Proposed Local Law No. 1 of 2006

General Amendment Local Law 2006

The Moyne Shire Council ("Council") is proposing to amend its General Local Law 2005 (Local Law No. 3 of 2005). The following information is provided in accordance with section 119 of the **Local Government Act 1989** (the "Act").

The purpose of the proposed amendment is to:

- provide for the safe use of the Port of Port Fairy facilities by all users;
- ensure the Port of Port Fairy meets the needs of both commercial operators and visitors;
- ensure the workings of the Port of Port Fairy are efficiently managed and conducted in an equitable manner;
- require that a person in control of a dog in a public place in a prescribed area shall have in his or her possession a dedicated scooper device or bag for the purpose of the collection and removal of any dog excrement from that dog; and
- provide controls over parked vehicles being used for advertising.

The proposed amendment if adopted will:

Port of Port Fairy

- control the area where vessels may be refuelled or unloaded;
- prohibit vessels from being tied up to handrails on the wharf or jetty;
- provide for the Port Controller to direct that a vessel be moved from a permanent berth;
- provide for the Port Controller to be able to alter the position of berthed vessels in the absence of the vessel master in certain circumstances;
- control the parking of vehicles between the wharf and the Co-operative building unless loading or unloading;
- provide that a vessel master who is unloading squid must ensure that the jetty surface is washed down and kept free from squid ink;
- make it an offence to use a vehicle to refuel unless such vehicle has a current authorization;
- require that vehicles used for refueling are fitted with fire fighting and oil spill equipment;
- make it an offence for any vessel to discharge liquid waste into the water of the Port;
- declare certain areas to be "Emergency Access Areas";
- prohibit the storage of any container of oil on the wharf;
- provide for the Port Controller to close parts of the Port for particular activities;
- prohibit the:
 - riding of bicycles;
 - use of toy vehicles;
 - diving and swimming;
 - scuba diving and lighting of fires in certain circumstances;
- limit the speed of water traffic in the Port.

Dogs

- require that any person who has the control of a dog in a public place within a Township area in Schedule 4 or any other area as prescribed by Council shall have in his or her possession a dedicated scooper device or bag for the purpose of collection and removal of any excrement from that dog.

Parked Vehicles

- prohibit the use of a vehicle without a permit from advertising a charitable or not for profit function; and
- prohibit the parking of any vehicle with advertising on it in such a way as to be used to direct persons to a business address.

New Meeting Procedures
Local Law No. 1

Notice is hereby given that Bayside City Council, at its meeting held on 27 June 2006, resolved to adopt its new Meeting Procedures Local Law No. 1 entitled Meeting Procedures which repeals the existing Local Law No. 1 Meeting Procedures in its entirety and replace it with this Local Law No. 1 titled Meetings Procedures 2006.

The purpose of the Local Law is to:

- provide a mechanism to facilitate the good government of the Municipal District of the City of Bayside through its formal meeting procedure to ensure effective and efficient Council decisions;
- provide mechanisms for the Council to ascertain the community's views and expectations;
- provide for the election of Mayor and Chairman of any Committees;
- regulate and control the procedures governing the conduct of meetings including:
 - the notice required for meetings; and
 - the keeping of minutes;
- regulate and control the use of Council's Seal;
- provide for the administration of the Council's powers and functions;
- provide generally for the peace, order and good government of the Municipal District.

The general purport of the Meeting Procedures Local Law will be to:

- revoke the existing Local Law No. 1 – Meeting Procedures made in April 2004 in its entirety;
- establish a law which will govern order of business, rules of debate, meeting procedure, public access and conduct of meetings;
- regulate the use and control of Council's common seal, and create an offence for a person using the common seal without authority or using a replica of the common seal without authority;
- regulate the procedure for the election of the Mayor;

- regulate the procedure of “Public Question Time” at Ordinary Meetings of Council;
- regulate the time limit of people making a submission to Council;
- regulate the availability of agenda papers to members of the public prior to meetings;
- regulate the procedure for amending a Notice of Motion;
- regulate the procedure for petitioners speaking to petitions;
- regulate the hearing of submissions at Committee Meetings of Council only;
- allow Council to suspend Standing Orders for a maximum period of 30 minutes;
- regulate the procedure to ensure that no discussion prior to a motion being moved;
- regulate the procedure for Points of Order;
- create an offence for a person who interrupts a meeting or behaves in an unruly manner and who fails to come to order when called to do so.

This Local Law will come into effect as from 6 July 2006.

Amendment C117

The Minister for Planning has prepared Amendment C117 to the Melbourne Planning Scheme.

The land affected comprises three housing precincts in Carlton that are owned and managed by the Office of Housing, Department of Human Services. The precincts are:

- Lygon/Rathdowne Precinct comprising the area generally bounded by Lygon Street, Princes Street, Drummond Street, Neill Street and Rathdowne Street, Carlton;
- Elgin/Nicholson Precinct comprising the area bounded by Elgin Street, Nicholson Street, Canning Street and Palmerston Street, Carlton;
- Keppel/Cardigan Precinct comprising the area bounded by Keppel Street, Cardigan Street, Cemetery Road East and Swanston Street, Carlton.

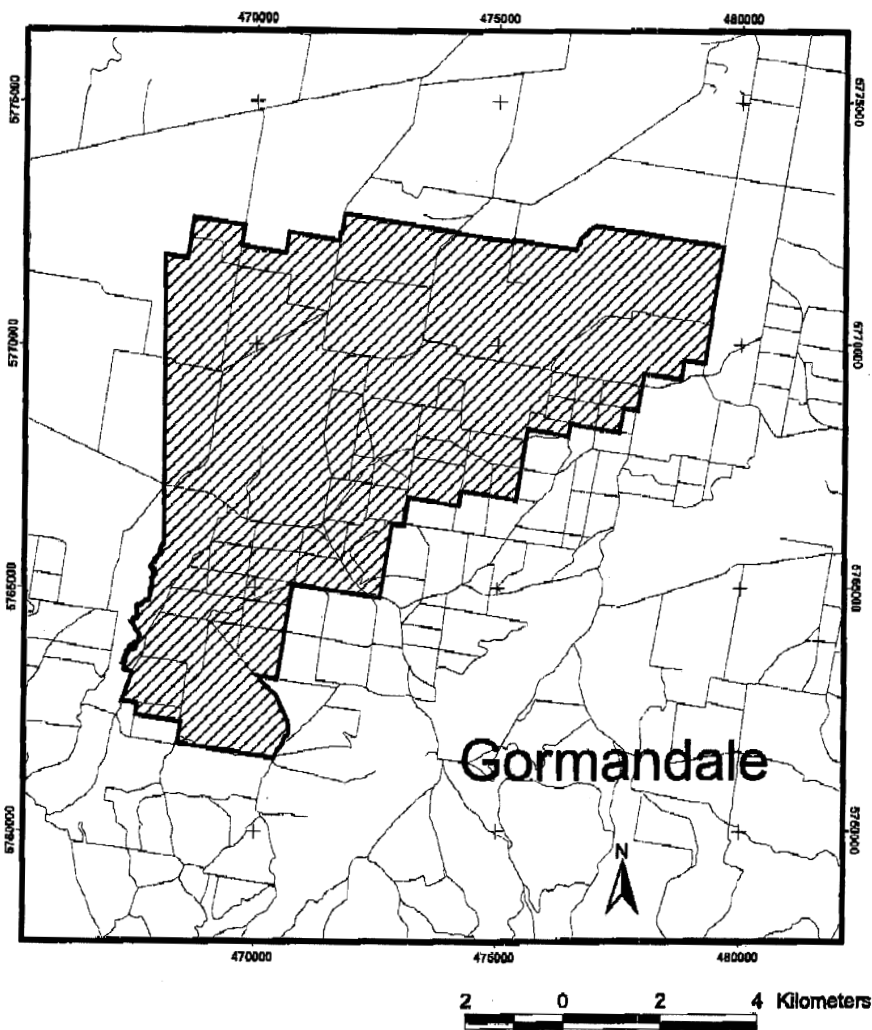

1. Objective

The objective of this direction is to specify eligibility criteria that must be met before approval of the issue, renewal or transfer of an aquaculture fishery licence.

2. Authorising provision

This direction is made under section 61 of the **Fisheries Act 1995**.

3. Eligibility criteria

- (1) This clause applies where an aquaculture licence for a specified area within an aquaculture fisheries reserve, declared under section 88(1) of the Act, is to be –
 - (a) issued;
 - (b) transferred; or
 - (c) renewed, where the licence to be renewed –
 - (i) was issued after the declaration of a management plan for the relevant aquaculture fisheries reserve made under section 28 of the Act; or
 - (ii) has been renewed twice since the declaration of a management plan for the relevant aquaculture fisheries reserve made under section 28 of the Act.
- (2) An applicant for the transfer, issue or renewal of an aquaculture licence as described in sub-clause (1) must satisfy the eligibility criteria set out in sub-clause (3).
- (3) The applicant must –
 - (a) have a lease of Crown land under section 134 of the **Land Act 1958**; or
 - (b) have a sub-lease to a lease of Crown land under section 134 of the **Land Act 1958**; or
 - (c) have the written consent of the holder of a lease of Crown land under section 134 of the **Land Act 1958** and sign a deed poll that provides indemnity to the State Government of Victoria in a form required by the State consistent with the warranty and indemnity provisions specified in the Crown lease,for the specified area for which the licence is to be issued, transferred or renewed.

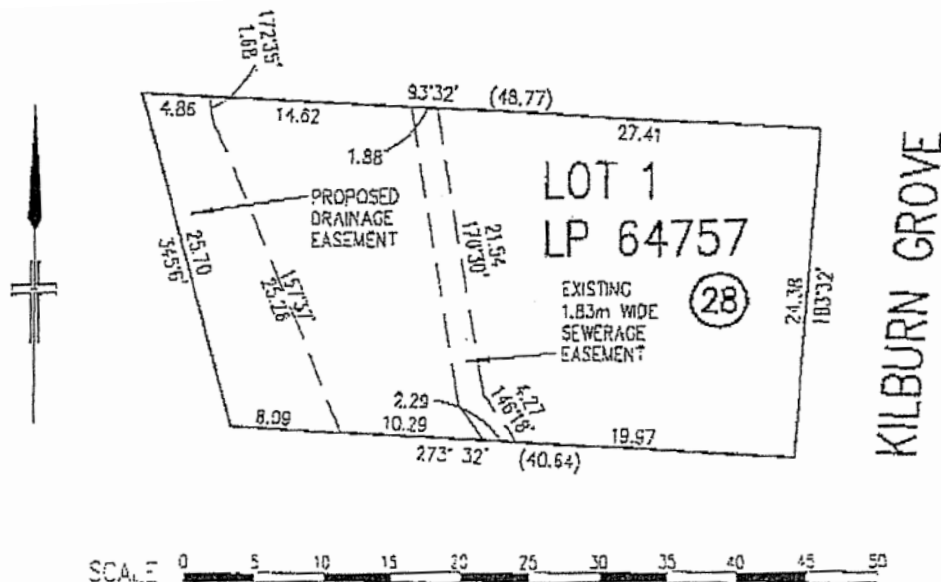

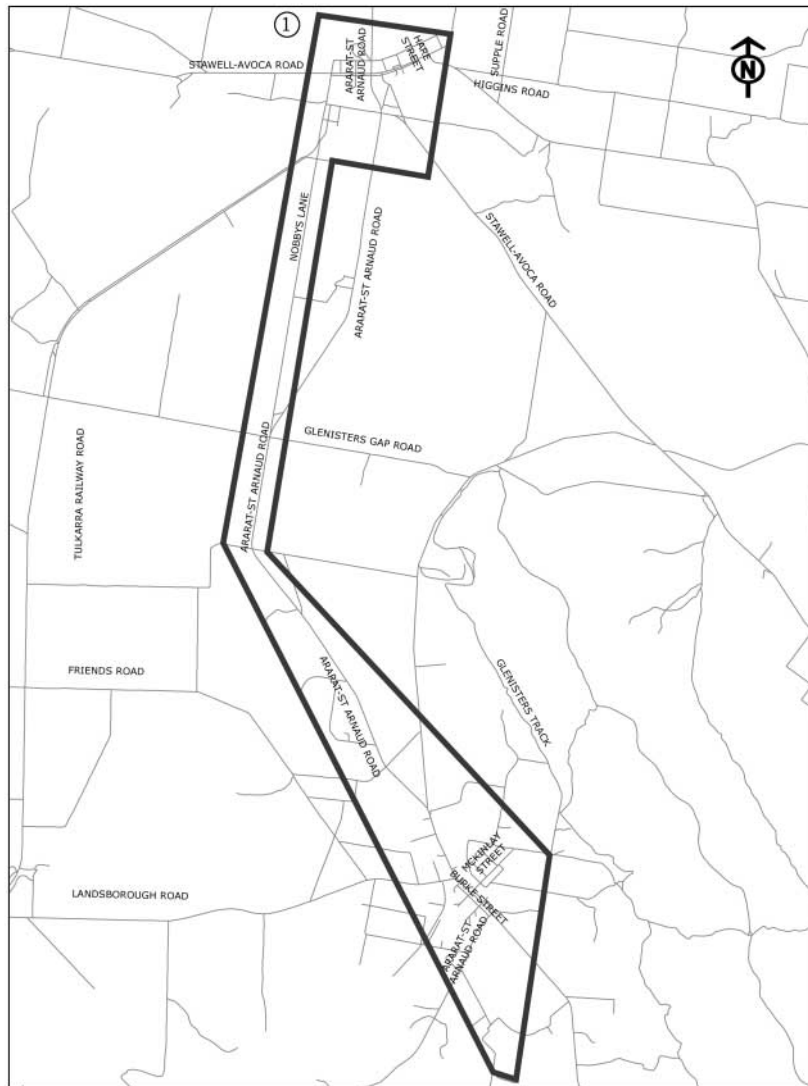
