



Control of Weapons Act 1990

DECLARATION OF DESIGNATED AREA UNDER SECTION 10D(1)

The Assistant Commissioner, Southern Metro Region, acting as delegate of the Chief Commissioner of Police, under section 10D(1) of the Control of Weapons Act 1990, declares as a designated area the area in Rye bounded by Point Nepean Road – from the boat ramp car park (between Dundas Street and Elgan Avenue) to Lyons Street inclusive of Rye foreshore and parkland within those boundaries – encompassing boat trailer parking, boat ramp, playground reserve area and whole span of Rye pier; Nelson Street from the intersection of Dundas Street to Lyons Street; Napier Street from Nelson Street to Point Nepean Road; Campbell Lane from Napier Street to Lyons Street. Areas are inclusive of all footpaths on specified roads. Road has the same meaning as in section 3 of the Road Safety Act 1986.



This declaration will operate on the following dates: 22 November 2019, 23 November 2019, 24 November 2019, 25 November 2019, 26 November 2019, 27 November 2019, 28 November 2019, 29 November 2019, 30 November 2019, 1 December 2019, 2 December 2019, 3 December 2019, 4 December 2019, 5 December 2019, 6 December 2019, 7 December 2019 between 1800 hours and 0300 hours on each of the above listed dates, during which time members of the police force are authorised to exercise the following powers:

- (a) in a public place in the designated area, without warrant, stop and search for weapons:
 - i. any person;
 - ii. any thing in the possession or control of the person;
 - iii. any vehicle with a person in or on the vehicle; and
 - iv. any thing in or on such vehicle;
- (b) detain a person or vehicle for so long as is reasonably necessary to conduct a search;
- (c) seize and detain any item the member reasonably suspects is a weapon; and
- (d) request a person who is the subject of a full search to disclose his or her identity; and
- (e) direct a person to leave the designated area if the police officer reasonably believes the person is wearing the face covering primarily to:
 - i. conceal their identity; or
 - ii. to protect them from the effects of a crowd control substance; and
 - iii. the person refuses to remove the face covering when requested to do so;
- (f) direct the person to leave the designated area if the police officer reasonably believes the person intends to engage in conduct that would constitute an affray (section 195H Crimes Act 1958) or violent behaviour (section 195I Crimes Act 1958).
