#### Accident Compensation (WorkCover Insurance) Act 1993

#### WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 14) 2006/2007

The Governor in Council, on the recommendation of the Victorian WorkCover Authority, under section 15 of the **Accident Compensation** (**WorkCover Insurance**) **Act 1993**, makes the following Order:

#### 1. Citation

This Order may be cited as the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 14) 2006/2007.

#### 2. Application

This Order comes into operation on 30 June 2006.

#### 3. Calculation of Premium

- (1) This Order specifies the methods to be used in calculating the premiums payable by employers for WorkCover insurance policies in force in respect of policy periods commencing on and after 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2006 and before 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2007.
- (2) In this Order, premium includes adjusted premium.
- (3) For the avoidance of doubt, numbers used for the purposes of a calculation or comparison under this Order may be expressed as or converted to a percentage or a decimal number.

#### 4. Definitions

- (1) In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears, terms have the same meaning as they have in the Act and the WorkCover Insurance Act (as the case may be).
- (2) In this Order:
- "actual workplace", in relation to an employer, has the meaning given by sub-item 2(1)(a) of schedule 1;
- **"applicable premium rate"** means whichever of the current risk calculated rate and the new risk calculated rate applies;

- "authorised agent" means a person appointed as an authorised agent:
  - (a) under section 32 of the Act as in force before 1 December 1992; or
  - (b) under section 23 of the Act as in force on and after that date;
- **"buy-out premium"** is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 14:
- "cappable premium" is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 8:

#### "cappable workplace" means:

- (a) an imputed workplace of an employer; or
- (b) a current risk workplace;
- "claims reporting period" means the period commencing 1 July 2003 and ending on 31 March 2006;
- "clause 22 predecessor employer", in relation to an employer, means another employer who is a predecessor employer of the first-mentioned employer as a result of a determination under clause 22;
- "collapsed split workplace" means a workplace of an employer which comprises two or more contiguous areas each of which was for the purposes of the 2003/2004 Premiums Order treated as a separate workplace of that employer in accordance with subitem 3(8) of schedule 1 to that Order;
- "comparative rate", in relation to an employer, is the rate calculated in accordance with schedule 4;
- "constituent workplace" has the meaning given by sub-item 2(5) of schedule 1:
- "current policy period" means the period of 12 months commencing at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2006 and ending at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2007.
- "current risk calculated rate" is the rate calculated in accordance with sub-clause 10(3) or 11(3) (as the case may be, determined in accordance with clause 9);
- "current risk period of coverage" has the meaning given in item 9 of schedule 1;
- "current risk workplace" means a workplace in respect of which the first period of coverage during the current policy period is a current risk period of coverage;
- "current workplace" means a workplace which is a workplace during the current policy period;

- "default rate" is the rate for the current policy period determined by the Authority itself to be the default rate, and notified in the Government Gazette during the current policy period;
- **"employer"** has the same meaning as in sub-section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act except where otherwise provided;
- "employer performance rating" is the rate calculated in accordance with clause 12:
- "establishment" has the same meaning as in section 181 of the Act as in force before the commencement of section 78 of the Accident Compensation (Amendment) Act 1994;
- "experience period workplace", in relation to an employer, means and includes:
  - (a) a current workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) which was a workplace of that employer at any time during the preceding triennium;
  - (b) any workplace (other than a workplace that has been included under paragraph (a) of this definition) that was a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) at any time during the preceding triennium; and
  - (c) any workplace other than a workplace identified in (a) or (b) above which was a workplace of another employer at any time during the preceding triennium and which is a predecessor workplace in relation to:
    - (i) a workplace referred to in (a) or (b) of this definition; or
    - (ii) a current workplace of the employer;
- "group employer" means an employer determined by the Authority to be a group employer in accordance with sub-clause 20(2);
- "grouped workplace" has the meaning given by sub-item 2(5) of schedule 1;
- "imputed workplace", in relation to an employer, has the meaning given by sub-item 2(1)(b) of schedule 1;
- "industry claims cost rate", in relation to a workplace, is the rate determined in accordance with item 8 of schedule 1;
- "industry classification", in relation to a workplace, is the classification determined in accordance with item 7 of schedule 1;
- "industry rate", in relation to a workplace, is the rate determined in accordance with item 8 of schedule 1;

- "labour hire", in relation to an employer, means the supply, whether directly or indirectly, of the labour of one or more workers employed by the employer, not being a supply of labour determined by the Authority to be a supply of labour in connection with:
  - (a) the performance by the employer of a specified task;
  - (b) the discharge by the employer of a specified function; or
  - (c) the achievement by the employer of a specified outcome;
- **"labour hire client"**, in relation to an employer, means a person to whom the employer provides labour hire;
- "last period of coverage", in relation to a workplace, means the last period of coverage of that workplace during the preceding policy period;
- "new risk calculated rate" is the rate calculated in accordance with sub-clauses 10(2) or 11(2) (as the case may be, determined in accordance with clause 9);
- "new risk period of coverage" has the meaning given by item 9 of schedule 1;
- "new risk premium" is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 7:
- **"period of coverage"** means the period during a policy period for which a workplace remains in the same industry classification;
- "policy period" has the same meaning as in sub-section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act:
- "preceding policy period" means the period of 12 months commencing at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2005 and ending at 4.00 p.m. on 30 June 2006;
- "preceding triennium" means the period of three years ending on 30 June 2006;

### "predecessor employer" means:

- in relation to a workplace which has a predecessor workplace in respect of a specified period, a person who was an employer in relation to that predecessor workplace during that period; or
- (b) a clause 22 predecessor employer;
- "predecessor workplace" has the meaning given by sub-item 6(3) of schedule 1;
- "predominant activity" has the meaning given by item 3 of schedule 1;
- "premium" is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 5;

#### "rateable remuneration":

- has the same meaning as in sub-section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act; and
- if used in relation to a period, has the meaning which applied under sub-section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act in respect of that period;
- "recoveries" has the meaning given by item 6 of schedule 2;
- "relationship of control" means a relationship to which item 6(9) of schedule 1 applies;
- "remuneration", in relation to a period of coverage, has the meaning given by item 4 of schedule 1;
- "TAC claim" means a claim in respect of injury or death for which compensation is required under the Act to be paid and which arises out of a transport accident within the meaning of section 3 of the **Transport Accident Act 1986** on or after 1 July 2000;
- "the 2003/2004 Premiums Order" means the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 11) 2003/2004;
- "the 2004/2005 Premiums Order" means the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 12) 2004/2005;
- "the 2005/2006 Premiums Order" means the WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 13) 2005/2006;
- "the Act" means the Accident Compensation Act 1985;
- "the Authority" means the Victorian WorkCover Authority;
- "the WorkCover Insurance Act" means the Accident Compensation (WorkCover Insurance) Act 1993;
- "total cost of claims" has the meaning given by item 1 of schedule 2;
- "unrelated predecessor workplace" means a workplace of an employer which was the predecessor of another workplace in accordance with a previous Premiums Order and which is not in the current policy period a predecessor workplace in relation to that other workplace;
- "weighted industry rate", in relation to an employer, is the rate calculated in accordance with clause 13;
- "WorkCover industry classification" means a classification contained in schedule 5:
- "WorkCover insurance policy" has the same meaning as in subsection 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act;
- "WorkCover premium" is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 6;
- "worker" has the same meaning as in sub-section 5(1) of the Act;

#### "workers employed by the employer" includes:

- (a) a worker deemed by the Act to be working under a contract of service with an employer; and
- (b) a person deemed by sub-section 9(2) of the Act to be a worker in relation to a person deemed by that provision to be an employer;

"workplace", in relation to an employer, has the meaning given by item 2 of schedule 1.

#### 5. Basic Formula

The premium payable by an employer is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$P = (WP + B) \times G$$

where:

P is the premium payable;

WP is the WorkCover premium;

- B is the buy-out premium, if any;
- G is 1.1 (being the factor to provide for the inclusion of the Goods and Services Tax in relation to the premium).

#### 6. WorkCover Premium

(1) Unless sub-clause (2) applies, the WorkCover premium (WP) of an employer is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

WP =

- (a) NRP + CP D; or
- (b) \$135

whichever is the greater;

where:

NRP is the employer's new risk premium;

- CP is the employer's cappable premium;
- D represents the remuneration deductible benefit, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$D = (NRP + CP) \times 15,500 \times N \times$$

where:

EMPR<sub>0</sub> is the sum of the remuneration for all periods of coverage at all workplaces of the employer during the current policy period;

N is the number of days in the current policy period in respect of which the employer has maintained and/or is likely to maintain a WorkCover insurance policy.

#### (2) If:

- (a) the WorkCover premium is calculated before the earliest date at which both the industry rates and industry claims cost rates for the policy period have been published in the Government Gazette ("the publication date"); and
- (b) it is not otherwise possible to calculate the premium in accordance with sub-clause (1),

then this sub-clause shall apply and the WorkCover premium shall be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

WP =

- (i) Y; or
- (ii) \$135

whichever is the greater;

where:

Y is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each period of coverage during the current policy period at each workplace of the employer –

 $\operatorname{IR}_{\text{TEMP}} x \operatorname{R}_{\text{COV}}$ 

where:

IR<sub>TEMP</sub> is the industry rate that would apply if the industry classification for that workplace during the period of coverage were governed by schedule 5 to the 2005/2006 Premiums Order;

R<sub>COV</sub> is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace.

(3) For the avoidance of doubt, any premium calculated before the publication date may be adjusted after that date.

#### 7. New Risk Premium

The new risk premium for an employer is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each workplace (other than an imputed workplace) of the employer in respect of each new risk period of coverage at that workplace during the current policy period:

 $R_{COV} x NRC^R$ 

where:

 $R_{COV}$  is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace;

NRC<sup>R</sup> is the new risk calculated rate for the period of coverage at the workplace.

#### 8. Cappable Premium

(1) The cappable premium for an employer is calculated as:

$$CP = {}_{CW}R_0 \times CP^R$$

where:

 $_{\rm CW}R_{_0}$  is the sum of the remuneration for all periods of coverage at all cappable workplaces of the employer during the current policy period;

CP<sup>R</sup> is the employer's cappable premium rate, calculated in accordance with sub-clause (2) of this clause.

- (2) An employer's cappable premium rate is calculated as follows:
  - (a) Subject to sub-clause (2)(c), if:
    - (i)  $C^R$ >comparative rate x 1.3; and
    - (ii) the employer was an employer, or a predecessor employer was an employer, in relation to a workplace in the preceding policy period,

then  $CP^R$  = comparative rate x 1.3

where  $C^R$  is calculated in accordance with sub-clause 2(b);

(b) C<sup>R</sup> is the rate calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$C^{R} = \frac{CRC^{R} \times {}_{CR}R_{0} + ICP}{{}_{CW}R_{0}}$$

where:

CRC<sup>R</sup> is the employer's current risk calculated rate;

 $_{\rm CR}R_0$  is the sum of the remuneration for all current risk periods of coverage at all workplaces of the employer during the current policy period;

ICP is the employer's imputed cappable premium calculated by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each period of coverage at each imputed workplace of the employer during the current policy period:

$$R_{COV} x NRC^R$$

where:

R<sub>COV</sub> is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace;

NRC<sup>R</sup> is the new risk calculated rate for the period of coverage at the workplace;

is the sum of the remuneration for all periods of coverage at all cappable workplaces of the employer during the current policy period;

- (c) If:
  - (i) sub-clause (2)(a) does not apply, or
  - (ii) the employer's comparative rate is 0 (zero), is an infinite amount or cannot be calculated,

then  $CP^R = C^R$ ,

where  $C^R$  is calculated in accordance with sub-clause (2)(b), above.

#### 9. Premium Rate Calculation Method

- (1) Where an employer's total remuneration for the preceding policy period, as calculated in accordance with sub-clause (2), is:
  - (a) less than or equal to \$200,000, the applicable premium rate shall be calculated in accordance with the Small Employer Method (set out in clause 10);
  - (b) greater than \$200,000, the applicable premium rate shall be calculated in accordance with the Experience Rated Method (set out in clause 11).
- (2) An employer's total remuneration (T) is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$T = R^1 \times \underbrace{365}_{N_1}$$

where:

R<sup>1</sup> is the sum of:

- (a) total rateable remuneration of the employer, and any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer and any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2), for the preceding policy period; and
- (b) the remuneration (if any) of a predecessor employer (other than remuneration that is otherwise included in the calculation of R<sup>1</sup> for this policy period for the employer) during the preceding policy period in respect of operations carried out during any period of coverage at any workplace which:
  - (i) is a current workplace of the employer; and/or
  - (ii) was a workplace of the employer during the preceding policy period;

- N<sub>1</sub> is the number of days during the preceding policy period on which a WorkCover insurance policy was in force in respect of:
  - (i) any workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2); or
  - (ii) any predecessor workplace mentioned in paragraph (b),

but if  $N_1$  equals 0 (zero) it is deemed to be 1.

#### 10. Small Employer Method

(1) Where this clause applies, the applicable new risk calculated rate will be determined in accordance with sub-clause (2) and the applicable current risk calculated rate will be determined in accordance with sub-clause (3).

#### New Risk Calculated Rate

(2) The new risk calculated rate (NRC<sup>R</sup>) for a period of coverage is calculated as:

 $NRC^{R} = IR$ ,

where:

IR is the industry rate for that workplace for that period of coverage.

#### Current Risk Calculated Rate

(3) Subject to sub-clauses (4) and (5), the current risk calculated rate (CRC<sup>R</sup>) is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

 $CRC^R = WIR$ ,

where:

WIR means the employer's weighted industry rate.

- (4) If:
  - (a) the employer's comparative rate is less than the employer's weighted industry rate; and

#### either:

- (b) the current risk calculated rate for the employer for the purposes of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order was calculated in accordance with clause 10(4) or clause 11 of that Order, or
- (c) C for the employer has a value greater than 0 (zero) and the employer's current risk calculated rate in the preceding policy period was calculated in accordance with clause 10(3)(i) of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order,

then CRC<sup>R</sup> is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

 $CRC^{R}$  = comparative rate + (WIR – comparative rate) x 0.5.

where:

WIR means the employer's weighted industry rate.

- (5) If:
  - (a) the employer's comparative rate is less than the employer's weighted industry rate; and
  - (b) C for the employer has a value of 0 (zero) or less than 0 (zero); and
  - (c) either:
    - (i) the employer's current risk calculated rate and/or the new risk calculated rate for any workplace of the employer in the preceding policy period was or were calculated in accordance with clause 11 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order and C¹ for the employer has a value of 0 (zero) or less than 0 (zero); or
    - the employer's current risk calculated rate in the preceding policy period was calculated in accordance with clause 10(3)(i) of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order,

where:

- C has the meaning given in sub-clause 12(1); and
- C¹ means the value of C for the employer in the 2005/2006 policy period, calculated in accordance with sub-clause 12(1) of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order,

then  $CRC^R$  is calculated in accordance with the following formula:  $CRC^R = \text{comparative rate}.$ 

#### 11. Experience Rated Method

(1) Where this clause applies, the applicable new risk calculated rate will be determined in accordance with sub-clause (2) and the applicable current risk calculated rate will be determined in accordance with sub-clause (3).

New Risk Calculated Rate

(2) The new risk calculated rate for a period of coverage is:

 $NRC^R = EPR \times IR$ 

where:

EPR is the employer performance rating for the employer;

IR is the industry rate for that workplace for that period of coverage.

#### WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 14) 2006/2007

#### Current Risk Calculated Rate

(3) The current risk calculated rate is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

CRCR =

(0.9 x comparative rate + (PPR - 0.9 x comparative rate) x 0.5)

where:

PPR is the employer's potential performance rating, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

 $PPR = EPR \times WIR$ 

where:

EPR is the employer performance rating for the employer;

WIR is the employer's weighted industry rate.

#### 12. Employer Performance Rating

(1) Subject to sub-clause (5), the employer performance rating (EPR) for an employer is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$EPR = 1 + Z \times (PI - 1)$$

where:

Z is the employer's size adjustment factor, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$Z = \frac{X^{T}}{X^{T} + 600,000}$$

where  $X^T$  is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula IR x R<sub>cov</sub> to each experience period workplace of the employer for each relevant period of coverage;

PI is the employer's performance index, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$PI = \frac{ECCR}{IACCR}$$

where:

ECCR is the employer's claims cost rate, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$ECCR = \underline{AC}$$
 $AR$ 

IACCR is the employer's industry average claims cost rate, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$IACCR = \underbrace{AP}_{AR}$$

#### where:

(i) AC is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$AC = C - V$$

#### where:

- C is the sum arrived at by aggregating the total cost of claims for the claims reporting period in respect of:
  - (A) each workplace which is an experience period workplace in relation to the employer; and
  - (B) each workplace (other than an experience period workplace or an unrelated predecessor workplace) which was a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) prior to 1 July 2003;
- V in relation to the employer, is the sum of any recoveries made by the Authority during the preceding triennium in relation to claims against the employer and any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer and any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) (other than claims made in relation to an unrelated predecessor workplace) received by the Authority or an authorised agent between 1 July 1993 and 30 June 2003;
- (ii) AR is the sum arrived at by aggregating the value of R<sub>COV</sub> for each experience period workplace of the employer for each relevant period of coverage;
- (iii) AP is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula ICCR x R<sub>cov</sub> to each experience period workplace of the employer for each relevant period of coverage.
- (2) Subject to sub-clauses (3), (4) and (5A), for the purposes of sub-clause (1), in relation to a workplace for a period of coverage:
  - IR is the industry rate for that workplace for that period of coverage;
  - ICCR is the industry claims cost rate for that workplace for that period of coverage;
  - $R_{COV}$  is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace.

- (3) If a workplace was a grouped workplace (within the meaning of the 2004/2005 Premiums Order) during the 2004/2005 policy period, then for any period of coverage at that workplace during the 2003/2004 policy period the industry rate and the industry claims cost rate for that period of coverage at that workplace shall be determined in accordance with item 8(5) of schedule 1.
- (4) If during a period of coverage during the 2003/2004 policy period a workplace:
  - (a) was a workplace during the last period of coverage of the 2003/2004 policy period; and
  - (b) because it formed part of a collapsed split workplace, was not a separate workplace for the purposes of the 2004/2005 Premiums Order,

then for any period of coverage at that workplace during the 2003/2004 policy period the industry rate and the industry claims cost rate for that period of coverage at that workplace shall be determined in accordance with item 8(5) of schedule 1.

#### (5) Where:

- (a) it is not otherwise possible to calculate an employer performance rating; or
- (b) an employer's total remuneration for the preceding policy period, as calculated in accordance with clause 9(2), is less than or equal to \$200,000,

then the employer performance rating (EPR) for the employer shall be deemed to be 1.

- (5A) The Authority itself may calculate Z and AP for an employer as though items 2 and 3 of schedule 1, and schedule 5 to this Order applied throughout the preceding triennium so that the places at which the workers of that employer worked may be treated as workplaces, if that employer has made an application under subclause (5B).
- (5B) An employer may apply to the Authority requesting that the Authority calculate Z and AP for that employer in accordance with sub-clause (5A) if:
  - (a) the employer is an employer in relation to one or more imputed workplaces during the current policy period; and
  - (b) the employer was an employer in relation to one or more imputed workplaces in the preceding policy period; and
  - (c) the employer had a capping ratio of less than 1 (one) during the preceding policy period.
- (5C) An application under sub-clause (5B) must be made in writing and must:

- include details of each of the places at which workers employed by the employer worked during any relevant period of coverage; and
- (b) in respect of each place identified in the application, include details of the remuneration paid or payable by the employer to workers working at each place during any relevant period of coverage.
- (5D) Sub-clause (5A) shall not apply if the Authority itself considers that:
  - (a) the information provided to it is incorrect; or
  - (b) all the information required by sub-clause (5C) has not been provided to it; or
  - (c) the information provided to it is insufficient to enable it to calculate Z and AP.
- (6) "Relevant period of coverage" in this clause means:
  - (a) in relation to a workplace referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) of the definition of "experience period workplace", each period of coverage at that workplace during the preceding triennium where during that period of coverage the workplace was a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2); or
  - (b) in relation to a workplace referred to in paragraph (c) of the definition of "experience period workplace", all periods of coverage at that workplace during the preceding triennium and preceding the date on which that workplace became a predecessor to a workplace referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) of the definition of "experience period workplace".

#### 13. Weighted Industry Rate

(1) An employer's weighted industry rate ("WIR") is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

$$WIR = \underbrace{X^1}_{A}$$

where:

X¹ is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each relevant workplace in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace:

IR x (
$$\frac{R_{COV}^{1} x 365}{N_{COV}^{1}}$$

A is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each relevant workplace in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace:

$$\frac{(R_{COV}^{-1}x\ 365)}{N_{COV}^{-1}}$$

#### (2) For the purposes of sub-clause (1):

**"relevant workplace"** means a workplace which was a workplace of an employer during the preceding policy period and which is a current risk workplace of the employer, or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2), for the purposes of this Order;

IR is the industry rate for the relevant workplace for the first period of coverage in the current policy period;

 $N_{COV}^{-1}$  is the number of days in the last period of coverage at the relevant workplace;

 $R_{COV}^{-1}$  is the remuneration for the last period of coverage at the workplace.

#### 14. Buy-out Premium

- (1) The buy-out premium (B) for an employer is zero, unless the employer elects under sub-section 125A(6) of the Act to eliminate the excess under sub-section 125A(3).
- (2) If the employer makes such an election, the buy-out premium is calculated as follows:

 $B = WP \times 0.125$ 

where WP is the WorkCover premium of the employer.

#### 15. Rounding

- (1) All rates and factors are to be rounded to 6 decimal places.
- (2) The new risk premium, cappable premium and buy-out premium (B) are to be rounded down to the nearest cent.
- (3) The premium payable by an employer (P) is to be rounded to the nearest cent.
- (4) The remuneration deductible benefit (D) is to be rounded to the nearest cent.
- (5) The total cost of claims and the total employer remuneration (T) are each to be rounded to the nearest dollar.

#### 16. Determinations and Calculations

- (1) Subject to sub-clause (2), anything which under this Order the Authority must do or may do may be done on its behalf by an authorised agent.
- (2) Where the words "the Authority itself" appear, the Authority alone may do the act or thing.

#### 17. Registration Fee

The registration fee for an employer pursuant to section 58 of the WorkCover Insurance Act is \$135.

#### 18. Exemption Limit

For the purposes of paragraph (b) of the definition of "exemption limit" in sub-section 3(1) of the WorkCover Insurance Act, the amount prescribed in respect of the financial year ending 30 June 2007 is \$7,500.

#### 19. Payment of Premium and Discounts

The premium payable by an employer is to be paid, and the amount of the premium payable by an employer is to be discounted, in accordance with schedule 3.

#### 20. Application of the WorkCover Insurance Act Grouping Provisions

- (1) Unless the Authority makes a determination under sub-clause (2), the grouping provisions in Part 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Act shall not apply for any of the purposes of this Order, other than item 2 of schedule 1.
- (2) The Authority itself may determine that an employer, which is a member of a group for the purposes of Part 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Act, is a group employer for the purposes of this Order.

#### 21. Premium Avoidance Schemes

- (1) The Authority itself may make a determination under sub-clause (5) where:
  - (a) a premium avoidance scheme has been entered into or carried out; and
  - (b) a person ("the relevant employer") has obtained, or would but for sub-clause (5) obtain, a premium benefit in connection with the scheme.
- (2) A reference in this clause to a premium avoidance scheme is a reference to a scheme in respect of which it would be concluded that the person, or one or more of the persons, who entered/enters into or carried/carries out the scheme (or any part of the scheme) did/does so for the purpose of enabling the relevant employer to obtain a premium benefit in connection with the scheme, or of enabling the relevant employer and another employer or other employers each to obtain a premium benefit in connection with the scheme (whether or not that person who entered into or carried out the scheme or any part of the scheme is the relevant employer or is the other employer or one of the other employers) ("the relevant purpose").
- (3) For the purposes of sub-clause (2):
  - (a) the relevant purpose need not be the only or dominant purpose of the conduct, as long as it is a substantial purpose;
  - (b) to establish the purpose of a person or persons in relation to sub-clause (2), regard may be had, in addition to any other relevant matters, to:

- (i) the manner in which the scheme is or was entered into or carried out;
- (ii) the form and substance of the scheme;
- (iii) the time at which the scheme is being or was entered into and the length of the period during which the scheme is being or was carried out;
- (iv) the reduction in premium that, but for the operation of these provisions, would have been achieved by the scheme;
- (v) any change to the financial position of any person involved in the scheme, where the change is not one referable to the amount of premium calculated under this Order.
- (4) A reference in this clause to a person obtaining a premium benefit in connection with a scheme shall be read as a reference to that person being liable to pay an amount calculated under this Order as the person's premium that is less than the amount which would have been calculated, or might reasonably be expected to have been calculated, as the person's premium if the scheme had not been entered into or carried out.
- (5) Where sub-clause (1) applies, the Authority itself may determine that the premium payable by the relevant employer shall be the amount which would have been calculated or might reasonably be expected to have been calculated as the person's premium if the scheme had not been entered into or carried out and the Authority shall take such action as it considers necessary to give effect to that determination.
- (6) A determination under sub-clause (5) must be in writing and must be provided to the relevant employer.
- (7) For the purposes of this clause, "scheme" means:
  - any contract, agreement, arrangement, understanding, promise or undertaking whether made or entered into orally or in writing, whether express or implied and whether or not enforceable or intended to be enforceable by legal proceedings; or
  - (b) any plan, proposal, action, course of action or course of conduct.
- (8) Where a determination is made under sub-clause (5), then notwithstanding anything else in this Order the premium payable by the employer shall be the amount specified in the determination.

#### 22. Predecessor Employer of a Labour Hire Employer

(1) The Authority itself may determine that an employer that has maintained a WorkCover insurance policy but no longer maintains such a policy (employer A) is a predecessor employer

- of another employer that provides labour hire in the current policy period (employer B).
- (1A) The Authority itself may determine that an employer that has maintained a WorkCover insurance policy and continues to maintain such a policy (employer A) is a predecessor employer of another employer that provides labour hire in the current policy period (employer B).
- (2) In making a determination under sub-item (1) or (1A), the Authority may consider any relevant matter, including:
  - (a) whether employer A has transferred to employer B any asset of employer A's business;
  - (b) whether the clients of employer B are substantially the same as the clients of employer A;
  - (c) whether the staff of employer B are substantially the same as the staff of employer A;
  - (d) whether the persons who direct or control the operations of employer B are substantially the same as the persons who directed or controlled the operations of employer A; and
  - (e) whether there is a relationship of control between employer A and employer B, within the meaning of sub-item 6(9) of schedule 1.

#### **SCHEDULE 1**

#### GENERAL INTERPRETATION

- 1. [This item has been deleted]
- 2. Workplace
  - (1) "Workplace", in relation to an employer, means:
    - (a) an area, or two or more contiguous areas, of land in Victoria occupied by the employer where workers employed by the employer work, or through which such workers pass in the course of their employment, whether or not workers employed by another employer also work or pass through that area or those areas in the course of their employment ("actual workplace"); and
    - (b) subject to sub-item (1A), an area, or two or more contiguous areas, of land in Victoria occupied by a labour hire client of the employer where workers employed by the employer work, or through which such workers pass in the course of their employment, whether or not workers employed by another employer also work or pass through that area or those areas in the course of their employment ("imputed workplace").

- (1A) Sub-item 1(b) does not apply to an employer in respect of whom the Authority makes a determination that the provision of labour hire by the employer is:
  - (a) merely ancillary to the business of the employer; and
  - (b) an insignificant part of the labour hire industry taken as a whole.
- (2) For the purposes of this Order, two or more areas of land are contiguous if they are within the same building or are separated only by a road or railway or other similar area across or around which movement is reasonably possible.
- (3) Subject to sub-item (4), if workers employed by an employer are working in a place that is not a workplace of that employer within the meaning of sub-item (1), those workers shall be deemed to be working at the workplace of the employer from which that work is managed or controlled or, if there is no such workplace, the place determined by the Authority to be the workplace of the employer in respect of that work.
- (4) If workers employed by an employer which is a member of a group within the meaning of Part 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Act are not working at a workplace of that employer but are working at a workplace, or place of business, of another member of the group, the second-mentioned workplace (or place of business, as the case may be) shall be deemed to be the workplace of the employer for the purposes of this Order.
- (5) Where two or more persons ("the relevant persons") are:
  - (a) members of a group within the meaning of Part 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Act; and
  - (b) carrying out their respective operations at two or more group workplaces ("the constituent workplaces") which:
    - (i) are contiguous with each other; or
    - (ii) occupy (in whole or in part) the same area of land,

the Authority may (subject to sub-item (6)) determine that the constituent workplaces, or two or more of them, are to be treated as a single workplace ("the grouped workplace") for the purpose of determining the predominant activity of each constituent workplace including (for the purpose of removing any doubt) for the purpose of determining the predominant activity under item 3(1) of this schedule.

(5A) For the purposes of sub-item (5), "group workplace" means any place of business (whether or not a workplace of an employer) at which any of the relevant persons (whether or not an employer) carries out its operations, and such place shall be treated as a workplace of that person.

- (6) The Authority may only make a determination under sub-item (5) if it is satisfied that any one or more of (a)–(c) applies to the operations carried on at the constituent workplaces, namely:
  - (a) the operations are not carried on independently of each other;
  - (b) the operations are connected with each other; or
  - (c) the operations are carried on with an intention either directly or indirectly of minimising the amount of premium payable by one or other of the relevant persons under this Order.
- (7) Where the Authority makes a determination under sub-item (5), this Order shall apply as if the predominant activity and the applicable industry rate for each constituent workplace were the same as for the grouped workplace.
- (8) Any reference to a workplace includes:
  - (a) any predecessor workplace; and
  - (b) where applicable, a reference to an establishment which corresponds to the workplace.

#### 3. Predominant Activity

- (1) (a) "Predominant activity", in relation to a period of coverage at an actual workplace of an employer, means the activity of the employer which during that period contributes, or is likely to contribute, more than any other activity of the employer to the value of goods and/or services produced or provided by operations carried on in that workplace.
  - (b) "Predominant activity", in relation to a period of coverage at an imputed workplace of an employer, means the activity of the labour hire client which during that period contributes, or is likely to contribute, more than any other activity of the client to the value of goods and/or services produced or provided by operations carried on in that workplace.
- (2) In determining the predominant activity in relation to a workplace, regard may be had to, but must not be limited by, measures of activity during the preceding period of 12 months or less consisting of data relating to sales, cost of goods produced, cost of labour or gross profit, taken from:
  - (a) a statement prepared and signed by a registered company auditor, accountant or tax agent; or
  - (b) where an employer did not engage a registered company auditor, accountant or tax agent during the period to which the information refers, a return by the employer.
- (3) Subject to sub-items (4) and (5), if, at a workplace of an employer that comprises two or more contiguous areas ("the contiguous areas"), the predominant activity carried on at each of those areas is different, the Authority may determine that each of those areas is a separate workplace of that employer for the purposes of this Order.

- (4) Unless sub-item (6) applies, sub-item (3) does not apply in relation to an area ("the subject area") if:
  - (a) the predominant activity carried on at the subject area
    - (i) is wholly or mainly dependent on; or
    - (ii) occurs wholly or mainly as a consequence of; or
    - (iii) is wholly or mainly ancillary to,

the predominant activity carried on at one or more of the other contiguous areas; or

- (b) the goods and/or services produced or provided by the employer from operations carried on in the subject area are wholly or mainly produced or provided (as the case may be) for the use or purposes of, or to support the operations carried on in, one or more of the other contiguous areas.
- (5) Without derogating from sub-item (4), unless sub-item (6) applies sub-item (3) does not apply in relation to an area if:
  - (a) the predominant activity carried on at that area comes within one or more of the following categories of services:
    - (i) clerical services;
    - (ii) management services;
    - (iii) administrative services;
    - (iv) sales and marketing services;
    - (v) warehousing services associated with manufacturing wholesaling or retailing; and
  - (b) that activity is carried on wholly or mainly in connection with the operations carried on in one or more of the other contiguous areas.
- (6) Sub-items (4) and (5) do not apply, and sub-item (3) does apply, to an area ("the relevant area") if:
  - (a) either I6185T Corporate Head Office Administration, Private Sector or I6186V – Corporate Head Office Administration, Public Sector is the industry classification to which the predominant activity for the relevant area corresponds (but not if either classification is merely the industry classification to which such predominant activity most closely corresponds); and
  - (b) at least one of the workplaces of the employer in connection with which the relevant area is engaged in corporate administration is not contiguous with any of the contiguous areas.
- (7) For the purposes of sub-item (6)(b), the expression "workplaces of the employer" includes an area, or two or more contiguous areas, of land outside Victoria but within Australia, not otherwise

being a workplace for the purposes of this Order, which would be a workplace if sub-items 2(1) and (2) of this schedule applied.

#### 4. Remuneration

- (1) The remuneration for a period of coverage at a workplace of an employer ("the relevant period") shall be determined in accordance with this item.
- (2) Subject to sub-items (2A), (3), (4) and (5), the remuneration for the relevant period shall be the sum of the rateable remuneration paid or payable to workers employed by the employer or (if applicable) by a predecessor employer in respect of operations carried out at that workplace during that period.
- (2A) The remuneration for a period of coverage at a workplace that was classified under an earlier Premiums Order to industry classification K8496L or K8497R is the sum of the rateable remuneration paid to workers employed by the employer or (if applicable) by a predecessor employer in respect of operations carried out at:
  - (i) that workplace; and
  - (ii) a place that would be an imputed workplace if item 2 of schedule 1 to this Order had applied to that period of coverage.
- (3) Unless the Authority determines otherwise, if a worker is engaged in operations at two or more workplaces of an employer and the remuneration paid or payable to the worker in respect of operations in each workplace is not identified, the proportion of the remuneration attributable to each workplace is the same proportion as the number of hours during which the worker is engaged in operations in that workplace bears to the total number of hours during which the worker is or was engaged in operations in those workplaces.
- (4) If an employer has two or more workplaces and it is not reasonably possible to determine the proportion of the remuneration that is attributable to each workplace, the Authority may, subject to such terms and conditions as it determines, authorise the employer to pay premium on the basis of estimates of the proportion.
- (5) If the Authority has insufficient information to enable it to determine the remuneration for a period of coverage in accordance with this item, the Authority may use an estimate of rateable remuneration as provided for in sections 18, 20, 23 and 24 of the WorkCover Insurance Act.

#### 5. Homogenous Workplaces

If the predominant activities carried on at two or more workplaces of an employer are of the same kind, any two or more of those workplaces may be determined by the Authority to be one workplace unless the determination would result in the premium payable by the employer being different from the amount which would have been calculated in accordance with this Order if the determination had not been made.

#### 6. Predecessor

- (1) In this item and items 10 and 11:
  - "associate" has the meaning given in item 11.
  - "capacity" means ability or power, whether direct or indirect, and includes an ability or power exercisable immediately or at some future time as a result of, or by means of, in breach of, by revocation of, any of, or any combination of, the following:
    - (a) trust;
    - (b) agreement or understanding; and
    - (c) practice;

whether or not legally enforceable.

"domestic partner", in relation to a person, means a person to whom the person is not married but with whom the person is living as a couple on a genuine domestic basis (irrespective of gender).

"entity" includes any of the following:

- (a) an individual;
- (b) a body corporate;
- (c) a body politic;
- (d) a partnership;
- (e) a trust.
- **"relative"**, in relation to any person ("the relevant person"), means any of the following, namely:
  - (a) the spouse, domestic partner, parent, grandparent, brother, sister, uncle, aunt, nephew, niece, lineal descendant or adopted child of the relevant person or of his or her spouse or domestic partner;
  - (b) the step-father, step-mother, step-son, step-daughter, half-brother, or half-sister of the relevant person and any person who stands in the place of a parent in relation to the relevant person; and
  - (c) the spouse or domestic partner of any person referred to in paragraph (a) or (b) (other than the relevant person).

WorkCover Insurance Premiums Order (No. 14) 2006/2007

- "spouse", in relation to a person, means a person to whom the person is married.
- (2) For the purposes of this item and items 10 and 11, if a legal person has a number of different capacities in which the person does things, in each of those capacities the person is taken to be a different entity.
- (3) Subject to sub-item (5), a workplace (in this item called "workplace A") is the predecessor of another workplace (in this item called "workplace B") if:
  - (a) the activity which was the predominant activity in workplace A (in this item called "the relevant activity") is being carried on, in substance, in workplace B; and
  - (b) the activity which is being carried on in workplace B is carried on in succession to the activity which was carried on in workplace A.

#### (3A) For the purposes of sub-item (3):

- (a) where the Authority has made a determination under item 2(5) of this Order or any earlier Premiums Order in relation to workplace A, the predominant activity of workplace A shall be read as a reference to the predominant activity of the workplace ascertained in accordance with item 3 as if the determination under item 2(5) had not been made; and
- (b) a reference to the activity that is being carried on, in substance, at workplace B shall be read as a reference to the predominant activity in workplace B if:
  - (i) the Authority has made a determination under item 2(5) in relation to workplace B; and
  - (ii) the predominant activity of workplace B, as a result of the determination under item 2(5), is the same as the predominant activity in workplace A.
- (4) Sub-item (3) may apply notwithstanding that:
  - (a) the employer in relation to workplace B (in this item and item 10 called "employer B") is different from the employer in relation to workplace A (in this item and item 10 called "employer A"); or
  - (b) the location of workplace B is different from the location of workplace A; or
  - (c) workplace A continues to be a workplace of employer A; or
  - (d) the relevant activity is still being carried on in workplace A; or
  - (e) the relevant activity is not the predominant activity in workplace B.

- (5) Subject to sub-items (8), (10) and (11), sub-item (3) does not apply if:
  - (a) employer B is a different entity from employer A; and
  - (b) the Authority makes a determination under sub-item (6).
- (6) If employer A or employer B establishes to the satisfaction of the Authority that:
  - (a) no relationship of control exists between employer A and employer B or has existed since the commencement of the relevant test period; or
  - (b) no relationship of control between employer A and employer B existed at any time during the relevant test period,

the Authority may make a determination accordingly.

- (7) For the purposes of making a determination under sub-item (6), the Authority itself may disregard a relationship of control which would otherwise be taken to exist or to have existed (as the case may be) between employer B and employer A by reason that an entity (in this sub-item called "the relevant entity"), whether employer A or employer B or another entity, has or had a controlling interest in an employer of a kind specified in sub-item (9), if the Authority is satisfied that it would be reasonable to do so having regard to:
  - (a) the nature and degree of the relevant entity's independence from the employer during the relevant test period;
  - (b) the nature and degree of the relevant entity's ownership interest (whether directly or indirectly) in the employer during the relevant test period;
  - (c) the nature and degree of any financial interest that the relevant entity has or had (whether directly or indirectly) in or in relation to the employer during the relevant test period;
  - (d) whether any other entity has or had a controlling interest in the employer during the relevant test period;
  - (e) the nature of any connection (whether of a business, family or other nature) between the relevant entity and any other entity referred to in paragraph (d); and
  - (f) any other matters that the Authority considers relevant.
- (8) A determination under sub-item (6) ceases to have force and effect, and sub-item (3) applies, if the Authority determines that a relationship of control between employer A and employer B exists or has existed at any time during a relevant test period.
- (9) For the purposes of this item, a relationship of control shall be taken to exist or to have existed (as the case may be) between employer B and employer A if:

- (a) at any time in the relevant test period employer A has or had a controlling interest in employer B; or
- (b) any entity which at any time in the relevant test period has or had a controlling interest in employer A also has or had at any time in the relevant test period (not necessarily being the same time) a controlling interest in employer B; or
- (c) at any time in the relevant test period employer B has or had a controlling interest in employer A; or
- (d) employer A and employer B are a group or part of a group of employers for the purposes of the grouping provisions within Part 6 of the WorkCover Insurance Act.
- (10) Sub-item (5) does not apply if both employer A and employer B are public authorities.
- (11) Sub-item (5) does not apply if:
  - (a) employer A is a partnership in which an entity was a partner; and
  - (b) that entity would be taken to have a controlling interest in employer B if the entity's partners in employer A were taken to be associates of that entity.

#### (12) In this item:

"controlling interest" has the meaning given in item 10 of this schedule:

**"public authority"** means a body, whether incorporated or unincorporated, that is established by or under an Act for a public purpose;

#### "the relevant test period" means:

(a) in relation to a controlling interest in employer B:

the period beginning at the commencement of the relevant policy period and ending one year after the end of the relevant policy period; and

(b) in relation to a controlling interest in employer A:

the period beginning one year prior to the commencement of the relevant policy period and ending at the end of the relevant policy period:

where the "relevant policy period" means the policy period in which the relevant activity commenced in workplace B.

#### 7. Industry Classification

(1) Subject to sub-items 2(3) and (4) of schedule 1 to this order, the industry classification of a workplace is the WorkCover industry classification in schedule 5 to which the predominant activity at that workplace corresponds or most closely corresponds.

- (2) For the purposes of determining the industry classification in accordance with sub-item (1):
  - (a) regard must be had to the Introduction to, and all relevant elements of, schedule 5;
  - (b) consideration must be given to the industrial characteristics of the predominant activity without regard to the risk of injury associated with the predominant activity or with any of the occupations of or functions performed by workers engaged in operations at the workplace; and
  - (c) the predominant activity at a workplace does not correspond or most closely correspond to a WorkCover industry classification if workplaces predominantly engaged in that activity are expressly excluded from that classification in any of the elements of schedule 5.

#### 8. Industry Rate / Industry Claims Cost Rate

- (1) The industry rates and the industry claims cost rates for the current policy period for each industry classification are those rates determined by the Authority itself and notified in the Government Gazette during the current policy period.
- (2) Subject to sub-item (3), for the purposes of sub-clauses 10(2), 11(2) and 13(2) of this Order, the industry rate for a workplace for a period of coverage is the industry rate for the current policy period which corresponds to the industry classification of that workplace for that period of coverage.
- (3) If, in the opinion of the Authority, an employer has failed to provide sufficient information to enable the Authority to determine the industry classification and/or the remuneration for a period of coverage at a workplace, the industry rate shall be deemed to be the default rate.
- (4) For the purposes of sub-clause 12(2), the industry rate and the industry claims cost rate:
  - (a) for a workplace (other than a workplace to which sub-item 4(b) applies) for a period of coverage are the rates which would respectively apply in the current policy period if the industry classification of the workplace for that period of coverage were governed by this Order;
  - (b) for a workplace classified under an earlier Premiums Order to industry classification K8496L or K8497R for a period of coverage during the preceding triennium are the rates determined by the Authority itself and notified in the Government Gazette during the current policy period.
- (5) For the purposes of clauses 12(3) and 12(4) of this Order, the industry rate and the industry claims cost rate for a workplace for a period of coverage are the rates which would respectively apply in the current policy period if the predominant activity for the workplace for the period of coverage were:

- (a) the predominant activity of the grouped workplace during its first period of coverage as a grouped workplace; or
- (b) the predominant activity of the collapsed split workplace during the first period of coverage in the 2004/2005 policy period.

#### 9. Coverage Classification

- (1) Each period of coverage at a workplace in the current policy period is to be classified in accordance with this item as either:
  - (a) a current risk period of coverage; or
  - (b) a new risk period of coverage.
- (2) In this item, the period of coverage to be classified is referred to as "the relevant period".
- (3) (a) For an actual workplace, the relevant period is to be classified as a new risk period of coverage unless sub-item (4) applies.
  - (b) For an imputed workplace, the relevant period is to be classified as a new risk period of coverage, notwithstanding sub-item (4).
- (4) This sub-item shall apply, and the relevant period is to be classified as a current risk period of coverage, if:
  - (a) the rateable remuneration paid or payable to workers during the last period of coverage at the workplace was greater than 0 (zero); and
  - (b) the industry classification of the workplace is the same as it was during the last period of coverage.
- (5) Notwithstanding sub-item 4(b), the Authority may determine that the relevant period is to be classified as a current risk period of coverage where:
  - (a) the activities carried on or to be carried on at the workplace during the relevant period are or were carried on at two or more workplaces in the last period of coverage; and
  - (b) the Authority itself is satisfied that the activities carried on during that last period of coverage (either collectively or individually) are substantially the same as those carried on, or to be carried on, during the relevant period.

#### 10. Controlling Interest

(1) For the purpose of item 6, an entity has a controlling interest in an employer at a particular time, where:

50% Stake Test - Company

(a) in the case of an employer that is a company, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them:

- (i) are able at that time to exercise, or control the exercise of or substantially influence the exercise of, 50% or more of the voting power in the company (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities); or
- (ii) have at that time the right to receive for their own benefit (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) 50% or more of any dividends that the company may pay; or
- (iii) have at that time the right to receive for their own benefit (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) 50% or more of any distribution of capital of the company; or

#### 40% Stake Test – Company

- (b) in the case of an employer that is a company, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them (in this paragraph called the "assumed controller"):
  - (i) are able at that time to exercise, or control the exercise of or substantially influence the exercise of, 40% or more of the voting power in the company (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities); or
  - (ii) have at that time the right to receive for their own benefit (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) 40% or more of any dividends that the company may pay; or
  - (iii) have at that time the right to receive for their own benefit (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) 40% or more of any distribution of capital of the company

unless employer A or employer B or the assumed controller satisfies the Authority that an entity (other than the assumed controller) either alone or together with its associates controls the company; or

#### 50% Stake Test – Partnership

- (c) in the case of an employer that is a partnership, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them:
  - (i) owns or own together (whether or not beneficially) 50% or more of the capital of the partnership (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities); or
  - (ii) is or are together entitled (whether or not beneficially) to 50% or more of any profits of the partnership (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities); or
  - (iii) are able at that time to exercise, or control the exercise of or substantially influence the exercise of, 50% or more of the voting power in the partnership (either directly, or

indirectly through one or more interposed entities); or

#### 40% Stake Test – Partnership

- (d) in the case of an employer that is a partnership, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them (in this paragraph called the "assumed controller"):
  - (i) owns or own together (whether or not beneficially) either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities 40% or more of the capital of the partnership; or
  - (ii) is or are together entitled (whether or not beneficially) either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities to 40% or more of any profits of the partnership; or
  - (iii) are able at that time to exercise, or control the exercise of or substantially influence the exercise of, 40% or more of the voting power in the partnership (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities)

unless employer A or employer B or the assumed controller satisfies the Authority that an entity (other than the assumed controller) either alone or together with its associates controls the partnership; or

#### 50% Stake Test – Trustee

(e) in the case of an employer that is a trustee of a trust, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them have at that time a beneficial entitlement (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) to 50% or more of any distribution of the trust income or the trust capital; or

#### 40% Stake Test – Trustee

- (f) in the case of an employer that is a trustee of a trust, the entity, or the entity and its associates between them (in this paragraph called the "assumed controller") have at that time a beneficial entitlement (either directly, or indirectly through one or more interposed entities) to 40% or more of any distribution of the trust income or the trust capital unless employer A or employer B or the assumed controller satisfies the Authority that an entity (other than the assumed controller) either alone or together with its associates controls the trust.
- (2) For the purpose of sub-item (1)(e), an entity who, as a result of the exercise of a power or discretion by the trustee of a discretionary trust or by any other entity or by that trustee and any other entity, may benefit either directly or indirectly through one or more interposed entities under that trust shall be deemed to have a beneficial entitlement to 50% or more of any distribution of the trust income or the trust capital unless:
  - (a) the trust has not made a distribution of corpus or income to that entity in the three years immediately preceding the test time; and

(b) no power of appointment has been exercised in favour of the entity.

#### Other Tests

- (3) For the purpose of item 6, an entity, either alone or together with its associates has a controlling interest in an employer at a particular time where:
  - (a) the entity has the capacity to dominate decision-making, directly or indirectly, in relation to the financial and operating policies of the employer (whether or not it exercises that capacity); or
  - (b) the employer is a company and the directors or a majority of the directors or one or more of the directors, being a director or directors who is or are entitled to exercise a majority of voting power at meetings of the directors, of the company are or is accustomed or under an obligation (whether formal or informal) to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of that entity or those entities acting together; or
  - (c) the employer is a trustee of a trust and the entity, either alone or together with its associates:
    - (i) has the power to obtain the beneficial enjoyment of the trust capital or income (whether or not by exercising its power of appointment or revocation, and whether with or without another entity's consent); or
    - (ii) is able to control the application of the trust capital or income in any manner (whether directly or indirectly); or
    - (iii) has the capacity to gain the beneficial enjoyment in subitem (c)(i) or the control in sub-item (c)(ii); or
    - (iv) acting either alone or in concert, can remove or appoint the trustee, or one or more of the trustees, of the trust; or
  - (d) the employer is a trustee of a trust and a trustee of the trust is accustomed to act, is under an obligation (whether formally or informally) to act, or might reasonably be expected to act, in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of the entity or two or more entities, at least one of which is the entity or an associate of the entity.
- (4) For the purpose of determining whether an entity and its associates has a controlling interest in an employer, if an interest is both direct and indirect and (apart from this sub-item) would be counted more than once in applying sub-item (1), (2) or (3), only the direct interest is to be counted.

#### 11. Associate

#### Associates of a natural person

- (1) For the purposes of item 10, the following are associates of an entity (in this subsection called the "primary entity") that is a natural person (otherwise than in the capacity of trustee):
  - (a) a relative of the primary entity;
  - (b) a partnership in which the primary entity is a partner;
  - (c) a trustee of a trust where the primary entity, or another entity that is an associate of the primary entity because of another paragraph of this sub-item, benefits under the trust;
  - (d) a company where:
    - (i) the company is sufficiently influenced by:
      - (A) the primary entity; or
      - (B) another entity that is an associate of the primary entity because of another paragraph of this subitem; or
      - (C) another company that is an associate of the primary entity because of another application of this paragraph; or
      - (D) two or more entities covered by the preceding subsubparagraphs; or
    - (ii) a majority voting interest in the company is held by:
      - (A) the primary entity; or
      - (B) the entities that are associates of the primary entity because of sub-paragraph (i) and because of the preceding paragraphs of this sub-item; or
      - (C) the primary entity and the entities that are associates of the primary entity because of sub-paragraph (i) and because of the preceding paragraphs of this sub-item.

#### Associates of a company

- (2) For the purposes of item 10, the following are associates of a company (in this sub-item called the "primary entity"):
  - (a) a partnership in which the primary entity is a partner;
  - (b) a trustee of a trust where the primary entity, or another entity that is an associate of the primary entity because of another paragraph of this sub-item, benefits under the trust;
  - (c) another entity (in this paragraph called the "controlling entity") where:

- (i) the primary entity is sufficiently influenced by:
  - (A) the controlling entity;
  - (B) the controlling entity and another entity or entities;
- (ii) a majority voting interest in the primary entity is held by:
  - (A) the controlling entity; or
  - (B) the controlling entity and the entities that, if the controlling entity were the primary entity, would be associates of the controlling entity because of sub-item (1), because of sub-paragraph (i) of this sub-item, because of another paragraph of this sub-item or because of sub-item (3);
- (d) another company (in this paragraph called the "controlled company") where:
  - (i) the controlled company is sufficiently influenced by:
    - (A) the primary entity; or
    - (B) another entity that is an associate of the primary entity because of another paragraph of this subitem; or
    - a company that is an associate of the primary entity because of another application of this paragraph; or
    - (D) two or more entities covered by the preceding subsubparagraphs; or
  - (ii) a majority voting interest in the controlled company is held by:
    - (A) the primary entity; or
    - (B) the entities that are associates of the primary entity because of sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph and the other paragraphs of this sub-item; or
    - (C) the primary entity and the entities that are associates of the primary entity because of sub-paragraph (i) of this paragraph and the other paragraphs of this sub-item;
- (e) any other entity that, if a third entity that is an associate of the primary entity because of paragraph (d) of this sub-item were the primary entity, would be an associate of that third entity because of sub-item (1), because of another paragraph of this sub-item or because of sub-item (3).

#### Associates of a trustee

- (3) For the purposes of item 10, the following are associates of a trustee (in this sub-item called the "primary entity"):
  - (a) any entity that benefits under the trust;
  - (b) if a natural person benefits under the trust any entity that, if the natural person were the primary entity, would be an associate of that natural person because of sub-item (1) or because of this sub-item;
  - (c) if a company is an associate of the primary entity because of paragraph (a) or (b) of this sub-item any entity that, if the company were the primary entity, would be an associate of the company because of sub-item (2) or because of this sub-item.

#### Associates of a partnership

- (4) For the purposes of item 10, the following are associates of a partnership (in this sub-item called the "primary entity"):
  - (a) a partner in the partnership;
  - (b) if a partner in the partnership is a natural person any entity that, if that natural person were the primary entity, would be an associate of that natural person because of sub-item (1) or (3);
  - (c) if a partner in the partnership is a company—any entity that, if the company were the primary entity, would be an associate of the company because of sub-item (2) or (3).

## Interpretation

- (5) For the purposes of this item:
  - (a) a reference to an entity benefiting under a trust is a reference to the entity benefiting, or being capable (whether by the exercise of a power of appointment or otherwise) of benefiting, under the trust, either directly or through any interposed companies, partnerships or trusts; and
  - (b) a company is sufficiently influenced by an entity or entities if the company, or its directors, are accustomed or under an obligation (whether formal or informal), or might reasonably be expected, to act in accordance with the directions, instructions or wishes of the entity or entities (whether those directions, instructions or wishes are, or might reasonably be expected to be, communicated directly or through interposed companies, partnerships or trusts); and
  - (c) an entity or entities hold a majority voting interest in a company if the entity or entities are in a position to cast, or control the casting of, more than 50% of the maximum number of votes that might be cast at a general meeting of the company.

#### **SCHEDULE 2**

#### **COST OF CLAIMS**

#### 1. Definition

In this schedule:

"total cost of claims", in relation to a workplace of an employer, means:

the total of the costs of all individual claims, other than excluded claims, received by the Authority or an authorised agent during the claims reporting period in respect of workers engaged in operations at that workplace, being workers employed by the employer.

### 2. Cost of an individual claim

- (1) The cost of an individual claim is the sum of:
  - the payments of compensation, if any, made pursuant to the Act by the Authority or an authorised agent in respect of the claim;
  - the payments, if any, of damages at common law or of amounts paid in settlement of claims or proceedings for such damages in respect of the claim;
  - (c) costs and expenses, if any, paid by the Authority or an authorised agent in relation to the claim;
  - (d) the amount estimated in accordance with item 4 to be the Authority's outstanding liability to make payments in respect of the claim;

but:

- (e) does not include any remuneration paid or payable to relevant authorised agents in accordance with their agency agreements;
- (f) shall be reduced by an amount equivalent to the sum of the amounts of all input tax credits and decreasing adjustments within the meaning of the A New Tax System (Goods and Services) Act 1999 of the Commonwealth which have arisen in relation to the payments, costs and expenses referred to in paragraphs (a), (b) and (c);
- (g) shall be reduced by recoveries made by the Authority or authorised agents;
- (h) if the employer elects under sub-section 125A(6) of the Act to eliminate the excess under sub-section 125A(3), does not include payments which would otherwise have been met by the employer under the excess; and
- (i) shall not include any payments, costs or expenses to which the worker was not entitled and in relation to which the worker has been found guilty of an offence under section 81, 82, 83

or 83A of the **Crimes Act 1958** or under section 248, subsection 248A(2) or section 249 of the Act.

(2) If the cost of an individual claim calculated under sub-item (1) exceeds \$263,900, the cost of the claim is deemed to be \$263,900.

#### 3. Excluded claims

- (1) "Excluded claims" refers to claims in respect of injuries to workers participating in a return to work program funded and operated by the Authority or approved by the Authority.
- (2) In sub-item (1), the references to the Authority do not include authorised agents.

#### 4. Estimation of outstanding liability

- (1) The estimation referred to in sub-item 2(1)(d) of this schedule must be made by the Authority itself and in accordance with procedures determined by the Authority itself.
- (2) The estimation must include an amount equivalent to the sum of all amounts, of which the Authority has notice, paid in relation to the claim or in satisfaction or purported satisfaction of the employer's or the Authority's liability or potential liability in respect of the claim (other than any amount paid in satisfaction of the liability of the employer under sub-sections 125(1)(a) or 125A(3) of the Act) which have not been reimbursed to the employer by the authorised insurer or the Authority or the authorised agent.

#### 5. Date of determination of cost of claims

The cost of claims is calculated:

- (a) at a time during the current policy period nominated by the Authority itself ("the relevant time"); and
- (b) on the basis of information in the possession of the Authority at the relevant time.

#### 6. Recoveries

- (1) Subject to sub-item (1A), "recovery" means:
  - (a) an amount of money recovered by or on behalf of the Authority in relation to a claim (other than a TAC claim) from a person other than the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2); or
  - (b) an amount of money recovered by or on behalf of the Authority in relation to a TAC claim from a person other than the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) or the Transport Accident Commission; or

- (c) in the case of a TAC claim in respect of an injury or death which the Authority or the authorised agent has determined was caused under circumstances creating in a person, other than the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) or a person for whose acts or omissions the employer is or may be vicariously liable, a legal liability to pay damages in respect of the injury or death 100% of the amount of money recovered by the Authority from the Transport Accident Commission in respect of that injury or death.
- (1A) 'Recovery' does not include any amount recovered as an overpayment unless the overpayment relates to a claim received in the preceding triennium.
- (2) Where an amount of money is recovered by or on behalf of the Authority in respect of a claim received by an authorised agent between 1 July 1993 and 30 June 2003, and the total amount of money recovered in respect of that claim exceeds \$263,900, any further recoveries made in respect of that claim by the Authority shall not be a recovery for the purposes of this Order.
- (3) For the purposes of this Order, a recovery referred to in subitem (1) is taken to have been made when the amount of the recovery is received by the Authority or the authorised agent (as the case requires).
- (4) For the purposes of sub-item 6(3), where the Authority or its authorised agent receives a payment which comprises or includes two or more recoveries, the amount of each such recovery shall be taken to have been received when the Authority applies that amount to the claim to which it relates.

#### **SCHEDULE 3**

## PAYMENT OF PREMIUM AND DISCOUNTS

- (1) An employer may elect to pay premium in an annual instalment and, if the premium payable is calculated to be \$1,000 or less, the employer must, unless the Authority determines otherwise, pay the premium in this manner.
- (2) A premium payable by way of an annual instalment is due on 1 October 2006 (or such later date as the Authority itself may determine) and, if such a premium is paid by the due date, the amount of the premium is, unless the Workcover Premium is in accordance with clause 6 calculated to be \$135, to be discounted by 3%.
- (3) If a premium has been discounted in accordance with item 2, for the purposes of calculating any adjusted premium the amount of the adjusted premium is to be reduced by the amount by which the premium was reduced as the result of the discount.

- (4) If an employer has not elected under and in accordance with item 1, or is not required under that item, to pay premium in an annual instalment, the employer may elect to pay premium by monthly instalments or by quarterly instalments.
- (5) If an employer has elected under and in accordance with schedule 3 to the 2005/2006 Premiums Order to pay premium by monthly or quarterly instalments, the employer must pay the premium calculated in accordance with this Order in the same manner unless and until the employer makes an election under and in accordance with item 1 or item 4 of this Order.
- (6) If item 5 does not apply, unless and until an employer referred to in item 4 has made an election under and in accordance with that item, the employer must pay premium
  - (a) if the premium is calculated to be less than \$50,000, by quarterly instalments; and
  - (b) if the premium is calculated to be \$50,000 or more, by monthly instalments.
- (7) (a) Quarterly payments of premium are payable in four equal instalments, or as varied in accordance with guidelines issued by the Authority itself;
  - (b) Quarterly payments are due on the first day of October, December, March and June, unless deferred in accordance with guidelines issued by the Authority itself.
- (8) (a) Monthly payments of premium are payable in ten equal instalments unless varied in accordance with guidelines issued by the Authority itself;
  - (b) Monthly payments are due on the first day immediately following the end of the month, commencing on the first day of October, unless deferred in accordance with guidelines issued by the Authority itself.

#### **SCHEDULE 4**

### COMPARATIVE RATE CALCULATIONS

- 1. (a) Subject to sub-items (1)(b) and (1)(c) of this schedule, an employer's comparative rate is calculated in accordance with item 3 of this schedule.
  - (b) Subject to item (1)(c) of this schedule, for the purposes of clause 8 of this Order, an employer's comparative rate is:
    - (i) the rate calculated in accordance with item 3 of this schedule; or
    - (ii) if the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under

sub-clause 20(2) was an employer in relation to an imputed workplace in the preceding policy period and is an employer in relation to an imputed workplace in the current policy period, the rate calculated in accordance with item 4 of this schedule.

- (c) If for the purposes of clause 6 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order, WP for the employer was determined to be \$135 in accordance with paragraph (b) of the definition of WP as set out in clause 6(2) of that Order, then notwithstanding sub-items (1)(a) and (1)(b) of this schedule, the employer's comparative rate is calculated in accordance with item 2 of this schedule.
- 2. Where this item applies, the comparative rate for an employer is:

E is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the following formula to each relevant workplace of the employer in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace:

where:

 $R_{COV}^{-1}$  is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace;

- IR<sub>1</sub> is the applicable industry rate for the workplace for the period of coverage, determined in accordance with item 8 of schedule 1 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order;
- F is the sum arrived at by aggregating the remuneration for the last period of coverage at each relevant workplace of the employer.
  - "relevant workplace", for the purposes of this item, means a workplace which was a workplace of the employer during the preceding policy period and which is a current risk workplace or an imputed workplace of the employer for the purposes of this Order.
- 3. (a) Subject to item 5, where this item applies, the comparative rate for an employer is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

(b) In this item:

NRP<sub>1</sub> is the amount, or the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts (if applicable), calculated in accordance with clause 7 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order in determining the WorkCover premium for the preceding policy period for the employer and any clause 22 predecessor employer and any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2);

- CRP<sub>1</sub> is the amount, or the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts (if applicable), calculated in accordance with clause 8 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order in determining the WorkCover premium for the preceding policy period for the employer and any clause 22 predecessor employer and any employer grouped with the employer under subclause 20(2);
- NRP<sup>P</sup> is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula R<sub>COV</sub> x NRC<sup>R</sup><sub>P</sub> to each new risk comparative workplace of the employer in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace;

#### where:

 $R_{\text{COV}}$  is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace;

NRC<sup>R</sup><sub>p</sub> is the new risk calculated rate for the period of coverage at the workplace;

## "new risk comparative workplace" means a workplace:

- (a) which is a current risk workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2);
- (b) at which the last period of coverage was a new risk period of coverage; and
- (c) which during the last period of coverage was a workplace of another employer, where the latter workplace is a predecessor workplace in relation to the workplace;
- CRP<sup>P</sup> is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula R<sub>COV</sub> x EPR<sub>p</sub> x IR<sub>1</sub> x TCR<sub>p</sub> to each current risk comparative workplace of the employer in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace;

#### where:

## "current risk comparative workplace" means a workplace:

- (a) which is a current risk workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2);
- (b) at which the last period of coverage was a current risk period of coverage; and
- (c) which during the last period of coverage was a workplace of another employer (the "other employer"), where the latter workplace is a predecessor workplace in relation to the workplace;

- EPR<sub>p</sub> is the employer performance rating for the other employer, calculated in accordance with clause 12 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order. Where there is no such rating or where clause 10 of that Order applied in relation to the calculation of the other employer's WorkCover premium in the preceding policy period, the employer performance rating for the other employer is deemed to be 1;
- IR<sub>1</sub> is the industry rate for the workplace for the last period of coverage, determined in accordance with item 8 of schedule 1 to the 2005/2006 Premiums Order:
- TCR<sub>p</sub> is the transition and capping ratio for the other employer in respect of that workplace, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

but if the value of either  $CRP_{p_1}$  or  $L_p$  is 0 (zero), then  $TCR_p$  is 1;

where:

- CRP<sub>P1</sub> is the amount calculated in accordance with clause 8 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order in relation to the other employer's WorkCover premium for the preceding policy period;
- $L_{p}$  is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula  $R_{COV}$  x EPR<sub>p</sub> x IR<sub>1</sub> to each current risk period of coverage in the preceding policy period included within the calculation of CRP<sub>p1</sub>;

ENRP is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula  $R_{COV} \times NRC_{-1}^{R}$  to:

- each new risk period of coverage in the preceding policy period at an excluded new risk workplace of the employer; and
- (b) each excluded new risk period of coverage in relation to the employer;

where:

NRC<sup>R</sup><sub>1</sub> is the new risk calculated rate for the period of coverage at the workplace;

- "excluded new risk workplace" means a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2):
  - (a) at which the last period of coverage was a new risk period of coverage; and

- (b) which is not a current risk workplace of that employer in the current policy period;
- "excluded new risk period of coverage" means a period of coverage which was a new risk period of coverage at a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under subclause 20(2) in the preceding policy period (other than the last period of coverage), being a workplace which is a current risk workplace of that employer;
- ECRP is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula  $R_{COV} \times EPR_1 \times IR_1 \times TCR$  to:
  - each period of coverage in the preceding policy period at an excluded current risk workplace of the employer;
  - (b) each excluded current risk period of coverage in relation to the employer;

#### where:

- EPR<sub>1</sub> is the employer performance rating for the person that was the employer in relation to the workplace during that period of coverage, calculated in accordance with clause 12 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order. Where there is no such rating, or where clause 10 of that Order applied in relation to the calculation of the employer's WorkCover premium in the preceding policy period, the employer performance rating for the employer is, for the purposes of this definition, deemed to be 1;
- TCR is the transition and capping ratio, calculated in accordance with the following formula:

but if the value of either CRP<sub>1</sub> or L is 0 (zero), then TCR is 1;

### where:

L is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula  $R_{COV} \times EPR_1 \times IR_1$  to each current risk period of coverage in the preceding policy period included within the calculation of  $CRP_1$ ;

- "excluded current risk workplace" means a workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2):
  - (a) at which the last period of coverage was a current risk period of coverage; and
  - (b) which is not a current risk workplace of that employer in the current policy period;

- EmpR<sub>1</sub> is the sum of the remuneration for all periods of coverage at all workplaces of the employer and any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer and any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2) during the preceding policy period;
- Rem<sup>P</sup> is the amount arrived at by aggregating the remuneration for the last period of coverage at each new risk comparative workplace and each current risk comparative workplace of the employer;
- EWR in relation to an employer, is the remuneration for all periods of coverage used in the calculation of ENRP and ECRP for that employer.
- 4. Subject to item 5, where this item applies, the comparative rate for an employer is calculated in accordance with the following formula:

NRP<sup>PM</sup> is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula  $R_{COV} \times NRC^R_{P}$  to each new risk comparative workplace of the employer in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace;

#### where:

 $R_{COV}$  is the remuneration for the period of coverage at the workplace;

NRC<sup>R</sup><sub>p</sub> is the new risk calculated rate for the period of coverage at the workplace

## "new risk comparative workplace" means a workplace:

- (a) which is a current risk workplace or an imputed workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under sub-clause 20(2);
- (b) at which the last period of coverage was a new risk period of coverage; and
- (c) which during the last period of coverage was a workplace of another employer (other than an employer mentioned in paragraph (a)), where the latter workplace is a predecessor of the workplace;

CRP<sup>PM</sup> is the sum arrived at by aggregating the amounts produced by applying the formula R<sub>COV</sub> x EPR<sub>p</sub> x IR<sub>1</sub> x TCR<sub>p</sub> to each current risk comparative workplace of the employer in respect of the last period of coverage at that workplace;

## "current risk comparative workplace" means a workplace:

- (a) which is a current risk workplace of the employer or any clause 22 predecessor employer of the employer or any employer grouped with the employer under clause 20(2);
- (b) at which the last period of coverage was a current risk period of coverage; and
- (c) which during the last period of coverage was a workplace of another employer (the "other employer") (other than an employer mentioned in paragraph (a)), where the latter workplace is a predecessor of the workplace;
- EPR<sub>p</sub> is the employer performance rating for the other employer, calculated in accordance with clause 12 of the 2005/2006 Premiums Order.  $R^P$  means the sum arrived at by aggregating the remuneration for all periods of coverage used to calculate  $NRP^{PM}$  and  $CRP^{PM}$ .

5. Where the application of either of the formulae set out in items 3 and 4 of this schedule result in the calculation of the employer's comparative rate as a negative amount, the employer's comparative rate shall be calculated in accordance with the following formula:

#### SCHEDULE 5

### INTRODUCTION

In accordance with item 7 of schedule 1, the industry to which a workplace is classified for an employer is the WorkCover industry classification in this schedule to which the predominant activity at that workplace corresponds or most closely corresponds.

Industry classifications, which are denoted by two letter, four digit alpha/numeric codes, are organised within broad divisions (each identified by a single letter), subdivisions (each identified by a two digit code) and Groups (each identified by a three digit code).

The preambles to the various divisions summarise and explain the scope of the relevant division and clarify the correct classification for specific predominant activities.


The predominant activity at the workplace is determined in accordance with item 3 of schedule 1 without regard to this schedule. It is then necessary to identify the WorkCover industry classification in this schedule to which that predominant activity corresponds or most closely corresponds.

For this purpose, regard must be had to all relevant elements of this schedule, ie headings, preambles to divisions, industry descriptions, exclusions/references and the listed activities.

It must be noted that the predominant activity at a workplace does not correspond or most closely correspond to a WorkCover industry classification if workplaces predominantly engaged in that activity are expressly excluded from that classification in any of the elements of this schedule referred to above.

- 3. Institutional farms such as research farms and prison farms are not included in this Division, but are classified to those classes in Division K, which include the institutions concerned.
- 4. "Forestry" includes afforestation or the harvesting or gathering of forest products. Logging operations such as felling, hewing or rough shaping of timber in the forest are included in this Division.
- 5. "Fishing" includes the catching, gathering, breeding or cultivation of marine life from ocean, coastal or inland waters (coastal waters include estuaries and inlets). Included also is the processing of ocean and coastal water fishery products aboard vessels predominantly engaged in both catching and processing those products.
- 6. "Hunting" includes the catching or taking of all types of animal wildlife on land. The catching or taking of wildlife such as crocodiles in inland waters is also included.

In addition, repair or reconditioning of products, unless elsewhere classified, shall be included in this Division and classified to the same classification as the original manufactured product.

  - (b) Textiles, clothing and footwear (Subdivisions 23 and 24) including workplaces predominantly engaged in cotton ginning or other preparation of fibres for further processing. Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in making or installing curtains, in mens or womens custom tailoring or dressmaking or in boot and shoe repairing (these are included in Subdivision 48 in Division F) or in installing blinds or laying carpets or other floor coverings (these are included in Division E). Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of textiles, clothing and footwear are included in Division I.

- (c) Wood products and furniture (Subdivision 25). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in hewing or rough shaping of railway sleepers, posts, etc., in the forest (these are included in Division A) or in fabrication of joinery at construction sites, erecting prefabricated wooden buildings or installing wooden framed windows (these are included in Division E). Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing wooden products and furniture are included in Division I.
- (d) Paper or paper products (Subdivision 26), including workplaces predominantly engaged in publishing or in publishing and printing newspapers, magazines, books, music, maps, etc., or in providing printing trade services, such as electrotyping and bookbinding. Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of paper and paper products are included in Division I.
- Chemical, plastic, coal, petroleum, glass, clay, cement (e) or other non-metallic mineral products (Subdivisions 27 and 28 and Group 347 in Subdivision 34). Excluded are workplaces predominantly engaged in screening, crushing, dressing or other rudimentary treating of minerals, construction materials, etc., in briquetting coal or in purifying natural gas (these are included in Division B), or in blending lubricating oils and greases or in glazing (these are included in Subdivision 47 in Division F). Workplaces predominantly engaged in plastering, in manufacturing and/or laying of hotmix bituminous paving or in the installation of insulation materials or of bituminous roofing materials are included in Division E. Workplaces predominantly engaged in contract packing of chemical, plastic, glass etc., products are included in Division I.
- (f) Metals and metal products including machinery, transport or other equipment, scientific apparatus, and household appliances (Subdivisions 29, 31, 32 and 33), leather or rubber products, ophthalmic articles, jewellery, sporting equipment, etc. (Groups 345, 346 and 348 in Subdivision 34). #### SCHEDULE 5—continued

#### **DIVISION F** : TRADE

- 1. This Division includes all workplaces predominantly engaged in the trading of goods either as a retailer, wholesaler (physically handling the goods and, usually, taking title to the goods) or as an agent or purchasing, marketing or buying office. The term 'agency' is used here to include those operations which trade in goods but do not usually take title to the goods traded and do not physically handle the goods. Typically an agency receives commission or fees which are directly related to the value of goods traded. A purchasing, marketing or buying office is a separate workplace, of a multi workplace employer, which is predominantly engaged in buying or marketing goods for use by other workplaces of the employer. Such a workplace which buys or markets for other workplaces of the employer does not physically handle the goods.
- 2. The term 'wholesale trade' is used here in the broad sense to include the sale (as principals) of new or used goods to retailers or other wholesalers. The more important types of businesses engaged in wholesale trade are wholesale merchants who take title to the goods they sell and separately located sales branches or sales offices (not being retail stores), operated by manufacturing enterprises, which do not merely take orders but supply goods to customers from stocks physically held at their own premises. Workplaces engaged in storing and distributing goods to other workplaces of the employer are included in Division G.
- 3. The term 'retail trade' is used here, generally speaking, to include the activity of selling new or used goods to final consumers. The more important types of business engaged in retail trade are department stores or other shops, stalls, mail order houses, hawkers, door to door sellers, milk or bread vendors, vending machine operators or consumer cooperatives. However, cafes, restaurants, licensed hotels, motels, wine saloons and clubs are included in Division L, Recreation, Personal and Other Services.
- 4. In addition to the foregoing it may be useful to note that while most types of goods can enter wholesale trade, not all goods may be considered to enter the retail sector even though they may be sold to the final consumer. Goods not normally entering retail trade include cereal grains, metal ores, crude petroleum, industrial chemicals, iron and steel and industrial machinery and equipment.

- 5. Workplaces predominantly engaged in selling their own goods by auction are included in this Division, but workplaces (except stock and station agents) which are predominantly engaged in providing auctioning services for others are included in Division I, Finance, Property and Business Services.
- 6. Workplaces predominantly engaged in leasing goods (not manufactured by the same workplaces) for periods in excess of one year, without operators, from stocks physically handled by the workplace are included in this Division, as are workplaces predominantly engaged in the hiring out of most types of consumer goods.
- 7. Certain kinds of activity other than selling are commonly carried out by workplaces classified to this Division and have therefore been designated as predominant to the relevant classes of either Subdivision 47 or 48. The more important of these activities are:
  - (i) Glazing (Class F4728R).
  - (ii) Blending industrial or lubricating oils from refinery base stock (Class F4741J).
  - (iii) Washing or packing (incl. contract packing) fresh fruit or vegetables (Class F4764X).
  - (iv) Pulping, dehydrating or preserving eggs (Class F4765A).
  - (v) Bottling or breaking down bulk quantities of wine or spirits (incl. contract packing) (Class F4767F).
  - (vi) Blending or repacking tea (incl. contract packing), repacking (incl. contract packing) flour, cereal food products, dried fruits or a wide range of other groceries (Class F4769K).
  - (vii) Custom tailoring or dressmaking (Class F4840R).
  - (viii) Repairing footwear (Class F4846C).
  - (ix) Making or installing curtains (Class F4847F).
  - (x) Repairing locks or providing key duplicating services (Class F4853A).
  - (xi) Repairing non-electric household appliances (Class F4856J).
  - (xii) Repairing or installing household electric appliances (except heating equipment) not requiring electrical work (Class F4857K).
  - (xiii) Repairing or servicing motor vehicles (Class F4861A)

- (xiv) Repairing tractors, agricultural or construction machinery (Class F4863F).
- (xv) Repairing or servicing business machines or equipment (Class F4897C).
- 8. The treatment of such activities as installation, assembly, blending, bottling and packing is usually specified in the class descriptions. Where these activities have not been specified it should be assumed that they are included in the class that trades in the product.
- 9. Workplaces predominantly engaged in both baking and retailing bread or cakes are included in this Division, but workplaces predominantly engaged in baking bread or cakes are included in Division C, Manufacturing.
- 10. In the case of workplaces which have goods manufactured for them on commission or contract a variety of situations are encountered with different treatments applicable to each. In general, if a workplace has no goods producing facilities itself (or, if it has, does not use these or does not employ contractors to use them on its behalf), ie: the workplace undertakes no goods producing activities at all, then all its sales of goods produced for it on commission are treated for classification purposes as wholesale or retail sales, as appropriate.
