MINISTERIAL NOTICE

I, Tony Robinson MP, Minister for Gaming, by Notice under section 3.2A.7(1A) of the **Gambling Regulation Act 2003**, declare that the day, on and from which it will be unlawful for an entitlement holder to hold a prohibited number of hotel gaming machine entitlements or club gaming machine entitlements, is 7 June 2010.

DETERMINATION OF GAMING MACHINE ENTITLEMENT ALLOCATION AND TRANSFER RULES

I, Tony Robinson MP, Minister for Gaming, acting under sections 3.4A.3 and 3.4A.5(9) of the **Gambling Regulation Act 2003** determine as follows –

1. The following rules constitute gaming machine entitlement allocation and transfer rules.
2. For the purposes of section 3.4A.5(9) of the Act, the gaming machine entitlement allocation and transfer rules specify –
 - (a) the process for allocating gaming machine entitlements; and
 - (b) the requirements to be complied with by a person wishing to participate in the process for allocating gaming machine entitlements.
3. These rules amend the gaming machine entitlement allocation and transfer rules that were published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 18 March 2010 as follows:
 - 3.1 For rule 20(b) the following rule is substituted:
‘20(b) An order will not be accepted by the auction system where the relevant order does not meet or exceed the opening bid price.’
 - 3.2 For rules 26(a)(i), (ii), (v) and (vi) the following rules are substituted:
 - ‘(i) if new orders at or above the market price plus minimum order price increment (if any) are submitted during a round which attempt to take up a sufficient number of entitlements, the remaining number of rounds on the new order monitor will reset to the original number;’
 - ‘(ii) if new orders at or above the market price plus minimum order price increment (if any) are submitted during a round which do not attempt to take up a sufficient number of entitlements, the number of remaining rounds on the new order monitor will be reduced by one;’
 - ‘(v) if provisionally successful orders which take up a sufficient number of entitlements are calculated during a round, the remaining number of rounds on the successful order monitor will reset to the original number; and’
 - ‘(vi) if provisionally successful orders which do not take up a sufficient number of entitlements are calculated during a round, the remaining number of rounds on the successful order monitor is reduced by one.’
4. Other than as amended by rule 3 the gaming machine entitlement allocation and transfer rules that were published in the Victoria Government Gazette on 18 March 2010 remain of full force and effect.
5. These rules take effect on the date of publication in the Victoria Government Gazette.
