NOTICE OF PREPARATION OF REGULATORY IMPACT STATEMENT

#### **Gambling Regulation Act 2003**

Notice is given that, in accordance with section 12I of the **Subordinate Legislation Act 1994**, a Regulatory Impact Statement (RIS) has been prepared for the legislative instrument under section 3.6.5A of the **Gambling Regulation Act 2003**.

The objective of the proposed legislative instrument is to apply a supervision charge on venue operator licensees holding gaming machine entitlements to fully recover the reasonable costs incurred by the Victorian Commission for Gambling and Liquor Regulation in performing its gaming related regulatory activities in 2012–13. The reasonable costs recovered will exclude revenue collected from other gaming related regulatory fees paid by venue operator licensees to avoid double charging.

The RIS assesses four options in the design and structure of the gaming supervision charge in 2012–13. The RIS concludes that imposing two tiered charge based on the number of gaming entitlements owned and gaming machines operated by a venue operator was most appropriate in a year where Victoria has transitioned to a new gaming regulatory model. The proposed charge recognises the different costs associated with administering the entitlement system compared to regulating operating gaming machines. Further, it accounts for the proportion of entitlements that were not in use in 2012–13 for factors out of the control of some venue operators (e.g. building a new venue).
