

The Shire has resolved to discontinue the lane and sell it by private treaty to the adjoining owner for consolidation with the adjoining title.

The land is subject to any right, power or interest held by the Mornington Peninsula Shire Council and South East Water Limited in connection with any drains, sewers, pipes or plant under the control of these authorities in or near the road.

Order to Declare Part of Robinsons Park as a Designated Free Roam Area for Dogs

Notice is hereby given of an Order made by Frankston City Council, by resolution at its meeting on 10 November 2008, in accordance with the provisions of section 26(2) of the Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994, determining that Robinsons Park at 97R Robinsons Road, Frankston, excluding the oval and playing fields, be a designated free roam area and further determining that dogs be prohibited from entering and remaining on the oval and playing fields at the Park.

Owner's Obligation in regard to Free Roam Area

A dog may be exercised off a chain, cord or leash in the designated free roam area, if the owner:

- carries a chain, cord or leash sufficient to bring the dog under control, if the dog behaves in a manner which threatens any person or other animal;
- remains in effective voice or hand control of the dog as to be able to promptly bring the dog under effective control by placing the dog on a cord, chain or leash if that becomes necessary; and
- does not allow the dog to chase or threaten any person or animal.

In this Order:

'Owner' has the same meaning as in the Domestic (Feral and Nuisance) Animals Act 1994; and

'Designated Free Roam Area' is the area designated by signage.

Notice of Preparation of Amendment Amendment C90

Authorisation A1020

The Bass Coast Shire Council has prepared Amendment C90 to the Bass Coast Planning Scheme.

In accordance with section 8A(3) of the Planning and Environment Act 1987, the Minister for Planning authorised the Bass Coast Shire Council as planning authority to prepare the Amendment. The Minister also authorised the Bass Coast Shire Council to approve the Amendment under section 35B of the Act.

The land affected by the Amendment is the land in and around the townships of San Remo, Newhaven, and Cape Woolamai.

The Amendment proposes to:

- incorporate the San Remo, Newhaven, and Cape Woolamai Structure Plan into Clause 21.05-1 of Council's Municipal Strategic Statement as a reference document:
- insert policies into Clause 21.05-1 of Council's Municipal Strategic Statement to implement strategies for urban settlement and housing from the San Remo, Newhaven, and Cape Woolamai Structure Plan; and
- insert the adopted settlement boundaries and land uses arrangements set out in the San Remo, Newhaven, and Cape Woolamai Structure Plan into Clause 21.04 of Council's Municipal Strategic Statement.

GREATER GEELONG PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Preparation of Amendment Amendment C172

Authorisation A1174

The Greater Geelong City Council has prepared Amendment C172 to the Greater Geelong Planning Scheme.

In accordance with section 8A(3) of the **Planning and Environment Act 1987**, the Minister for Planning authorised the Greater Geelong City Council as planning authority to prepare the Amendment.

The Amendment affects various areas throughout the whole of the Greater Geelong municipality, which have been identified as wildfire-prone due to existing vegetation, land aspect and topography.

The Amendment:

- deletes the current Wildfire Management Overlay (WMO) (4 maps);
- inserts 13 new Wildfire Management Overlay maps across the municipality to include mapping / areas approved through the Council's Municipal Fire Prevention Committee and designated by City of Greater Geelong as Bushfire Prone Areas under the Building Act 1993; and
- amends the schedule to Clause 61.03 to update the list of maps forming part of the Planning Scheme.





BULK ENTITLEMENT (SEYMOUR) CONVERSION AMENDMENT ORDER 2008

I, Tim Holding, as Minister administering the Water Act 1989 (the Act), make the following Order -

1. Title

This Order is called the Bulk Entitlement (Seymour) Conversion Amendment Order 2008.

2. Preliminary

The Bulk Entitlement (Seymour) Conversion Order 1995 (the Bulk Entitlement Order) was made by the Minister on 21 August 1995 and published in the Government Gazette G37 on 21 September 1995. The Order converted all of the Mid-Goulburn Regional Water Board's entitlement to take water from the Goulburn River for the supply of the Seymour Water Supply System to a bulk entitlement.

On 1 July 1997, the Goulburn Valley Region Water Authority was appointed by Order of the Minister, to take over the whole of the property, rights, liabilities, obligations, powers and functions of the former Mid-Goulburn Regional Water Board.

Goulburn Valley Region Water Authority is now known as Goulburn Valley Region Water Corporation (the Authority).

The Authority, as part of its long-term strategy, is augmenting the Sunday Creek water supply system by constructing a pumping station on the Goulburn River near Tallarook and a pipeline to Broadford.

3. Purpose

The purpose of this Order is to enable the Authority to supply the Sunday Creek water supply system under the Bulk Entitlement (Seymour) Conversion Order 1995 by inserting an additional specified point on the Goulburn River near Tallarook.

4. Authorising provisions

This Order is made in accordance with section 44 of the Water Act 1989.

5. Commencement

This Order comes into operation on the day it is published in the Government Gazette.

6. Amendment of clause 4

In clause 4 of the Bulk Entitlement Order, substitute the definition of 'specified point' with -

"specified point" means –
