





WHITEHORSE ROAD



The current Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Regulations 2008 (2008 Regulations) include both prescribed fees and prescribed information. The 2008 Regulations will sunset on 23 September 2019. In remaking the 2008 Regulations, the 2008 Regulations have been separated into: the proposed Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration (Fees) Regulations 2019 (to which the RIS is applicable); and the proposed Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Regulations 2019.

The proposed regulations will be made under section 59 of the **Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Act 1996**. The proposals are: to make no change to the current fees, with a commitment to review the fees within two years to reflect changes in costs resulting from the Registry of Births, Deaths and Marriages Victoria's (BDM) new online core business system; and, to prescribe the information required to be included in a death registration statement, a medical certificate of cause of death, and a birth registration statement.

Objectives

The objective of the proposed Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration (Fees) Regulations 2019 is to set out fees to be paid by BDM's customers for specified services provided by BDM. The objective of the Births, Deaths and Marriages Registration Regulations 2019 is to set out the information required to be included in a death registration statement (usually provided by a funeral director), a medical certificate of cause of death (provided by a medical practitioner), and a birth registration statement (usually provided by parents when registering the birth of their child).

The RIS explains the results of modelling undertaken by BDM to identify the costs of relevant services, and considers models for future cost recovery. The preferred option is to continue to set fees consistent with full cost recovery.

Submissions

Submissions on the RIS and proposed regulations are invited, and must be received by 5 pm on 5 July 2019. The submissions will be considered before the proposed regulations are made.

Submissions are also subject to the **Freedom of Information Act 1982**, and copies will be provided to the Scrutiny of Acts and Regulations Committee.
