



Bayside Festival and Williamstown Festival Restrictions Relating to Alcoholic Beverages

In accordance with clause 85 of its Community Local Law ('the Local Law'), the Hobsons Bay City Council ('Council') has designated the following areas in which no person may consume any alcoholic beverage or have in his or her possession any alcoholic beverage.

#### BAYSIDE FESTIVAL

All areas within J. K. Grant Reserve, bounded by Fresno Street, Sugargum Drive and Civic Parade, Altona, excluding the two 30 metre areas to the north and south of the existing sports pavilion and social room buildings, together with any premises already licensed to sell and serve alcohol within the boundaries of J. K. Grant Reserve, as signposted.

#### WILLIAMSTOWN FESTIVAL

Darebin City Council has prepared Amendment C81 to the Darebin Planning Scheme.

In accordance with section 8A(3) of the **Planning and Environment Act 1987**, the Minister for Planning authorised the Darebin City Council as planning authority to prepare the Amendment.

The land affected by the Amendment is the area generally bounded by Darebin Road to the north, Charles Street to the south, St David Street and Andrew Street to the east, and Epping railway line to the west, and is the area identified in the 'Northcote Activity Centre Structure Plan, 2007'. The area includes the retail and business areas of High Street, Arthurton Road and Separation Street, Northcote, and the inter-nodal gateway, known as the Croxton Precinct.

The Amendment proposes to change the Darebin Planning Scheme by:

- making changes to the following subclauses of the Municipal Strategic Statement to reference the 'Northcote Activity Centre Structure Plan, 2007' and the 'Northcote Activity Centre Medium and Low Change Residential Areas Precinct Guidelines, 2008':
  - 21.05-2 Element 2: Housing;
  - 21.05-3 Element 3: Urban Design;
  - 21.05-5 Element 5: Economic Development;
  - 21.05-6 Element 6: Activity Centres;
  - 21.05-9 Element 9: Transport and Access;
- introducing a new local policy on the Northcote Activity Centre at Clause 22.11 of the Darebin Planning Scheme and amending the above subclauses of Clause 21.05 accordingly. The policy will implement the objectives and strategies of the 'Northcote Activity Centre Structure Plan, 2007';
- modifying Clause 22.08 High Street Corridor Land Use and Urban Design to remove inconsistencies with the Northcote Activity Centre Policy;
- modifying Clause 22.09 Residential and Mixed Use Development of Less than Four Storeys in Business 1 and Business 2 Zones to exclude land within Design and Development Overlay 13 (DDO13) 'Northcote Major Activity Centre' from its operation;
- modifying Clause 22.10 Residential and Mixed Use Development of Four or More Storeys to exclude land within Design and Development Overlay 13 (DDO13) 'Northcote Major Activity Centre' from its operation;
- rezoning land at 167, 169, 171–175, 177, 1–2/179, 181, 181A and 183 High Street, Northcote (situated on the western side of High Street between James Street and Campbell Grove) from Industrial 3 to Business 2 Zone;
- rezoning land at 1, 2, 3, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 1–3/12 Robbs Parade, Northcote (situated on the northern side of Robbs Parade) from Residential 1 to Business 5 Zone;
- rezoning land at 4, 6, 8, 10, 12, 14, 16 and 1–14/20 Separation Street Northcote (situated on the southern side of Separation Street) from Residential 1 to Business 1 Zone;
- rezoning land at 3 Dennis Street, Northcote from Residential 1 to Business 2 Zone;
- applying the Environmental Audit Overlay to the land at 167, 169, 171–175, 177, 1–2/179, 181, 181A and 183 High Street Northcote (situated on the western side of High Street between James Street and Campbell Grove);

- introducing Schedule 13 to the Design and Development Overlay (Clause 43.02) 'Northcote Major Activity Centre' and apply Design and Development Overlay 13 (DDO13) to all land forming the Northcote Activity Centre; and amend the above subclauses of Clause 21.05 accordingly;
- removing Design and Development Overlay 5 (DDO5) 'High Street Corridor View Protection' from land forming part of the Northcote Activity Centre; and
- modifying Design and Development Overlay 5 (DDO5) 'High Street Corridor View Protection' to remove references to land within the Northcote Activity Centre.
