


Road Discontinuance

The part of the Roads shown as E–2, E–3 and E–4 on the plan below are to be transferred subject to any right, power or interest held by South East Water Corporation in that part of the Roads in connection with any pipes under the control of South East Water Corporation in or near that part of the road.

Amendment to Local Law No. 2 of 2011 – Municipal Amenity, Local Law No. 3 of 2011 – Road Management and Asset Protection and Local Law No. 4 of 2011 – Municipal Places

At the Greater Dandenong City Council Ordinary Meeting held on 26 November 2018, Council, under section 119 of the Local Government Act 1989, resolved to make Local Law No. 1 – Miscellaneous Amendments of 2019. This Local Law amends Local Law No. 2 of 2011 – Municipal Amenity, Local Law No. 3 of 2011 – Road Management and Asset Protection and Local Law No. 4 of 2011 – Municipal Places. The Local Law comes into operation on 1 January 2019.

The purpose of the amendments to Local Law No. 2 is to:

- 1.1 further regulate building sites and the construction of permanent vehicle crossings; prevent building work from damaging council infrastructure;
- 1.2 making miscellaneous changes; and
- 1.3 making the Local Law more effective and enforceable.

The purpose of the amendments to Local Law No. 3 is to:

- 1.4 further regulate the management of shopping trolleys in and around shopping centres;
- 1.5 make miscellaneous changes; and
- 1.6 make the Local Law more effective and enforceable.

The purpose of the amendments to Local Law No. 4 is to:

- 1.7 prohibit, regulate and control access to and behaviour in Municipal Places;
- 1.8 regulate and control the use of Municipal Swimming Pools, Municipal Buildings, reserves and other areas;
- 1.9 make miscellaneous changes; and
- 1.10 make the Local Law more effective and enforceable.

EXEMPTION

Application No. H344/2018

The Victorian Civil and Administrative Tribunal has considered an application pursuant to section 89 of the **Equal Opportunity Act 2010** (the Act) by Kaellorien Management Pty Ltd (the applicant). The application for exemption is to enable the applicant to employ males only and to provide and operate an all male venue at Club80 in Peel Street, Collingwood, and to advertise in connection with those purposes (the exempt conduct). Upon reading the material filed in support of this application, including the affidavit of Leonard Lo, the Tribunal is satisfied that it is appropriate to grant an exemption from sections 16, 44, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

In granting this exemption, the Tribunal noted:

- The venue provides male homosexual and bisexual patrons with a safe environment where male sexual health issues are emphasised and where patrons can relax, socialise and pursue relationships without inhibition or fear of violence or discrimination.
- The applicant prefers to employ only males, whether or not they are homosexual, as its clientele is more comfortable with and expect only males to provide services.
- Letters in support of the applicant have been provided by Thorne Harbour Health, a community controlled public health organisation formerly known as Victorian AIDS Council and from the Melbourne Sexual Health Centre. The venue has worked with Thorne Harbour Health to allow volunteers to undertake outreach work and to provide health related information. Thorne Harbour Health uses the venue as a recruitment point for its Gay Community Periodic Survey conducted on behalf of the University of NSW and the Victorian Department of Health and Human Services. Thorne Harbour also uses the venue to provide a range of supports. The Melbourne Sexual Health Centre has been involved positively with the venue since the 1980s providing health promotion strategies and a nurse who carries out sexual health testing.
- Previous exemptions have been granted in respect of the same conduct and the venue since 1998 and the circumstances relevant to those exemptions are still applicable. A previous exemption in respect of the exempt conduct expired on 1 November 2018. No exception already applies to the exempt conduct. In the absence of a further exemption, the exempt conduct would amount to prohibited discrimination.

• When making decisions about exemptions, the Tribunal is required to give proper consideration to relevant human rights as set out in the **Charter of Human Rights and Responsibilities Act 2006** (Charter). Arguably, this exemption limits the right to equality and in particular the right to equal and effective protection against discrimination of women who wish to attend the venue or be employed by the applicant. I am satisfied that, in the circumstances discussed above, the limit imposed by this exemption is reasonable and justified under the Charter.

The Tribunal hereby grants an exemption from the operation of sections 16, 44, 107 and 182 of the Act to enable the applicant to engage in the exempt conduct.

This exemption is to remain in force until 2 December 2023.

ORDER PROHIBITING OR RESTRICTING THE ENTRY OR IMPORTATION OF MATERIALS WHICH ARE HOSTS OF SPIRALLING WHITEFLY

I, Rosa Crnov, as delegate of the Minister for Agriculture, being of the reasonable suspicion that the exotic pest spiralling whitefly exists within Australia but outside Victoria, make the following Order.

1 Objective

The objective of this Order is to prohibit, restrict or impose conditions upon the entry or importation into Victoria of materials which are hosts of spiralling whitefly.

2 Authorising provision

This Order is made under section 36(1) of the Plant Biosecurity Act 2010 (the Act).

3 Commencement

This Order comes into force on the day of making.

4 Revocation

The Order made under section 36(1) of the **Plant Biosecurity Act 2010**, prohibiting or restricting the entry or importation of spiralling whitefly host materials into Victoria, and published in Victoria Government Gazette G48 on 30 November 2017 is **revoked**.

5 Definitions

In this Order –

'spiralling whitefly' means the exotic pest Aleurodicus dispersus (Russell);

'host material' means any plant or plant product intended for propagation in a glasshouse, hothouse or indoor area.

6 **Prohibitions, restrictions and conditions**

The following prohibitions, restrictions and conditions are specified in relation to the entry or importation of host material.

- (a) The entry or importation into Victoria of any host material is prohibited.
- (b) Subclause (a) does not apply if the host material
 - (i) originates from an area for which there is currently in force an area freedom certificate, being a certificate issued by an officer responsible for agriculture in the State or Territory from which the host material originated, certifying that the area from which the host material originated is known to be free of spiralling whitefly; or
 - (ii) is accompanied by a plant health certificate, assurance certificate or plant health declaration, certifying or declaring that the host material has been treated in a manner described in the Schedule to this Order; or
 - (iii) enters Victoria under and in accordance with a permit issued by an inspector and there is compliance with any conditions or requirements set out in the permit.

7 Verification of consignments

Where requested by an authorised inspector, host material imported into Victoria, which is required by clause 6(b)(ii) to be accompanied by a certificate or declaration, must be presented to an authorised inspector for inspection.

8 Expiry

This Order remains in force for a period of 12 months after the date of making.

Schedule

Host material must be -

- (1) grown on a property located more than 10 km from a detection of spiralling whitefly; or
- (2) grown on property known to be free from spiralling whitefly; or
- (3) inspected and found free of spiralling whitefly; or
- (4) treated by
 - (a) cover spraying, to the point of run off, with a mixture of a commercial wetting agent at the rate specified on the registered label of the product, and
 - (i) 0.75 ml of a concentrate containing 400 g/l dimethoate per litre of water; or
 - (ii) 0.5 ml of a concentrate containing 80 g/l bifenthrin per litre of water; or
 - (iii) 0.4 ml of a concentrate containing 100 g/l bifenthrin per litre of water; or
 - (b) full immersion in a mixture containing 0.75 ml of concentrate containing 400 g/l dimethoate per litre of water for a minimum of 10 seconds; and

(5) packed so as to prevent infestation by spiralling whitefly.

Notes:

Section 38(1) of the Act provides that it is an offence for a person to knowingly cause, permit or assist any plant, plant product, plant vector, used equipment, used package, earth material or behive to enter or be imported into Victoria in contravention of an importation order under section 36. The maximum penalty of 60 penalty units applies in the case of a natural person, and 300 penalty units in the case of a body corporate.

Terms in this Order that are defined in the Act have that meaning.
