ORDER DECLARING A RESTRICTED AREA AT HILLSIDE FOR THE CONTROL OF QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY

I, Joe Helper, Minister for Agriculture, under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**, make the following Order declaring a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly and specifying the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at Hillside, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order –

‘**accreditation program**’ means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

‘**Act**’ means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**;

‘**authorised person**’ means a person authorised by the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**inspector**’ means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

‘**Manager Plant Standards**’ means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager, Plant Standards in the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**Queensland fruit fly**’ means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

‘**Queensland fruit fly host material**’ means any fruit or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 2.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the Queensland fruit fly host material is –
 - (a) packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program, administered by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards; or
 - (c) accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

SPECIAL

- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must give an inspector access to such land for the purposes of inspection, deployment of any lures or traps, application of any treatment or performance of any other actions which are necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of the pest.
- (4) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must, on instruction from an inspector, strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

6. Verification of consignments

Any Queensland fruit fly host material removed from the restricted area in accordance with clause 5(2), and the accompanying certificate or declaration, must be:

- (1) presented to an inspector for inspection; or
- (2) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of Great Alpine Road and Deptford Road, then in a southerly direction along Great Alpine Road to the intersection of Great Alpine Road and McNamaras Lane, then in an easterly direction along McNamaras Lane to the intersection of McNamaras Lane and Jennings Lane, then in a southerly direction along Jennings Lane, which becomes Morrison Road, to the intersection of Morrison Road and Broadlands Road, then in an easterly direction along Broadlands Road to the intersection of Broadlands Road and Riverbank Road, then in a straight line in a southerly direction to the intersection of Johnstons Road and McDonalds Road, then in an easterly direction along Johnstons Road to the intersection of Johnstons Road and Bairnsdale–Forge Creek Road, then in a south-easterly direction along Bairnsdale–Forge Creek Road to the intersection of Bairnsdale–Forge Creek Road and Netley Road, then in a westerly direction along Netley Road to the intersection of Netley Road and Centre Goon Nure Road, then in a southerly direction along Centre Goon Nure Road to the intersection of Centre Goon Nure Road and Comleys Road, then in a westerly direction along Comleys Road to the intersection of Comleys Road and Bengworden Road, then in a southerly direction along Bengworden Road to the intersection of Bengworden Road and Leathams Road, then in a straight line in a north-westerly direction to the intersection of Lindenow Road and Princes Highway, then in a northerly direction along Lindenow Road to the intersection of Lindenow Road and Man Deans Lane, then in a westerly direction along Man Deans Lane to the intersection of Man Deans Lane and Resides Lane, then in a northerly direction along Resides Lane to the intersection of Resides Lane and Chettles Lane, then in a straight line in a northerly direction to the intersection of Alexanders Road and Lindenow–Glenaladale Road, then in a northerly direction along Alexanders Road to the intersection of Alexanders Road and Dunbar Road, then in a straight line in a north-easterly direction to the intersection of McComas Road and Cox Track, then in a straight line in an easterly direction to the intersection of Bullumwaal Road and Mia Mia Road, then in a south-easterly direction along Bullumwaal Road to the intersection of Bullumwaal Road and Reserve Road, then in an easterly direction along Reserve Road, which becomes Bouchers Road, to the intersection of Bouchers Road and Deptford Road, then in a southerly direction along Deptford Road to the point of commencement.

Schedule 3

The area of land in Victoria within a radius of one and a half kilometres of the outbreak epicentre at 147.51490° East, 37.80700° South.

Note: Section 21 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** provides that a person is guilty of an offence and liable for a penalty not exceeding 50 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 100 penalty units in the case of a body corporate for moving any host material from a restricted area contrary to any restrictions, unless authorised to do so by a permit issued by an Inspector.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at Strathmerton, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 20 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**.

3. Definition

In this Order –

‘**accreditation program**’ means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

‘**Act**’ means the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**;

‘**authorised person**’ means a person authorised by the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**inspector**’ means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

‘**Manager Plant Standards**’ means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager, Plant Standards in the Department of Primary Industries;

‘**Queensland fruit fly**’ means the exotic pest *Bactrocera tryoni* (Froggatt); and

‘**Queensland fruit fly host material**’ means any fruit or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland fruit fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 2.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland fruit fly host material is prohibited.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the Queensland fruit fly host material is –
 - (a) packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program, administered by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards; or
 - (c) accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.
- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must give an inspector access to such land for the purposes of inspection, deployment of any lures or traps, application of any treatment or performance of any other actions which are necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of the pest.

- (4) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must, on instruction from an inspector, strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

6. Verification of consignments

Any Queensland fruit fly host material removed from the restricted area in accordance with clause 5(2), and the accompanying certificate or declaration, must be:

- (1) presented to an inspector for inspection; or
- (2) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.

The area of land bounded by a line commencing at the intersection of the Murray River and Yarrawonga–Cobram Road, then in a westerly direction along Yarrawonga–Cobram Road to the intersection of Yarrawonga–Cobram Road and Campbell Road, then in a southerly direction along Campbell Road to the intersection of Campbell Road and Healy Road, then in a westerly direction along Healy Road to the intersection of Healy Road and Cobram South Road, then in a southerly direction along Cobram South Road to the intersection of Cobram South Road and Benalla–Tocumwal Road, then in a south easterly direction along Benalla–Tocumwal Road to the intersection of Benalla–Tocumwal Road and Sandmount Road, then in a westerly direction along Sandmount Road to the intersection of Sandmount Road and Tobruk Road, then in a southerly direction along Tobruk Road to the intersection of Tobruk Road and Ross Road, then in a westerly direction along Ross Road to the intersection of Ross Road and Larissa Road, then in a southerly direction along Larissa Road to the intersection of Larissa Road and Mills Road, then in a westerly direction along Mills Road to the intersection of Mills Road and Labuan Road, then in a southerly direction along Labuan Road to the intersection of Labuan Road and Naring Hall Road, then in a westerly direction along Naring Hall Road to the intersection of Naring Hall Road and Okanes Road, then in a northerly direction along Okanes Road to the intersection of Okanes Road and Numurkah Road, then in a northerly direction along Numurkah Road to the intersection of Numurkah Road and Allerts Road, then in a westerly direction along Allerts Road to the intersection of Allerts Road and the Goulburn Valley Highway, then in a northerly direction along the Goulburn Valley Highway to the intersection of the Goulburn Valley Highway and Orams Road, then in a westerly direction along Orams Road to the intersection of Orams Road and Boothroyds Road, then in a northerly direction along Boothroyds Road to the intersection of Boothroyds Road and Katunga–Picola Road, then in a westerly direction along Katunga–Picola Road to the intersection of Katunga–Picola Road and Rendells Road, then in a northerly direction along Rendells Road to the intersection of Rendells Road and Christies Road, then in a westerly direction along Christies Road to the intersection of Christies Road and Boals Road, then in a northerly direction along Boals Road, which becomes Haynes Road, to the intersection of Haynes Road and River Road, then continuing in a straight line in a northerly direction to the Murray River, then in a generally easterly direction along the Murray River to the point of commencement.

The area of land in Victoria within a radius of one and a half kilometres of the outbreak epicentre at 145.50378° East, 36.92504° South.
