



Casterton Livestock Saleyards Local Law 2013

Notice is given that at the Ordinary Council Meeting of the Glenelg Shire Council (Council) held on 29 January 2013, Council proposed to make a Local Law titled 'Casterton Livestock Saleyards Local Law 2013' (the Local Law).

The following information about the Local Law is provided in accordance with section 119(2) of the Local Government Act 1989 (the Act):

Purpose:

The purposes of this Local Law are to:

- a) provide for the effective administration and management of the Casterton Livestock Saleyards.
- b) assist in the documentation of procedures and the expectations of Saleyard users.
- c) provide for the setting and collection of fees from Stock Agents and Vendors selling livestock in the Saleyards.
- d) enable the Saleyard Manager to prescribe the days and hours during each day on which sales can be held at the Saleyards.
- e) protect Council assets and facilities at the Saleyards.
- promote and enforce appropriate adherence to occupational health and safety practices at the Saleyards.
- g) control and prevent behaviour which is a nuisance, or which may be detrimental to health and safety.
- h) control the use of the saleyards at all times.
- i) control the use of dogs at the Saleyards.
- j) regulate smoking and the consumption of alcohol at the Saleyards.
- k) provide for fair and reasonable treatment of animals and the application of adequate animal husbandry practices.

General Purport:

The general purport of this Local Law, in relation to the Casterton Saleyards is to:

 a) provide for a safer, more effective and compliant livestock saleyard facility for users; and b) provide for the fair and reasonable treatment of animals and the application of adequate animal husbandry practices.

BENALLA PLANNING SCHEME Notice of Preparation of Amendment

Amendment C18

Authorisation A02183

The Benalla Rural City Council has prepared Amendment C18 to the Benalla Planning Scheme.

In accordance with section 8A(3) of the **Planning and Environment Act 1987**, the Minister for Planning authorised the Benalla Rural City Council as planning authority to prepare the Amendment.

The Amendment applies to two parcels of land at 17 Glen West Lane, Winton, more particularly described as Lot 1 on TP345760 and Lot 1 on TP381841.

The Amendment proposes to correct anomalies in the Benalla Planning Scheme by:

INTERIM EXEMPTION Application No. A19/2013

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the Act) by AQA Victoria Ltd (the applicant). The application for exemption is to enable the applicant to advertise for and employ a male attendant carer or female attendant carer as the need arises (the exempt conduct).

Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the affidavit of Peter Trethewey, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an interim exemption from sections 16, 107 and 182 to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct until the application is finally heard and determined.

In granting this exemption, the Tribunal noted:

 The applicant is a service provider of attendant care to people with quadriplegia and similar physical disabilities. The attendants work in the client's home and their work often includes providing intimate support during bladder and bowel actions and in areas of

- general hygiene. The majority of clients indicate they have a gender preference when seeking to employ attendants.
- Previous exemptions have been granted to the applicant in similar terms. The last exemption granted in 2010 expires on 17 February 2013. I am not currently satisfied that an exception applies to the exempt conduct. Accordingly, in the absence of an exemption the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination after 17 February 2013.
- When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (Charter). Arguably, this exemption limits the right to equality and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination of men or women who wish to be employed by the applicant at a time when their gender is not sought. I am satisfied that for the purposes of this interim exemption, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.

The Tribunal hereby grants an interim exemption from the operation of sections 16, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force from the day on which notice of the exemption is published in the Government Gazette until 4 May 2013.





Plant Biosecurity Act 2010

ORDER DECLARING A RESTRICTED AREA AT KERANG FOR THE CONTROL OF QUEENSLAND FRUIT FLY

I, Peter Walsh, Minister for Agriculture and Food Security, under section 32 of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**, make the following Order declaring a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly and specifying the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

1. Objective

The objective of this Order is to declare a restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly at Kerang, and to specify the prohibitions, restrictions and requirements which are to operate in the restricted area.

2. Authorising provisions

This Order is made under section 20 of the Plant Biosecurity Act 2010.

3. Definition

In this Order -

'accreditation program' means any program under which a person is permitted to issue an assurance certificate, including any procedures available under the Interstate Certification Assurance (ICA) Scheme;

'Act' means the Plant Biosecurity Act 2010;

'authorised person' means a person authorised by the Department of Primary Industries;

'inspector' means a person authorised as an inspector under the Act:

'Queensland Fruit Fly' means the exotic pest Bactrocera tryoni (Froggatt); and

'Queensland Fruit Fly host material' means any fruit or vegetable listed in Schedule 1.

4. Restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly

The restricted area for the control of Queensland Fruit Fly is declared to be the area described in Schedule 2.

5. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

- (1) The removal from the restricted area into any part of Victoria of any Queensland Fruit Fly host material is prohibited.
- (2) Subclause (1) does not apply if the Queensland Fruit Fly host material is
 - (a) packed, labelled and certified in accordance with any conditions prescribed by an accreditation program administered by the Department of Primary Industries; or
 - (b) accompanied by a plant health declaration issued by an authorised person declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Director, Plant Biosecurity and Product Integrity or the Plant Biosecurity Manager; or
 - (c) accompanied by a plant health certificate issued by an inspector certifying that the host material has been treated in a manner approved by the Director, Plant Biosecurity and Product Integrity or the Plant Biosecurity Manager.
- (3) The owners and occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must give an inspector access to such land for the purposes of inspection, deployment of any lures or traps, application of any treatment or performance of any other actions which are necessary for the eradication or prevention of spread of the pest.

(4) The owners or occupiers of land described in Schedule 3 must, on instruction from an inspector, strip Queensland Fruit Fly host materials from plants, collect and dispose of waste material, or treat the material in a manner approved by the Director, Plant Biosecurity and Product Integrity or the Plant Biosecurity Manager.

6. Verification of Consignments

Any Queensland Fruit Fly host material removed from the restricted area in accordance with clause 5(2), and the accompanying certificate or declaration, must be:

- (1) presented to an inspector for inspection; or
- (2) verified by a person accredited to do so by the Department of Primary Industries.




