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



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


ORDER MADE PURSUANT TO THE **DOMESTIC ANIMALS ACT 1994 SECTION 26(2)**

- provide procedures that will govern order of business, and rules of debate, meeting procedure and conduct of Council meetings and Special Committee meetings;
- provide rules of conduct for those participating in or present at Council meetings and Special Committee meetings;
- revoke the Local Law No. 18 Meeting Procedure Local Law adopted by Council on 22 August 2012.

The Whittlesea Council has prepared Amendment C230wsea to the Whittlesea Planning Scheme.

The Amendment changes the scheme to implement the recommendations of the *Portland Heritage Gaps Study (2016)* by applying the Heritage Overlay (Clause 43.01) to 44 individual places, one group of places (Richmond Street Group Precinct) and six new precincts. The boundaries of the Portland Heritage Precinct (HO165) are amended by extending it to cover an additional 45 properties, removing areas affected by proposed individual heritage place and precinct overlays within this precinct and removing one area south of the Henty Highway. Clause 22.02 (Heritage) is introduced and the *Portland Heritage Gaps Study (2016)* is included as a reference document. The Schedule to Clause 43.01 is amended to introduce new heritage places and changes made in accordance with the *Portland Heritage Gaps Study (2016)*. Clause 72.03 is amended to add Map 36HO.
