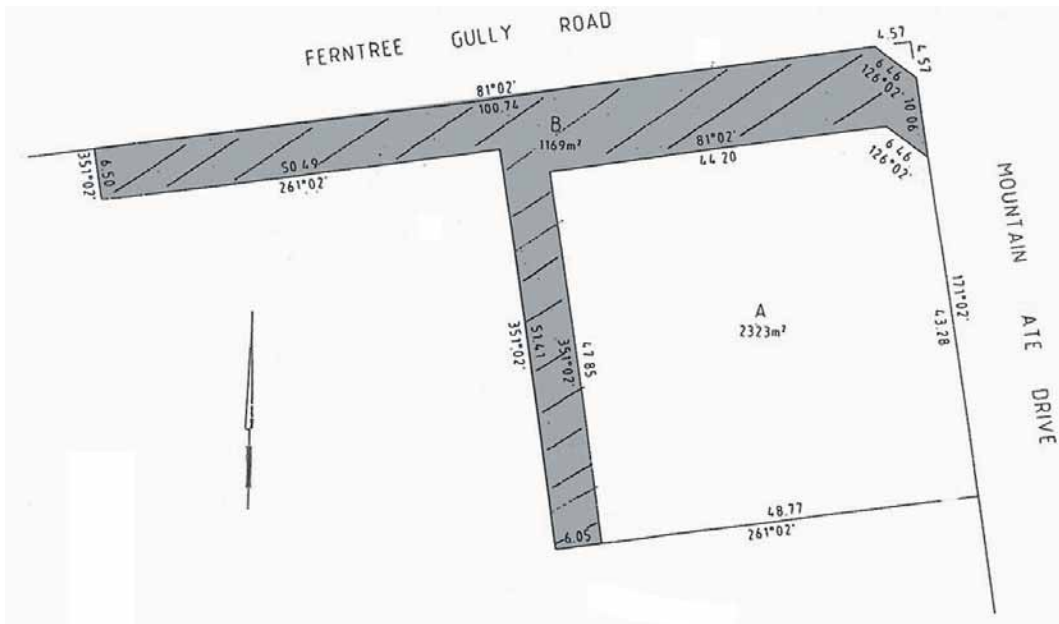

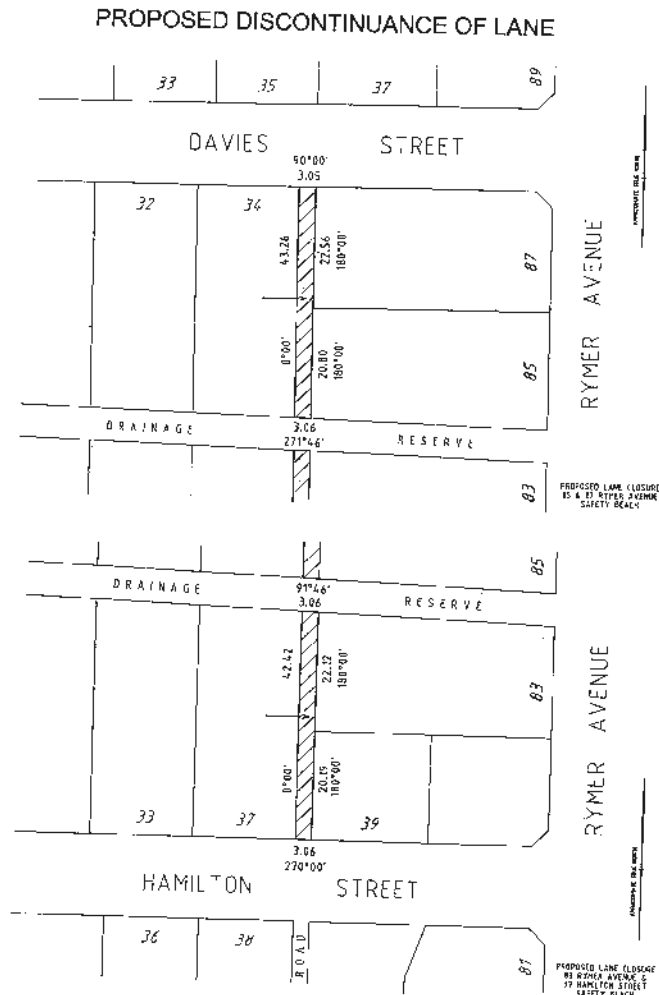

Pursuant to section 206 and schedule 10, clause 3 of the **Local Government Act 1989**, the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council has formed the opinion that the lane at the rear of Nos. 83, 85 and 87 Rymer Avenue, and adjacent to 39 Hamilton Street, Safety Beach, as shown hatched on the plan below, is not reasonably required as a road for public use. 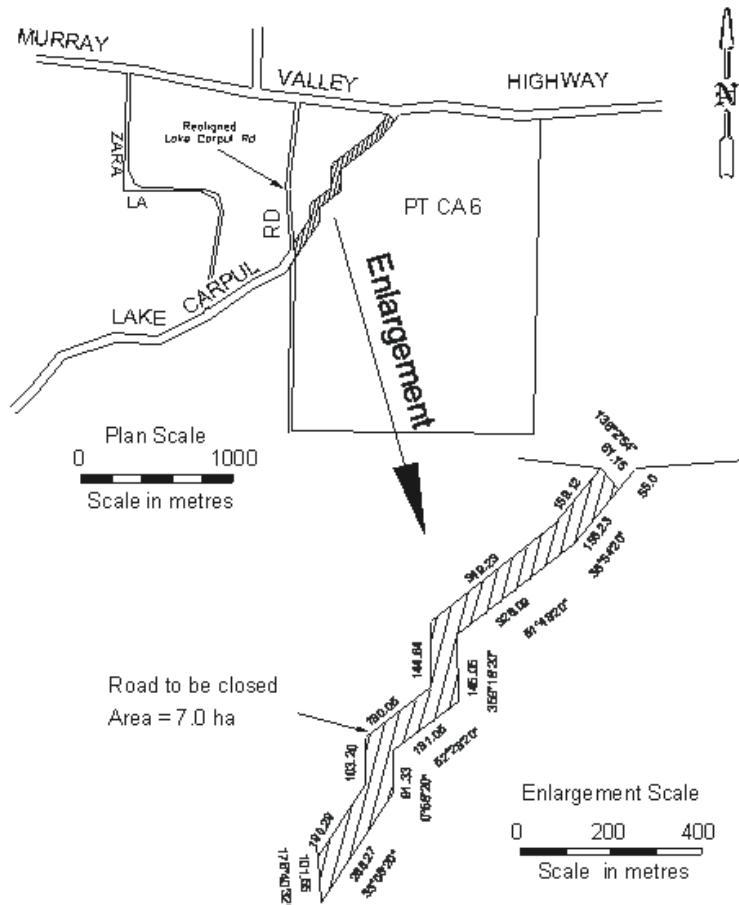


Road Discontinuance – Lake Carpul Road

Notice is given pursuant to section 119 (2) of the **Local Government Act 1989** that at the Ordinary Meeting of the Bayside City Council held on 25 September 2007, the Council resolved to commence the statutory process to make Local Law No. 9 (2007) – Control of Shopping Trolleys.

The purpose and general purport of Local Law No. 9 (2007) – Control of Shopping Trolleys is:

- (a) to allow and protect the quiet enjoyment by people of Municipal Places within the Municipal District;
- (b) to enable people in the Municipal District to carry out their day to day activities and to enjoy their recreational pursuits without having their peace and enjoyment interfered with or destroyed;
- (c) to recognise and respond to community expectations relating to the quality of life they expect and require and are capable of influencing;
- (d) to prevent the abandonment of shopping trolleys so as to:
 - (i) provide for the safety of pedestrians and other road users;
 - (ii) protect Council and community assets; and
 - (iii) preserve the visual amenity of the Municipal District.

Any person affected by the proposed new Local Law may make a written submission in accordance with the provisions of section 223 of the **Local Government Act 1989**. Any person also wishing to be heard in support of their written submission must notify Council of this request in writing.

- Alter the area to which the Environmental Significance Overlay 2 – Water Catchment Areas applies.
- Introduce clause 45.05 Restructure Overlay into the Planning Scheme.
- Applies the Restructure Overlay to parts of Neerim, Neerim Junction and the Catchment.
- Introduce a schedule to the Restructure Overlay to include restructure plans for areas in Neerim, Neerim Junction and areas within the revised Catchment Area.

The application is for a planning permit to subdivide the affected land into 8 lots, with 7 lots having areas ranging from 4028 m² to 5110 m² and a residual lot of 6.463 ha.

PERMANENT WATER SAVING PLAN

Lower Murray Water (LMW) introduced permanent water saving rules for all urban and rural garden water supply systems across the LMW region from 1 July 2006, as required and outlined in Action 5.4 of the government's White Paper for Water and pursuant to the **Water Act 1989** section 170 A to G.

Water shortages across the state led to the development of a Permanent Water Saving Plan and it is important that these new water saving rules imposed by all water corporations are easily understood and readily adopted by our customers.

Following the announcement in March 2007 by the Premier of Victoria that it would be mandatory for major non-residential water users to complete a water management action plan, the Minister for Water, Environment and Climate Change gave notice to LMW under section 170B(3) of the **Water Act 1989**, that LMW must review and submit a revised Permanent Water Savings Plan (PWSP).

Key elements of the Permanent Water Saving Plan include:

- Specify requirements on non-residential properties and new non-residential properties using more than 10ML/yr in respect to water management plans (WaterMAPs).
- Changes in the time-of-use for both automatic and manual watering systems. These include private/public gardens and lawns, and public sports and recreational grounds.
- Fountains may only be used if they recirculate water.
- A hand held hose must not be used at any time to clean a vehicle unless it is fitted with a trigger nozzle.
- Hard surfaces must not be cleaned with water from a hose unless cleaning is required as a result of an accident, fire, emergency or a health hazard has developed.
- No restrictions apply to watering of plants at wholesale, retail and municipal garden nurseries.

- Hoses used in the construction industry must be fitted with a trigger nozzle.

Proposed Water Restrictions By-Law No. 404

The **Water Acts Amendment (Enforcement and Other Matters) Act 2007** made legislative changes to enable water corporations to issue infringement notices (on-the-spot-fines) for breaches of water restrictions. A draft model Water Restrictions By-Law to provide for these changes has recently been released for the water industry to adopt. The water restriction schedule in this new draft model by-law is based on the Uniform Guidelines adopted by Central Highlands Water in 2006 to support its Drought Response Plan.

The adoption of a new Water Restrictions By-Law provides an opportunity for Central Highlands Water to make changes to the restrictions schedule to reflect local community sentiment regarding aspects of the Uniform Guidelines.

In addition to providing for the issuing of infringement notices, changes are proposed by Central Highlands Water to the water restrictions schedule within the proposed Water Restrictions By-Law No. 404. These changes will provide for: earlier hand held hose evening watering times under Stage 3; no filling of new pools and spas under Stage 4; no topping up of private swimming pools or spas under Stage 4; no topping up of commercial pools and spas without an approved water conservation plan under Stage 4; no water for road construction under Stage 4; and increased restriction on the use of water for dust suppression under Stage 4.

From 12 noon, Saturday 6 October 2007, a revised Permanent Water Saving Plan will be imposed by Central Highlands Region Water Corporation, trading as Central Highlands Water, and will apply within the water supply districts of Central Highlands Water.

The following restrictions and prohibitions contained in the Plan will apply from 12 noon, Saturday 6 October 2007:

Residential or Commercial Gardens

*This term includes lawns

An automatic watering system:

- must not be used, except between 10.00 pm and 10.00 am on any day of the week; and
- which is installed on or after 1 September 2006, must not be used, unless it is fitted with either a rain sensor, soil moisture sensor, evapotranspiration device, weather station or equivalent device, as part of the control system.

A manual watering system must not be used, except between 8.00 pm and 10.00 am on any day of the week.

A hand-held hose fitted with a trigger nozzle, a watering can or a bucket may be used at any time.

Public Gardens* and Sports Grounds / Recreational Areas

*This term includes lawns

An automatic watering system:

- must not be used, except between 10.00 pm and 10.00 am on any day of the week; and
- which is installed on or after 1 January 2006, must not be used, unless it is fitted with either a rain sensor, soil moisture sensor, evapotranspiration device, weather station or equivalent device, as part of the control system.

On or after 1 September 2006, no automatic watering system may be used unless it is fitted with a rain sensor or soil moisture sensor.

A manual watering system must not be used, except between 8.00 pm and 10.00 am on any day of the week.

A hand-held hose fitted with a trigger nozzle, a watering can or a bucket may be used at anytime.

Fountains

A fountain which does not re-circulate water must not be operated.

No restriction applies to topping up a fountain at any time, provided that no more water than is necessary for that purpose is used.

Wholesale, Retail and Municipal Garden Nurseries

No restriction or prohibition applies to watering of plants of any description (including vegetables).

Vehicle Cleaning (All vehicles)

A hand held hose must not be used at any time to clean a vehicle unless it is fitted with a trigger nozzle.

A hand held hose must not be used to flush a boat motor, unless it is fitted with an appropriate flushing device designed for that purpose.

No restriction applies to using a bucket.

Paved Areas – Cleaning

A paved area must not be cleaned with water from a hose unless cleaning is required as a result of:

- an accident, fire, health hazard or other emergency;
- an identifiable safety hazard that has developed, and a hand held hose fitted with a trigger nozzle or a high pressure water cleaning device is used;
- staining to the surface that has developed, and a hand held hose fitted with a trigger nozzle or a high pressure water cleaning device is used, and then only once per season;
- construction or renovation work to the surface and a high pressure water cleaning device is used.

Construction Industry

A hose must not be used unless it is:

- fitted with a trigger nozzle; and
- is in good condition and does not leak.

Swimming Pools

A pool or spa with a capacity of 2,000 litres or greater must not be filled for the first time unless:

- an application which includes details of measures that have been, or will be, undertaken to provide water savings to offset the volume used in filling has been lodged with Central Highlands Water; and
- the application has been approved by Central Highlands Water, subject to such conditions as it may impose; and
- every such condition is complied with.

Non-residential properties and new non-residential properties

Water supplied by Central Highlands Water must not be used on an existing non-residential property or a new non-residential property (as the case may be) if one of the following circumstances applies:

- (a) Central Highlands Water gives notice to the occupier of an existing non-residential property that the property received a metered supply of 10 ML or more in the preceding financial year.
- (b) Central Highlands Water gives notice to the occupier of a new non-residential property that Central Highlands Water estimates that the property will receive a metered supply of 10 ML or more in the next financial year.

This restriction does not apply if the occupier complies with each of the following steps in relation to a waterMAP. The occupier must:

- (c) register its intention to prepare a waterMAP with Central Highlands Water within 1 month of the date of the notice referred to in (a) or (b);
- (d) prepare and submit a WaterMAP to Central Highlands Water within 3 months of registering its intention to prepare a waterMAP;
- (e) prepare and submit a report to Central Highlands Water by each anniversary of the date on which the waterMAP was first submitted, in relation to:

- the implementation of the waterMAP; and
 - water savings achieved through the implementation of the waterMAP during the preceding 12 months;
- (f) if requested to do so by Central Highlands Water:
- review the waterMAP to identify potential changes to the waterMAP which may improve future water savings at the property; and
 - amend the waterMAP to make any changes identified by that review; and
 - submit the amended waterMAP to Central Highlands Water within 3 months of the date of Central Highlands Water's original request.

Central Highlands Water may only request the occupier to carry out this reviewing and amending process in respect of the property once in every 12 month period.

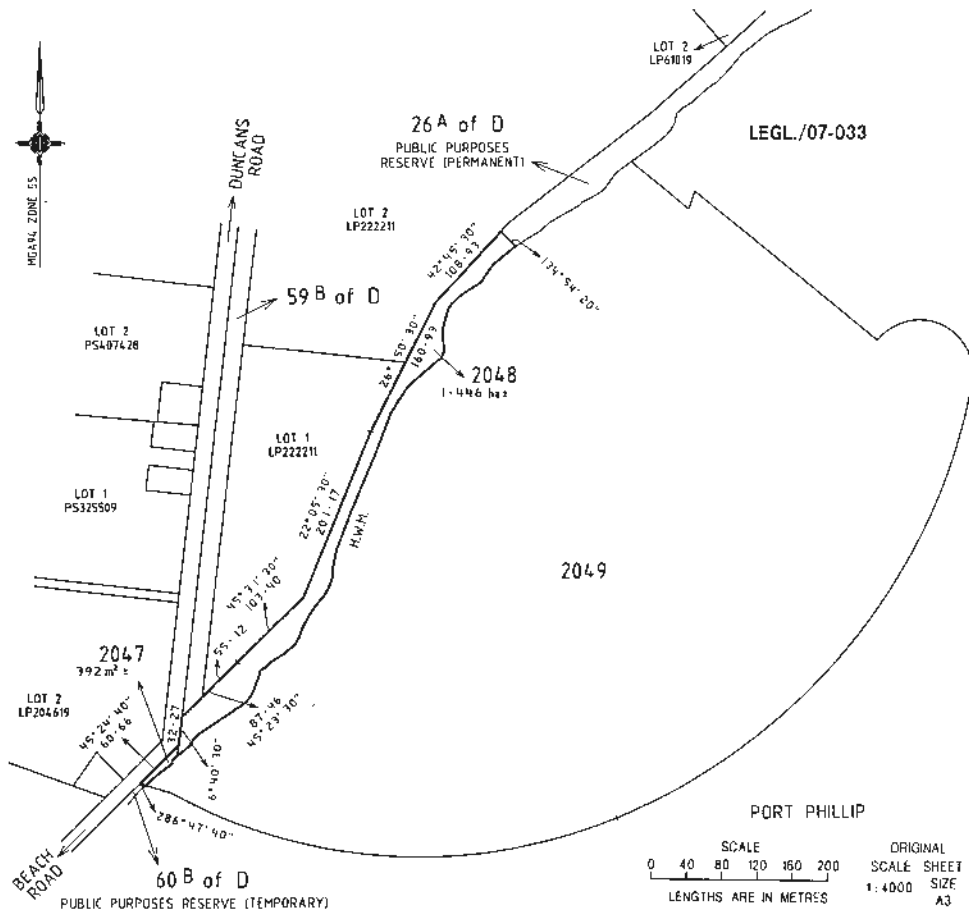

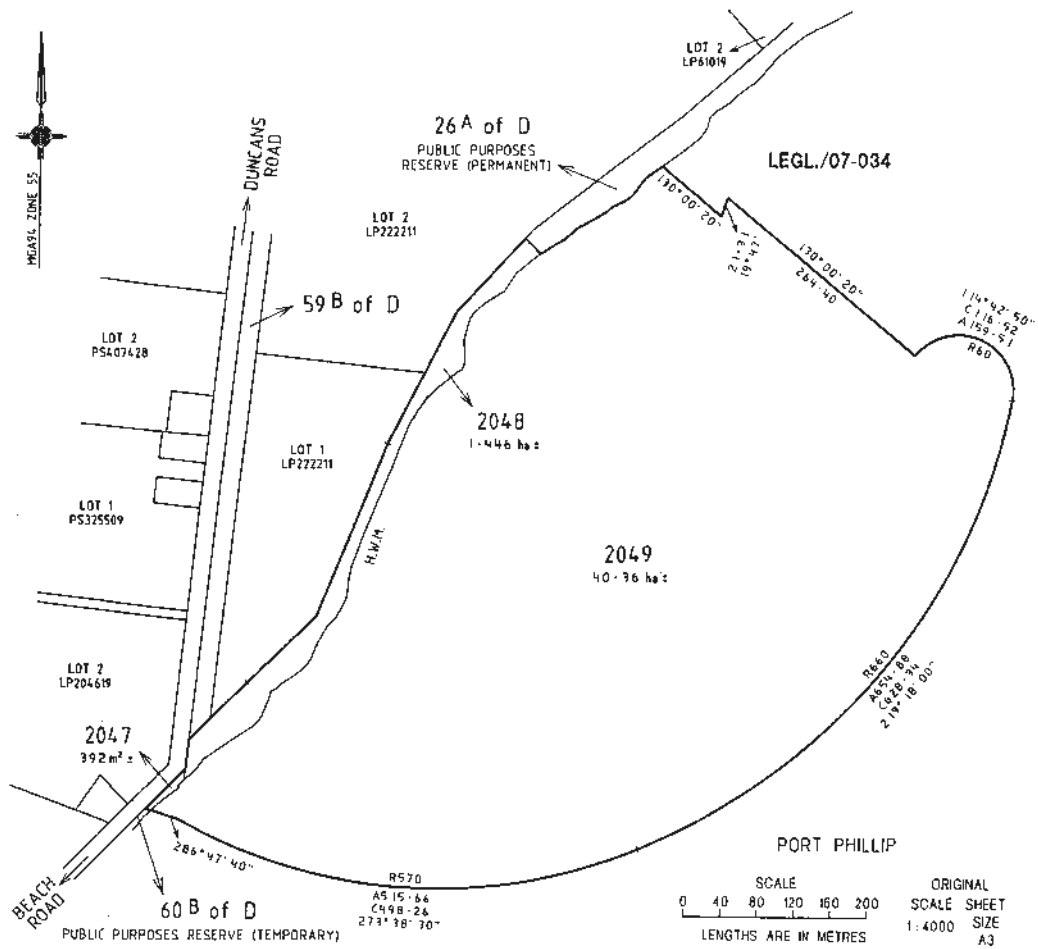
