

Planning and Environment Act 1987 HUME PLANNING SCHEME

Notice of Preparation of an Amendment to a Planning Scheme

Amendment C198

The Metropolitan Planning Authority (the planning authority) has prepared Amendment C198 to the Hume Planning Scheme.

In accordance with section 9(1) of the **Planning and Environment Act 1987**, the Minister for Planning has authorised the Metropolitan Planning Authority as planning authority to prepare the Amendment.

The land affected by the Amendment, known as the Craigieburn North Employment Area, is generally bound by Donnybrook Road to the north, Merri Creek and Sydney–Melbourne rail line to the east, Hume Freeway to the west, and the proposed Amaroo Business Park to the south.

Specifically the Amendment proposes to:

- incorporate two new documents into the planning scheme by listing them in the Schedule to Clause 81.01:
 - Craigieburn North Employment Area Precinct Structure Plan, April 2015;
 - Craigieburn North Employment Area Development Contributions Plan, April 2015.
- insert Schedule 8 to the Urban Growth Zone (UGZ8) to the Hume Planning Scheme and apply UGZ8 to land in the amendment area. This zone sets out the land use and development controls for the precinct. The zone requires land use and development to be generally in accordance with the incorporated Craigieburn North Precinct Structure Plan;
- insert Schedule 8 to the Special Use Zone (SUZ8) to the Hume Planning Scheme and apply SUZ8 to the transmission line within the Amendment area;
- rezone land identified as Growling Grass Frog along the Merri Creek from Farming Zone (FZ) to Rural Conservation Zone (RCZ);
- insert Schedule 2 to the Incorporated Plan Overlay (IPO2) to the Hume Planning Scheme and apply IPO2 to land within the Rural Conservation Zone in the Amendment area;

- insert the Development Contributions Plan Overlay Schedule 8 (DCPO8) into the Hume Planning Scheme and apply DCPO8 to the Amendment area for the purpose of levying contributions for the provision of works, services and facilities in relation to development within the Development Contributions Plan area;
- amend the Public Acquisition Overlay (PAO1) to extend to land south of Donnybrook Road to allow for the widening of Donnybrook Road and to land to the east and west of the Hume Freeway to allow for a future freeway interchange;
- remove the Design and Development Overlay Schedule 1 (DDO1) from land within the Amendment area;
- amend the Land Subject to Inundation (LSIO) within the Amendment area to reflect current flood mapping provided by Melbourne Water;
- delete the Rural Floodway Overlay (RFO) from the land within the Amendment area. This overlay is no longer required as the Land Subject to Inundation Overlay (LSIO) identifies land subject to 1 in 100 year flooding along the Merri Creek;
- delete the Environmental Significance Overlay Schedule 2 and Schedule 10 (ESO2 and ESO10) from the land within the Amendment area. This overlay is no longer required as the proposed Rural Conservation Zone and Incorporated Plan Overlay Schedule 2 and the incorporated Craigieburn North Precinct Structure Plan designate and protect areas of environmental significance in the Merri Creek;
- amend the schedule to Clause 52.01 to require public open space contributions in the Craigieburn North PSP area when land is subdivided;
- amend the schedule to Clause 52.17 to identify native vegetation that can be removed without the need for a planning permit;
- amend the schedule to Clause 61.03 to update maps included in the Hume Planning Scheme; and
- amend the schedule to Clause 94 and Clause 95 to include VicSmart provisions for buildings and works, car parking and signage in industrial areas.

The Surf Coast Shire Council has prepared Amendment C81 to the Surf Coast Planning Scheme.

The land affected by the Amendment is all land within the Surf Coast Shire (outside settlement boundaries/urban areas) that contains significant vegetation and habitat.

Published clauses 2 and 3 are hereby revoked and replaced by the following:

2. Prohibitions, restrictions and requirements

I specify the following prohibitions, restrictions and requirements that are to operate in the restricted area:

- 2.1 The removal of giant pine scale host material from the restricted area is prohibited.
- 2.2 The pruning or destruction of any giant pine scale host plant in the restricted area is prohibited.
- 2.3 Subclauses 2.1 and 2.2 do not apply if the person removing, pruning or destroying giant pine scale host material is authorised to do so under a permit issued by an inspector under the Act and complies with any conditions set out in the permit.

3. This Order affects:
