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




Closure of Roadways for the Construction of the  
2010 UCI Road World Championships Event Facilities

The 2010 UCI Road World Championships will be staged in Geelong from Wednesday 29 September to Sunday 3 October 2010.

Works are to commence on the construction of the start/finish precinct for the 2010 UCI Road World Championships. This precinct includes substantial structures and equipment associated with the competition, broadcast and participant facilities required for the World Championship event.

To allow for the safe construction of these facilities, a number of roadways will be closed to public traffic outside of the event competition times as detailed in the following table:

Notice of Intention to Make Local Law  
Tree Protection Local Law 2010 No. 17

Notice is hereby given pursuant to the provisions of section 119(2) of the **Local Government Act 1989** that, at its meeting on 2 August 2010, Frankston City Council resolved to make Tree Protection Local Law 2010 No. 17.

**Purpose of the Proposed Local Law**

The purpose of the proposed Local Law is to provide for protection of trees (as defined for the purpose of the Local Law), to introduce a permit system to ensure protection of trees and to introduce penalties for offences against the Local Law.

**General Purport of the Proposed Local Law**

The proposed Local Law, if made, will:

- (i) without a permit, make it an offence to remove, damage, kill or destroy or direct, authorise or allow to be removed, damaged, killed or destroyed a tree (as defined);
- (ii) without a permit, make it an offence to carry out, or direct, authorise or allow to be carried out any works near a tree (as defined) where any part of the works takes place within the tree protection zone;
- (iii) without a permit, make it an offence in defined circumstances to prune, cut, trim, top or direct, authorise or allow to be pruned, cut, topped or trimmed a tree (as defined);
- (iv) introduce procedures for applying for permits and issue of permits;
- (v) allow impoundment of any item being used to undertake works in contravention of the local law and introduce release and disposal provisions for an impounded item; and
- (vi) prescribe penalties for offences under the local law.

Please note, that unless a submitter advises the City to the contrary, the submission will be made available to the public, as part of a Council agenda.

Council, in accordance with section 223 of the **Local Government Act 1989**, will consider all written submissions received within the prescribed time.

Any person lodging a submission should clearly state whether they wish to be heard in support of the submission. Such person/s will be heard by Council (or a committee established by Council for this purpose) and may be represented by a person acting on his or her behalf. Notification will be given of the date and time of the hearing.



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### **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995**

#### **ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING THE ENTRY OR IMPORTATION OF FIRE ANT HOST MATERIAL INTO VICTORIA**

I, Patrick Sharkey, as delegate of the Minister for Agriculture, make the following Order:

#### **1. Objective**

The objective of this Order is to prevent the entry or importation of the exotic pest fire ant into Victoria.

#### **2. Authorising provision**

This Order is made under section 24 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** ('the Act').

#### **3. Revocation**

The Order made on 15 September 2009 and published in Government Gazette G39 on 24 September 2009 is revoked.

#### **4. Definitions**

In this Order –

**'accreditation program'** means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

**'authorised inspector'** means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act;

**'fire ant'** means the exotic pest *Solenopsis invicta* (Buren);

**'fire ant host material'** means any material capable of harbouring fire ants, including plants, landscaping materials, soil, turf, hay and straw, agricultural equipment or used package;

**'hay and straw'** includes baled organic material and fodder;

**'landscaping material'** means any non-liquid combination of organic material, potting media, sand, coal fines, dried biosolids or mulch;

**'Manager Plant Standards'** means the person for the time being occupying or acting in the position of Manager Plant Standards in the Department of Primary Industries;

**'plants'** means any plants including plants with potting media or soil attached, containerised plants and other plants such as epiphytic ferns, but not bare rooted plants or cut flowers or foliage;

**'turf'** means any grass sod with soil or potting media attached.

**5. Controls applying to fire ant host materials**

- (1) The entry or importation into Victoria of any fire ant host material is prohibited.
- (2) Sub-clause (1) does not apply if the fire ant host material:
  - (a) was grown, sourced or last used on a property that is located in a State or Territory, or part of a State or Territory, for which an area freedom certificate issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory where the fire ant material host material was grown, sourced or last used, is currently in force certifying that the State or Territory or that part of the State or Territory is known to be free of fire ants; or
  - (b) is packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program, administered by the department responsible for agriculture in the affected State or Territory; or
  - (c) is accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that it has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards; or
  - (d) is accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an officer of the department responsible for agriculture in the affected State or Territory certifying that it has been treated in a manner approved by the Manager Plant Standards.

**6. Verification of Consignments**

Any fire ant host material imported into Victoria which is required by clause 5(2) to be accompanied by a certificate or declaration, must be:

- (a) presented to an authorised inspector for inspection, examination or treatment; or
- (b) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.

Note: Section 25 of the **Plant Health and Plant Products Act 1995** provides that a person is guilty of an offence and a penalty not exceeding 50 penalty units in the case of a natural person, and 200 penalty units in the case of a body corporate, for knowingly breaching an Importation Order.

Exemption from Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007  
Exemption Number H10/02930

**Purpose**

To exempt Australian Grand Prix Corporation ('AGPC') from the requirement that it, as an employer, must not engage unlicensed employees to do high risk work.

**Definition**

AGPC, located at 220 Albert Road, South Melbourne, has defined its function as the employer responsible for the safe use of forklifts by operators employed by the International Racing teams and Dorna Management Limited.

**Background**

In undertaking its operations, AGPC engages employees who operate industrial lift trucks (forklifts) and who are required to hold a Forklift Licence under the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007 (Vic.).

However, as the work required to be performed involves the handling of sensitive and high value items of equipment owned by the International Racing teams and Dorna Sports S.L.U. within the limited duration of the Motor Cycle Grand Prix Event<sup>1</sup> at Phillip Island ('the Event'), and taking into consideration the ongoing international commitments to the International Racing program throughout the year whereupon team forklift operators are required to attend the various Events, an exemption was sought by AGPC from the requirement that an employer must not use unlicensed employees to do high risk work.

**Regulations**

Regulations 3.6.2(a) of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007 states:

- 'An employer must not allow an employee to do any high risk work unless –
- (a) the employee holds an appropriate high risk work licence in relation to that work'.

**Exemption**

Subject to the prescribed conditions of this exemption, under Regulation 7.2.2 of the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007, I exempt AGPC from the requirements of Regulation 3.6.2 (a) with respect to Forklift licences for the type of work described below.

I am satisfied that the work can be performed as safely by a person who does not hold the licence as it can be performed by a person who holds such a licence, provided that there is adherence to the prescribed conditions of this exemption.

**Type of Work**

Forklift operations, within the designated areas noted under the conditions of this exemption associated with the unloading and loading, including handling on site, of equipment owned and/or operated by the International Racing teams at the Motor Cycle Grand Prix at Phillip Island.

**Conditions**

This exemption is subject to the following listed conditions:

1. This exemption is granted to AGPC and shall only apply to overseas employees employed by the International Racing teams and Dorna Management Sports S.L.U. operating industrial lift trucks (forklifts) at the Motor Cycle Grand Prix at Phillip Island for the exemption period.
2. This exemption shall only apply to designated operational areas for forklifts at the Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit, noted in Drawing, Forklift Operational Area – Phillip Island Grand Prix Circuit submitted to the VWA by AGPC.

<sup>1</sup> Event means the running of the Motor Cycle Grand Prix at Phillip Island by AGPC.

3. The AGPC must notify the VWA in writing, no later than one calendar month prior to the Event, of any variations being proposed with regard to the forklift operational areas at workplace, and/or the freight operations plan associated with the work being undertaken.
4. The maximum number of forklifts operating at any one time within the designated operational areas will be 14, being comprised of a maximum of 2 from any team including Dorna Management Sports S.L.U.
5. This exemption shall only apply for a period of 3 years commencing 2010, including 2011, and ending in 2012, and during each of these years, commencing 14 days prior to the first day of the Event and ending 14 days after the last day of the Event, unless revoked or amended by the Victorian Workcover Authority (VWA) in writing.
6. In order for employees to operate forklifts under this exemption, the following conditions shall be met:
  - a. Each forklift operator is required to hold, and provide evidence of, a forklift high risk work licence or certificate of competency issued overseas, together with a colour photograph and supporting identification. AGPC shall verify the evidence for each operator, and retain copies. In addition, copies of this documentation shall be provided to the VWA for review by its Licensing Compliance Auditor.
  - b. A supervisor representing the AGPC or its Project manager shall be present at the Event and will ensure an initial competency assessment is undertaken for each forklift operator by a Victorian or Interstate High Risk Work Licence Assessor<sup>2</sup>. A competency assessment shall be undertaken as specified in the Statement of Competency Review part of the National Assessment Instrument – TLILIC108A ‘Licence to operate a forklift truck’.
  - c. The competency assessments shall include operators carrying out the task of unloading and storing equipment in the pits/track.
  - d. The High Risk Work Licence Assessor must complete and sign the ‘Forklift Truck – Competency Summary’ and each operator must sign the ‘Forklift Truck – Competency Summary’.
  - e. Copies of the signed assessments of operators deemed competent must be provided to and retained by the AGPC. Operator details must be forwarded to the VWA within 14 days of the assessment and each signed competency assessment is to be made available on request by VWA.
  - f. VWA will initiate random audits of the assessment process to ensure that a high standard of competency is being delivered and maintained by the High Risk Work Licence Assessor.
  - g. AGPC shall ensure information is provided to the International Racing teams and Dorna Management Limited employees regarding safety requirements prior to the Event in a format and language that employees can understand. Each forklift operator shall receive specific information and instructions for the circuit upon their arrival.
  - h. Forklift operators must produce their relevant AGPC accreditation for access to the designated operational areas, acknowledge and sign a safety undertaking, in the language that the operator understands, prior to being provided the keys to operate a forklift.
  - i. A physical boundary shall be erected to restrict unauthorised access into, and traffic egress from, the designated operational areas where the forklift operators shall be working. AGPC shall ensure security personnel are provided to enforce the secured area.

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- j. All personnel working within the designated operational areas shall wear appropriate personal protective equipment, including high visibility clothing and protective footwear.
  - k. Forklifts being operated by International Racing teams and Dorna Management Limited shall be sourced locally from Australian suppliers and shall undergo and satisfy a safety inspection at the commencement of each day, conducted by a suitably competent person. AGPC shall retain copies of each safety inspection and provide them on request to the VWA.
  - l. A detailed freight operations plan (referenced in the 'International Freight Logistics – Phillip Island Site Operations Plan (including Forklift Truck Operations) for these activities shall be implemented, and shall include site safety rules, a traffic management plan, forklift safety requirements, a system for reporting of hazards and incidents, and emergency response procedures. This plan is to be made available to the VWA on request.
  - m. A suitably competent safety officer/observer, independent of Dorna Management Sports S.L.U. and the International Racing teams, shall be in place in the designated operational areas for forklifts and have the authority to enforce safety requirements and plans. The safety officer/observer shall initiate immediate corrective actions when non-compliance is identified.
  - n. VWA will audit AGPC records from time to time at its discretion to ensure that the above conditions are observed.
  - o. Without limiting the discretion available to the VWA under the **Occupational Health and Safety Act 2004** or the Occupational Health and Safety Regulations 2007, a failure by the AGPC to observe any of these exemption conditions may result in the revocation or variation of the exemption by the VWA.
