally westerly direction along Murrungee Road to the intersection of Murrungee Road and Bowmans Road, then in a southerly direction along Bowmans Road to the intersection of Bowmans Road and Bobby Lane, then in a westerly direction along Bobby Lane to the intersection of Bobby Lane and Ferguson Lane, then in a southerly direction along Ferguson Lane to the intersection of Ferguson Lane and the Great Alpine Way, then in a westerly direction along the Great Alpine Way to the point of commencement.

Schedule 2

The area of land in Victoria within a radius of one and a half kilometres of the outbreak epicentre at 146.73165° East, 36.55440° South.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly in Victoria, near Tocumwal (NSW), and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under sections 20 and 22 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order—

“**Act**” means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**; and

“**Queensland fruit fly**” means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

“**Queensland fruit fly host material**” means any fruit or vegetable listed as a host of Queensland fruit fly in Schedule 5 of the Plant Health and Plant Products Regulations 1996.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 1.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) This order does not apply to Queensland fruit fly host material grown within the restricted area if accompanied by—
 - (a) an assurance certificate issued by a person who is accredited by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) a plant health certificate issued by an authorised inspector certifying that the Queensland fruit fly host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards;
- (2) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.

Schedule 1

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection the Murray River and Yarrawonga–Cobram Road, then in a westerly direction along Yarrawonga–Cobram Road to the intersection of Yarrawonga–Cobram Road and Campbell Road, then in a southerly direction along Campbell Road to the intersection of Campbell Road and the Murray Valley Highway, then in a generally north-westerly direction along the Murray Valley Highway to the intersection of the Murray Valley Highway and Cobram South Road, then in a southerly direction along Cobram South Road to the intersection of Cobram South Road and Pullar Road, then in a westerly direction along Pullar Road to the intersection of Pullar Road and Benalla–Tocumwal Road, then in a north-westerly direction along Benalla–Tocumwal Road to the intersection of Benalla–Tocumwal Road and

Macarthur Road, then in a westerly direction along Macarthur Road to the intersection of Macarthur Road and Kakoda Road, then in a southerly direction along Kakoda Road to the intersection of Kakoda Road and Macarthur Road, then in a westerly direction along Macarthur Road to the intersection of Macarthur Road and Labuan Road, then in a northerly direction along Lauban Road to the intersection of Lauban Road and the Murray Valley Highway, then in a westerly direction along the Murray Valley Highway to the intersection of the Murray Valley Highway and Mywee Road, then in a northerly direction along Mywee Road to the intersection of Mywee Road and Bearii East Road, then in a westerly direction along Bearii East Road to the intersection of Bearii East Road and Ulupna Bridge Road, then in a northerly direction along Ulupna Bridge Road to the intersection of Ulupna Bridge Road and Bearii–Mywee Road, then in a westerly direction along Bearii–Mywee Road to the intersection of Bearii–Mywee Road and Rockliffs Road, then in a generally northerly direction along Rockliffs Road to the intersection of Rockliffs Road and the Murray River, then in a generally easterly direction along the Murray River to the point of commencement.
