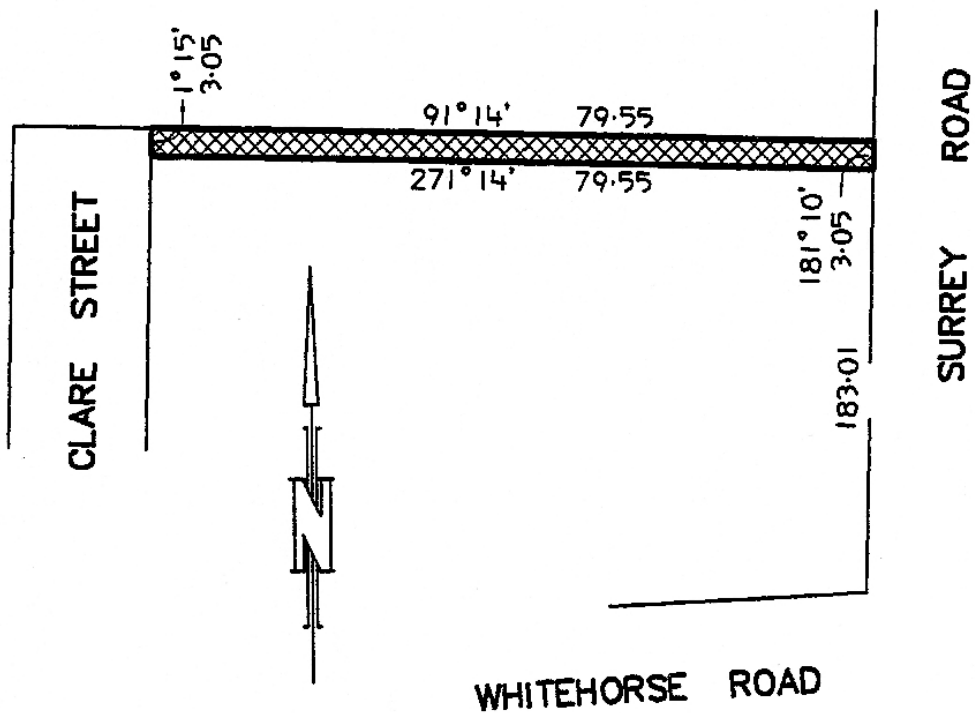

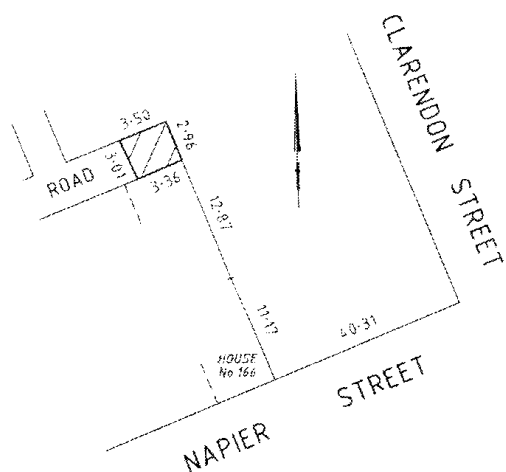

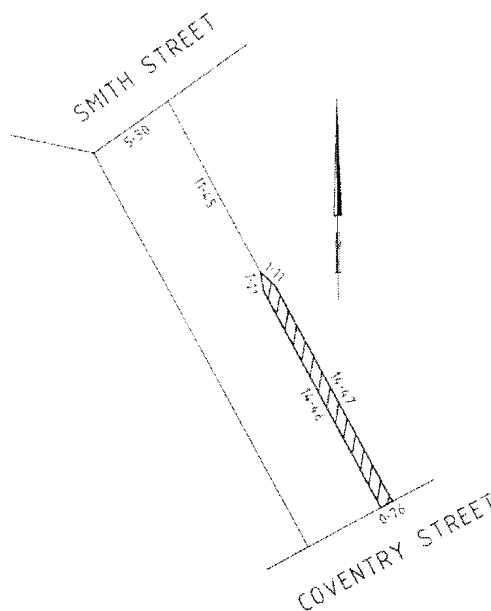

Proposed New Local Law Number One Processes of Municipal Government (Meeting Procedures) 2006

Pursuant to Section 119(2) of the **Local Government Act 1989**, it is advised that Mansfield Shire Council, at its meeting on Tuesday 18 April 2006, resolved to give notice of its intention to make a new Local Law Number One – Processes of Municipal Government (Meeting Procedures) Local Law 2006.

The objectives of this Local Law are to:

- a) facilitate the good government of the Council through its formal meeting procedures, and to ensure effective and efficient Council decisions are made in a manner which is consistent with the role of local government within the Australian system of government; and
- b) promote and encourage community participation in the system of local government by providing mechanisms for the Council to ascertain the community's views and expectations; and
- c) regulate and control the election of the Mayor, the Deputy Mayor and the Chairperson of any Special Committee; and
- d) regulate and control the procedures governing the conduct of meetings including:

- i) the notice required for meetings; and
 - ii) the keeping of minutes; and
- e) regulate the use of the common seal; and
 - f) provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions; and
 - g) provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the municipal district.

ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING THE ENTRY OF PLANTS, PLANT PRODUCTS AND AGRICULTURAL EQUIPMENT TO PREVENT THE ENTRY OF BLUEBERRY RUST INTO VICTORIA

I, Bob Cameron, Minister for Agriculture, make the following Order:

Minister For Agriculture

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to prevent the introduction of the fungus blueberry rust (*Pucciniastrum vaccinii*) into Victoria.

2. Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 24 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Revocation

The Order made under Section 24 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** on 2 May 2005 to prevent the entry of blueberry rust into Victoria, and published in Government Gazette S82 on 5 May 2005, is revoked.

4. Definitions

In this Order—

“**blueberry rust**” means the exotic disease caused by the fungus *Pucciniastrum vaccinii*;

“blueberry rust host plant” means any plant or plant product of the following genera: *Vaccinium* (including blueberry, cranberry and huckleberry), *Gaylussacia* (black huckleberry), *Tsuga* (hemlock), *Rhododendron* (including azalea), *Lyonia*, *Menziesia*, *Pernettya*, *Hugeria*, *Pieris*, *Leucothoe*, *Oxycoccus*;

“Manager, Plant Standards” means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager, Plant Standards in the Department of Primary Industries.

5. ***Controls applying to blueberry rust host material and agricultural equipment***

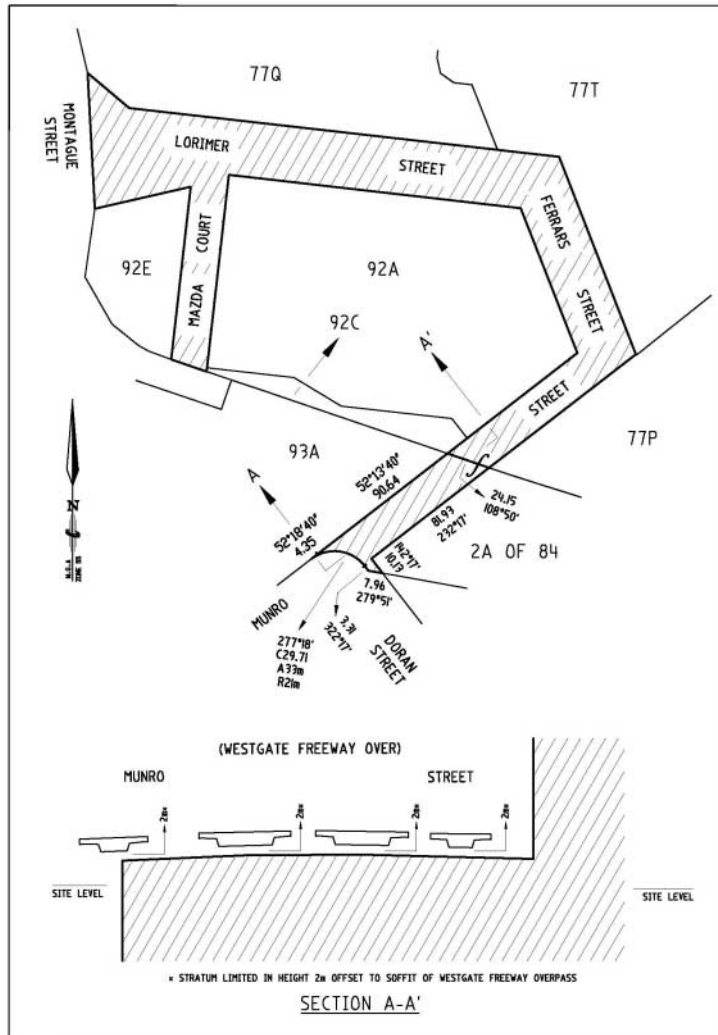
- (1) The entry or importation into Victoria of—
 - (a) any blueberry rust host plant; or
 - (b) any agricultural equipment or package used in the propagation, cultivation, harvesting, or processing of any blueberry rust host plant— is prohibited.
- (2) Sub-clause (1) does not apply if—
 - (a) the blueberry rust host plant (other than a plant of the *Vaccinium* genus) was grown, or the agricultural equipment or packages were last used, on a property that is located—
 - (i) in a State or Territory or part of a State or Territory for which an area freedom certificate, issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory where the plant or plant product was grown or the agricultural equipment or used packages were last used, is currently in force certifying that the State or Territory or part of the State or Territory is known to be free of blueberry rust; or
 - (ii) more than 200 km from a detection of blueberry rust; or
 - (b) the blueberry rust host plant, agricultural equipment or package is accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person, an assurance certificate issued by a person who is accredited by the department responsible for agriculture in the affected State or Territory, or a plant health certificate issued by an officer of the department responsible for agriculture in the affected State or Territory in which the plant or plant product was grown or packed, or the agricultural equipment or packages were last used, certifying that—
 - (i) in the case of fruit of the *Vaccinium* genus, the fruit has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager, Plant Standards; and
 - (ii) in the case of plants or plant products of the *Vaccinium* genus the plants or plant products have been treated in accordance with conditions detailed in a permit issued by the Manager Plant Standards; and
 - (iii) in the case of blueberry rust host plants (other than plants of *Vaccinium* genus), the plants or plant products have been inspected within 14 days prior to dispatch to Victoria, and no blueberry rust is detected; and
 - (iv) in the case of agricultural equipment and packages, the equipment and packages have been cleaned free of soil and organic matter and treated in a manner approved by the Manager, Plant Standards.

Note: Section 25 of the Act provides that a person is guilty of an offence and a penalty not exceeding 200 penalty units for knowingly breaching an Importation Order.
