Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995

ORDER DECLARING A RESTRICTED AREA AT KING VALLEY FOR THE CONTROL OF QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY

I, Joe Helper, Minister for Agriculture, under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**, make the following Order declaring a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly and specifying the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at King Valley, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order –

‘**accreditation program**’ means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

‘**Act**’ means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**;

‘**authorised person**’ means a person authorised by the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**inspector**’ means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

‘**Manager Plant Standards**’ means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager, Plant Standards in the Department of Primary industries;

‘**Queensland fruit fly**’ means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

‘**Queensland fruit fly host material**’ means any fruit or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 2.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

(1) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.

(2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the Queensland fruit fly host material is–

(a) packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program, administered by the Department of Primary Industries; or

(b) accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards; or

(c) accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

SPECIAL

- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must give an inspector access to such land for the purposes of inspection, deployment of any lures or traps, application of any treatment or performance of any other actions which are necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of the pest.
- (4) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must, on instruction from an inspector, strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

6. Verification of Consignments

Any Queensland fruit fly host material removed from the restricted area in accordance with clause 5(2), and the accompanying certificate or declaration, must be:

- (1) presented to an inspector for inspection; or
- (2) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.

Schedule 2

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of Sawmill Lane and Glenrowan–Moyhu Road, then in an easterly direction along Glenrowan–Moyhu Road, which becomes Moyhu–Meadows Creek Road to the intersection of Moyhu–Meadows Creek Road and Hills Lane, then in a straight line in an easterly direction to the intersection of Holmes Lane and Carboor–Everton Road, then in a south-easterly direction along Carboor–Everton Road, to the intersection of Carboor–Everton Road and Lake Buffalo Road–Carboor Road, then in a south easterly direction along Lake Buffalo Road–Carboor Road to the intersection of Lake Buffalo Road–Carboor Road and Wrights Lane, then in a straight line in a south-westerly direction to the intersection of Black Range Track and Porters Track, then in a straight line in a south westerly direction to the intersection of Rose River Road and Patrol Track, then in a straight line in a westerly direction to the intersection of Mansfield–Whitfield Road and Powers Lookout Road, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the intersection of Upper Fifteen Mile Creek Road and Benalla–Whitfield Road, then in a north-westerly direction along the Benalla–Whitfield Road to the intersection of Benalla–Whitfield Creek Road and Dinnings Lane, then in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the point of commencement.

Schedule 3

The area of land in Victoria within a radius of one and a half kilometres of the outbreak epicentre at 146.41710° East, 36.70130° South.

Note: Section 21 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** provides that a person is guilty of an offence and liable for a penalty not exceeding 50 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 100 penalty units in the case of a body corporate for moving any host material from a restricted area contrary to any restrictions, unless authorised to do so by a permit issued by an Inspector.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at Cobram South, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order—

‘**accreditation program**’ means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

‘**Act**’ means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**;

‘**authorised person**’ means a person authorised by the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**inspector**’ means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

‘**Manager Plant Standards**’ means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager, Plant Standards in the Department of Primary industries;

‘**Queensland fruit fly**’ means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

‘**Queensland fruit fly host material**’ means any fruit or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 2.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the Queensland fruit fly host material is—
 - (a) packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program, administered by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards; or
 - (c) accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.
- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must give an inspector access to such land for the purposes of inspection, deployment of any lures or traps, application of any treatment or performance of any other actions which are necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of the pest.

- (4) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must, on instruction from an inspector, strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

6. Verification of Consignments

Any Queensland fruit fly host material removed from the restricted area in accordance with clause 5(2), and the accompanying certificate or declaration, must be:

- (1) presented to an inspector for inspection; or
 (2) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the Murray River and Dead River Track, then in a southerly direction along Dead River Track to the intersection of Dead River Track and Murray Valley Highway, then in a easterly direction along Murray Valley Highway to the intersection of Murray Valley Highway and Grinter Road, then in a southerly direction along Grinter Road to the intersection of Grinter Road and Cassidy Road, then in a westerly direction along Cassidy Road to the intersection of Cassidy Road and Youarang Road, then in a southerly direction along Youarang Road to the intersection of Youarang Road Katamatite–Yarrowonga Road, then in a westerly direction along Katamatite–Yarrowonga Road to the intersection of Katamatite–

Yarrowonga Road and Langan Road, then in a southerly then westerly direction along Langan Road to the intersection of Langan Road and Benalla–Tocumwal Road, then in a north-westerly direction along Benalla–Tocumwal Road to the intersection of Benalla–Tocumwal Road and Katamatite–Nathalia Road, then in a westerly direction along Katamatite–Nathalia Road to the intersection of Katamatite–Nathalia Road and Larissa Road, then in a northerly direction along Larissa Road to the intersection of Larissa Road and Lukies Road, then in a westerly direction along Lukies Road to the intersection of Lukies Road and Kokoda Road, then in a northerly direction along Kokoda Road to the intersection of Kokoda Road and Loofs Road, then in a westerly direction along Loofs Road to the intersection of Loofs Road and Labuan Road, then in a northerly direction along Labuan Road to the intersection of Labuan Road and Allerts Road, then in a westerly direction along Allerts Road to the intersection of Allerts Road and Lorenzs Road, then in a northerly direction along Lorenzs Road which becomes Ruttles Road, to the intersection of Ruttles Road and Bearii East Road, then in an easterly direction along Bearii East Road to the intersection of Bearii East Road and Stokes Road, then in a northerly direction along Stokes Road to the intersection of Stokes Road and Mywee–Koonoomoo Road, then in a straight line in a north easterly direction to the intersection of Goulburn Valley Highway and Green Lane, then continuing in an easterly direction along Green Lane to the intersection of Green lane and the Murray River, then in a generally south-east direction along the Murray River to the point of commencement.

Schedule 3

The area of land in Victoria within a radius of one and a half kilometres of the outbreak epicentre at 145.64723 East, 35.97041 South.

Note: Section 21 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** provides that a person is guilty of an offence and liable for a penalty not exceeding 50 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 100 penalty units in the case of a body corporate for moving any host material from a restricted area contrary to any restrictions, unless authorised to do so by a permit issued by an Inspector.
